Good Morning and Welcome!

It's great to see so many beloved and familiar faces on our church's 103rd anniversary. The Lord has been so good to our church family and days like this remind us of how special and important this body of Christ has become to this community.

It was in obedience to God, much prayer, collaboration, research, and reflective meditation that I announced the God-given VISION to build a new edifice to the Glory of God!

The journey hasn't been easy but in the midst of and in spite of it all, God's vision was in place and we continued to be obedient to God; and now we are here and we are still going strong.

Church growth isn't easy but all of you have proven that it's not impossible when every member of the congregation steps up and fully commits to winning the hearts and minds of those willing to listen to our message. Each year we continue to be blessed with new members. And make no mistake, each and every one of you is a valued member of this church body.

You have proven your commitment and loyalty to the work of the Lord and for that we've all been richly blessed. As we worship together this morning, let us keep our eyes focused on His glory and all the blessings He's seen fit to bestow upon us.

We've overcome so much to reach another church anniversary. I'm thankful to see each one of you today and to have the chance to come together in a spirit of praise to the Holy One. There's no denying that this church community is a gift from the Lord Himself.

In fact, this church is nothing short of a miracle. And yet we all know that the Lord God Almighty is in the miracle business.

To pay off the loan, many congregants committed to tithe, the Biblical mandate promising a percentage of the believer's income to the church.

In 2018, the church paid off mortgage B in the amount of \$100,000.00 leaving the remaining loan of \$2,190.646.00 for 5 years. The church was paying \$180,000.00 a year on the loan. In December 2019, about \$1,782.493.71 of the mortgage remained.

We felt if 150 households were to pledge sacrificial commitments over two years on top of their tithe, we could finish paying off the mortgage. We had been paying extra principal money and had a mortgage burning plan in place," Our sacrificial pledges became a reality to the Glory of God. We know and believe our biblical teachings, "not equal giving, but equal sacrifices" is the way.

Members, local pastors and friends of Metropolitan Community Church heard the clarion call and offered financial gifts in support of our monthly need and the VISION.

In the midst of Covid 19 we pledged to follow our Christian mission and continued to feed the hungry, provide clothing and bedding to a local women's shelter, offered financial support to our active college students, coordinated activities for our youth, extended additional outreach ministry to our community through our weekly food pantry, support and equipment to nearby homeless population, christened babies, officiated weddings, and provided service to woman's shelters. We strengthened our commitment to our local school partnership and our Ghana missions.

Members participated in spiritual development via conferences and workshops, weekly Ministry of Biblical Studies, weekly inspirational text messages, 'Thankful Thursdays' Prayer Calls, and Zoom Fellowship Calls.

Members and persons from the community were nurtured from our Just A Sister Away and Brotherhood ministries. We structured and offered mentorship to local ministers and seminarians in their quest to serve in God's Kingdom building mission.

While this is not all that we did, it is important to reflect, and even doubt, but most of us individually and collectively knew that God never fails. We knew we would succeed if we walked by faith and NOT by sight.

Paying off our mortage is critical to further our mission of ministering to the spiritual, emotional, and intellectual needs of all people, by spreading Christ's liberating gospel through word and deed.

We stand committed to preach the word of God and live the work of God through our ongoing efforts of continuing and expanding the array of community services we provide to our congregation, the Chicagoland community, and our African missions.

May the Lord bless us today as we lift our hearts to Heaven and humbly ask Him to fill this building with His goodness and mercy.




Guest Speaker

Dr. Frank A. Thomas

Frank A. Thomas, PhD, currently serves as the Nettie Sweeney and Hugh Th. Miller Professor of Homiletics and Director of the Academy of Preaching and Celebration at Christian Theological Seminary, Indianapolis, Indiana. Indicative of his great love of preaching, an updated and revised version of They Like to Never Quit Praisin' God: The Role of Celebration In Preaching, considered by many to be a homiletic classic, was released in August 2013. For many years, Dr. Thomas has also taught preaching to Doctoral and Masters level students at McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago, Illinois, and at Memphis Theological Seminary in Memphis, Tennessee. He is the CEO of Hope For Life International, Inc., which formerly published The African American Pulpit. With a long history of excellence in preaching and preaching method, Dr. Thomas was inducted into the prestigious Martin Luther King Jr. Board of Preachers of Morehouse College in April 2003. He also serves as a member of the International Board of Societas Homiletica, an international society of teachers of preaching.

Dr. Thomas holds a PhD in Communications (Rhetoric) from the University of Memphis, a Doctor of Divinity from Christian Theological Seminary, Doctor of Ministry degrees from Chicago Theological Seminary and United Theological Seminary, a Master of Divinity from Chicago Theological Seminary, and a Master of Arts in African-Caribbean Studies from Northeastern Illinois University.

Minister Rodnie Bryant

Rodnie Bryant was raised in a "very religious" and musical home. In his youth, he learned music theory alongside his older sister at the Wurlitzer Music Company and later took private lessons. His musical repertoire draws from the classical and jazz music he studied and the gospel music he sang every Sunday.

In 1995, the Indiana State Fair asked him to coordinate "Gospel Music Day," which features both local and national gospel music talents. Since the first program, which had 400 attendees, Gospel Music Day has grown to host an audience of nearly 4000 every year. Rodnie takes pride in producing an event that is "wholesome, good and able to service an entire family."

Mentored by "musical giants" in Indianapolis, such as Robert Turner, Al "The Bishop" Hobbs, and Delores "Sugar" Poindexter, Rodnie soon gained national recognition as a gospel musician and recording artist. His accomplishments include a Grammy Award nomination in 1998, and winning Gospel Music Workshop of America Excellence Awards for both "Choir of the Year" and "Song of the Year." His music has become a staple among church choirs in many congregations, both locally and beyond.
