



Americanism Valley Award: Orient of NC

How To Submit

- Provide a score sheet and written report on how the emphases of our Americanism initiatives have made an impact on your valley.



80/20 Rule

Simply put 80% of the work is completed by 20% of the craft.




60/30/10 rule

30%-These are the brothers that can be influenced into the 20% of active membership or lost to the duckpond. As it stand this group is the most important for engagement and must be our priority




5/1 Average

Currently we are averaging 1 active member after 5 years.
