Why Do We Need An Income?

(A livable wage is a wage that is high enough to cover the necessities of life, such as housing, food, healthcare, and transportation. It is a wage that allows individuals and families to meet their basic needs without having to rely on government assistance or charitable organizations. The exact amount of a livable wage varies depending on factors such as the cost of living in a particular area and the size of the household-A livable wage does not consider debt or poor money management).

What Is Affecting Our Earning Potential

There are various reasons why some individuals may have limited earning potential or may not earn enough.

One significant factor is the economic policies and structures, which cause low income by creating a lack of job opportunities, inadequate wages, and insufficient investment in communities.

Other factors that can contribute to low income include job market conditions, location, discrimination, and health or disability issues.

In addition, systemic issues such as income inequality and poverty can affect entire communities and result in low incomes for many individuals.





There are many reasons why individuals may not be earning as much as they could.

Some examples of in-demand soft skills include:


- Communication skills: The ability to communicate effectively with others is essential in any job. Good communication skills can help you build relationships with colleagues, clients, and customers.

Non-traditional education can come in various forms, such as online courses, job career training, boot camps, workshops, or apprenticeships. Many of these programs offer certification or credentialing upon completion. Apprenticeships: Careers that commonly hire from apprenticeships are Electrician, Plumber, Carpenter, Welder, HVAC technician, Machinist, Chef, Beauty & Barbers services.

It offers a flexible and convenient way of learning that allows students to study from anywhere at any time. Online learning provides a range of benefits such as cost savings, a variety of courses, and the ability to balance other commitments such as work or family responsibilities.

Pros of Online Learning:

Cons of Online Learning:

<u>Boot camps:</u> Career training boot camps have become increasingly popular in recent years as a way for individuals to quickly gain new skills and jumpstart their careers. While there are many benefits to attending a boot camp, there are also some drawbacks to consider.

Boot Camp Pros:

- 1. Efficiency: Career training bootcamps are designed to teach you the skills you need for a specific career in a short amount of time, so you can get working quickly.
- 2. Hands-on Experience: Bootcamps often focus on practical skills, so you can gain real, hands-on experience that prepares you for the workplace.
- 3. Networking Opportunities: You'll be surrounded by peers who are interested in the same field as you, giving you a chance to make connections and network.
- 4. Career Services: Many bootcamps offer career services like job placement assistance, resume help, and interview preparation.

Boot Camp Cons:

- 1. Cost: Bootcamps can be expensive, and they often don't qualify for traditional financial aid like grants and loans.
- 2. Intensity: Bootcamps can be very intense and require a lot of work in a short period of time, which can be stressful.
- 3. Limited Focus: Bootcamps are designed to teach you specific skills, which can be great if you're looking for a career change, but they may not offer the broadbased education that a four-year college can provide.
- 4. Quality: Not all bootcamps are created equal, so it's important to do your research to make sure you're investing in a program that will actually give you a positive return on your investment.

<u>Workshops:</u> A workshop is a short-term educational program designed to teach a specific set of skills or knowledge in a particular field. Workshops can be conducted in person or online and may be led by an expert instructor or facilitator.

They are often used as a direct path to gain new skills quickly and efficiently.

Workshop Pros:

- 1. Hands-on experience: Workshops provide practical and hands-on experience in a specific field. This experience can help you gain confidence and hone your skills.
- 2. Direct Delivery: The objective of a workshop is to provide participants with specific skills that they can immediately apply in their work or personal life. The transfer of knowledge and skills is direct, practical and actionable. This approach is often favored by professionals who need to acquire new skills or knowledge quickly and efficiently and the ability to apply what they have learned immediately.
- 3. Flexibility: Workshops are often offered outside of traditional working hours, making them accessible to people who may not be able to attend classes during the day.

Workshop Cons:

- 1. Cost: Workshops can be expensive, and not everyone can afford to pay for them. This can limit access to valuable training and networking opportunities.
- 2. Time commitment: Workshops may require sacrificing personal time. This can be challenging for people with busy schedules or other responsibilities.
- 3. Quality: The quality of workshops can vary widely, and some may not provide the level of training or networking opportunities they promise. It's important to research the reputation of the organization or instructor offering the workshop before signing up.

Apprenticeship: is a form of on-the-job training where an individual, known as an apprentice, learns a trade or skill under the guidance of a skilled worker. It is a structured program that combines hands-on learning with classroom instruction to help individuals acquire the necessary knowledge, skills, and experience to become qualified in a particular trade. They involve a set number of hours of work per week, paid on-the-job training, and classroom instruction.

Pros of Apprenticeship Training:

- 1. Hands-on learning: Apprenticeship training provides practical, hands-on experience in a real-world setting.
- 2. Earn while you learn: Apprenticeships provide an opportunity to earn a wage while training.
- 3. Job security: Apprenticeships are often tied to specific industries, which can provide a level of job security. Employers may prefer to hire apprentices who have already received training and have proven their abilities.
- 4. Industry connections: Apprenticeship training provides an opportunity to build connections within a particular industry.
- 5. Career advancement: Apprentices who complete their training may be eligible for promotions or higher-paying positions

Cons of Apprenticeship Training:

- 1. Limited industries: Apprenticeship training is often tied to specific industries, so those who complete training in one industry may not be able to easily transition to another.
- 2. Length of training: Apprenticeship training can take years to complete, which can be a deterrent for some individuals.
- 4. Limited geographic options: Apprenticeship training may only be available in certain geographic locations, which can limit opportunities for those who do not live in those areas.
- 5. Fewer academic credentials: Apprenticeship training provides practical skills and knowledge. This can be a disadvantage when seeking employment outside of a specific industry.

Embrace it, not only because you may always be an employee, but also because the skills you are developing now will accompany you wherever you go.




Session Re-cap The Sky Is The Limit

Increasing your earning potential requires stepping out of your comfort zone to pursue higher-paying, in-demand jobs.


Research, planning, and networking can lead to new opportunities and provide valuable career growth and development insights.
