# WalkerHouse Bridal Exhibit



A crab basket lid, hanging on a back door, is adorned with a tulle bow. This offers the first hint that a fishermen's museum and a vintage wedding display are a perfect match.

"With This Ring," a heartfelt collection of vintage wedding gowns, accessories, portraits and other memorabilia, has been loaned or donated to the Reedville Fishermen's Museum for this special display in the traditional wedding month.



Families with connections to Reedville, some going back generations, combed through a treasure trove of heirlooms for the display, which is on view through June 29 during museum open hours.

At last count there are 18 dresses on display, including bridal gowns and bridal party attire. The display is in the Walker House, the original home of the museum. Since 1990 the house has been decorated as a typical family home of the early 20th century. The gowns and accessories look right at home in the inviting space.

The oldest wedding dress, dating to 1902, holds pride of place in the dining room. The beautifully embroidered dress was worn by Margaret Haynie on her marriage to William Armsworthy.

Nearby is a coral junior bridesmaid's dress, worn by Olivia Cockrell, then 9 years old, in her sister's wedding in 1970. The dress was made by the late Marguerite Walker, the last member of the Walker family to live in the house. She altered and created many outfits for the women of her day.

Mid-20th century wedding cake toppers are displayed on an antique sideboard.

The dining table holds a Miller & Rhoads wedding gift registry book belonging to Maria Elizabeth Biddlecomb, who married Frederick Ray Rogers Jr. in 1953. The couple received dozens of gifts, such as glass pie plates, a milk glass vase, an organdy apron and a white candlewick bedspread.

That wedding almost can be brought to life in the parlor, where her sumptuous gown and bridal party outfits are on display. Her two sisters also wore the gown in their weddings: Johanna May Biddlecomb to Donald B. Shahan in 1956, and Winifred Elaine Biddlecomb to Wilber Beale Delano in 1962.

The flower girl dress worn by Maria and Ray's daughter, Lou (Louise Rogers Shelton) in her Aunt Winifred's wedding is nearby, and the little flower basket she carried.

In the second-floor sewing room, where Marguerite Walker would have fitted and sewn clothing for the area's ladies, is a dress worn by Gertrude Blackowicz for her marriage to Edward Durkin in Baltimore in 1941. Many Reedville families have had strong ties to Baltimore because the Chesapeake Bay steamboats were once the village's lifeline to the bigger world. Other items throughout the house include formal bridal portraits, bridesmaid's dresses, wedding china, hand-lettered wedding invitations, hand-embroidered wedding handkerchief, bride dolls, silk wedding bouquet, ring bearer pillow, wedding cards, shoes and gloves.

Museum board members LeeAnn Scanlon and Gayle Sterrett gathered, researched and expanded the display, building on an exhibit held many years ago.







Get to know the people you may see around the museum! Here's a summary of a conversation with David Clark, boat shop volunteer, director of the Family Boat Building event and co-founder of the Northern Neck Wooden Boat School.

1. What brought you to the Northern Neck?

It was an accident! My wife Eileen and I were spending three months in the area intending to move to Ireland. We toured around and discovered all the wonderful things in the area. We drove down Reedville's Main Street and closed on our house in February 2023.

2. What do you do at the museum?

I'm a retired master woodworker. I went straight to the boat shop to volunteer. They said I had to be a member first, so I walked to the office to join. When the volunteer who headed up the Family Boat Build retired, "How could I say no?"

- 3. What do you enjoy doing when you're not at the museum? I love gardening and I have a woodworking shop at the house. I also enjoy cooking, especially fish.
- 4. When you were a child, what did you want to be when you grew up? An architect. After college as an art major, I wanted to create but not starve. I got a job at a woodworking shop, then later owned a business making wooden toys. I've always loved everything I've done.
- 5. What is on your bucket list? Ireland! And I want to build a 19-foot Bartender. And a Aroha 30-footer, but I'll need a bigger shop for that one.
- 6. What is a phrase you live by? "We come into this world without asking. We go out the same way." My father's father said this his whole life, and he meant, "Don't sweat the small stuff."

Get to know the people you may see around the museum! Here's a summary of a conversation with member Katie Wilkins, co-founder of the Northern Neck Wooden Boat School.

1. What brought you to the Northern Neck?

"Love brought me here full-time -- and family." I am from the Richmond area. My grandparents and later my parents had places here, so I spent weekends and summers here for many years. About 10 years ago I met my now-husband, Shannon, who is a "from here." I became gifted and talented coordinator in Middlesex County schools and formed a bond with Shauna, who at that time held the same position with Northumberland County. Now Shauna is here and I'm in Shauna's previous position in Northumberland.

2. What do you do at the museum?

I bring students here for field trips. I teach boat building skills in the classroom and on site, and I worked with David to establish the Northern Neck, Wooden Boat School. I taught at the boat school's first boat build summer camp, which was held here at the museum last June.


- 3. What do you enjoy doing when you're not at the museum?
- "I love to be on the water." We boat and fish a lot. We built a house so I like gardening and decorating.
- 4. When you were a child, what did you want to be when you grew up? "I've always really wanted to help people," aiming for the medical field until unfortunate reactions to shots and the sight of blood. I have a business degree (marketing and hospitality) and worked in event planning for a few years. I went back to college for a teaching license and gifted endorsement. My mother a lifelong educator -- always told me I'd be a teacher!
- 5. What is on your bucket list?

We have a lot of island destinations in mind for travel and possibly retirement. We would like to do the "Great Loop" and see the country by boat.

- 6. What is a phrase you live by?
- "Always be kind."
