

### A Special Fundraiser for the Family of Peyton Mason

The Reedville Fishermen's Museum is partnering with a local photogrpaher **Mike Fontaine** to support the family of **Peyton Mason of Gloucester**, a young watermen who died unexpectedly on **June 25**<sup>th</sup> at age 30. Peyton left behind his wife, **Taylor**, and their two daughters.

Taylor, who grew up on **Gywnn's Island in Mathews**, is now working hard to keep both their family and their business, the **Virginia Oyster Co.,** afloat-even after one of their two workboats recently sank and is under repair.



### **About the Photographer**

Mike Fontain's journey into photography began only this year, **February 27**, when he and his wife spotted a fleet of oyster boats from the Norris Bridge. Inspired, he set out in his own boat, "Kodachrome", to photograph watermen at work.

Though at first unaware of boating protocols, his photos quickly caught attention. After sharing them online, Fontaine was invited by Chris Daniel to photograph his father's boat, "Easy Rider". That opportunity led to "Pot of Gold" and his growing reputation in the watermen's world-a privilege "not easily bestowed."

Now known by many as "Kodachrome", Fontaine has built a passionate following of more than **1,700 Facebook friends** worldwide, all connected by a love of fishing and working on the water.

# The Artwork: Pot of Gold

Fontaine has donated his professionally matted and framed photograph, "Pot of Gold", measuring 29" x 38". He captured the image on March 3<sup>rd</sup> aboard the workboat "Easy Rider" with Capt. Ashley Daniel while dredging for oysters near the Norris Bridge.



### The Sinking of the Fenwick Island

Movie Showing January 5<sup>th</sup> @ 6:30 p.m.

The Fenwick Island was a fishing trawler that sank in the Atlantic Ocean off Cape Lookout, North Carolina, on December 7, 1968, after capsizing in heavy seas. The vessel was returning to port with a cargo of menhaden when it encountered unexpected bad weather and took on water in its main fish hold, leading to the deaths of seven of the fourteen crew members.









