## WHAT IS BEHIND THE NAME: STARRY BANNER



According to an article written by George T. Edwards Jr., "*Starry Banner* is an important part of the history of the Reedville area being the first steam powered vessel to be used in the menhaden industry on the bay. She was small at 39.5 gross measurement tons and about 65 feet long. Her steam engine was small at 30 horsepower and she kept the same engine her whole, short life. She had a capacity for 125,000 fish, less than a tenth of what modern boats carry. She was

special, however, when she came to the Chesapeake Bay since, up to then, all the fishing was done from sailing vessels. Elijah Reed purchased her at the end of 1879 and she was in service from 1880 until she was sold in 1889. Her next owners used her as a 'wrecker', a vessel used to raise other vessels whole or, if the vessel could not be raised, to salvage the cargo and equipment. But fate turned the tables and, in November of 1891, Starry Banner ran onto a shoal off of St. Augustine, Florida and was a total loss. There was no insurance. The crew of seven was saved by the life-saving station after several hours clinging to wreckage."

GOING THE EXTRA MILE Interview with Spencer Headley. by Carol A Muratore

Spencer grew up in Fairport, VA spending his youth getting to know these waters like the back of his hand. He was the son of a waterman and grandson of a boat carpenter. He literally grew up on the waters of the Chesapeake Bay, the largest estuary in North America. He said his dad taught him everything he knows working alongside him for close to 30 years. Spencer has firsthand knowledge of the waters, the habitat and has witnessed the many changes over the years. Spencer bought his own waterman's card and obtained his own licenses as a young man. Today, Spencer is an independent commercial waterman. But that's not all. Due to his immeasurable knowledge of these waters and experience, Spencer was appointed as a Board Member to the very important and well-regarded Virginia Marine Resources Commission (VMRC). These appointments are carefully vetted, and the candidates are selected by the Governor of Virginia. The services VMRC is responsible for include Recreational Fishing, Commercial Fishing, Fisheries Management, Shellfish Management, Habitat Management, Marine Police and other Administrative Services. He serves with an impressive group of individuals with vast backgrounds ranging from lawyers, executives in healthcare, experts on the environment as well as people with expertise in the vertical integration of the industries for-mentioned. Spencer travels monthly for meetings in the Hampton Region office. Spencer is also a Board Member on the Potomac River Fisheries Commission which does similar work but covers the waters controlled by Virginia, Maryland related to the Potomac River. These Board Members are also appointed by the state's Governor. Again, he travels hours to attend these meetings. Most recently, Spencer was appointed to the Northumberland County Wetlands Committee. All of these responsibilities cut into his time working on the water. None of these positions come with a salary, only some basic expense reimbursement. It is a sacrifice to do this work. So why does he do it? He's been the victim of poor legislation himself. Today he works on a committee assigned to clean up or eliminate senseless or harmful laws. Spencer has witnessed how misinformation has harmed his colleagues or folks in other areas of the industry. He has a good sense of what is necessary and what is bureaucratic red tape.

Spencer has many examples of how science might be saying one thing, but he sees something totally different. He has also seen how good science is improperly used to make negative changes or legislation to the industry. Often there is no connectivity to the root cause, real problem or reason for an issue. In essence, the science doesn't even support the push for laws in such cases. Spencer is passionate about focusing on the right issues. He is articulate and is a strong voice for the industry as well as our community. Spencer cares about the environment and knows its sustainability is important

to the future of the industry. He states, "sometimes there is no better science than that of a person who works out there every day seeing it firsthand." His message to his fellow watermen: "keep your head down and don't give up". Spencer truly is going the extra mile to give those who work hard a voice.
