"When God Breaks the Silence"

Scripture Focus

• 1 Samuel 1:1-20

Scripture Context and Insight

 Hannah, barren and brokenhearted, goes year after year to the temple, praying for a child. Her cry is so intense that Eli mistakes her for being drunk. Yet, in her desperation, she offers a vow to God. Her persistent, faith-filled prayer becomes the doorway to the birth of Samuel—one of Israel's greatest prophets.

Key Verse

• "In her deep anguish Hannah prayed to the Lord, weeping bitterly." – 1 Samuel 1:10

Discussion Points

- God hears the cries birthed in brokenness and honors sincere, faith-filled prayer.
- Seasons of silence are not evidence of God's absence.
- Miracles often come when we give our pain back to God with a promise.

Reflection Questions

- 1. Have you experienced a "silent season" where you waited on God?
- 2. What pain in your life is God asking you to surrender through prayer?
- 3. What promise or vow might you offer in faith, like Hannah?

"Stretch Your Faith"

Scripture Focus

Matthew 12:9–13

Scripture Context and Insight

 Jesus enters a synagogue where a man with a withered hand stands before Him. Despite opposition from the Pharisees, Jesus commands the man to do something he's likely never done—stretch out his hand. In doing so, healing comes immediately.

Key Verse

"Then he said to the man, 'Stretch out your hand.' So he stretched it out and it was completely restored." – Matthew 12:13

Discussion Points

- Faith that sees miracles is faith that responds—even before the healing begins.
- Stretching spiritually requires vulnerability, courage, and obedience.
- The man was healed not when he stood still, but when he obeyed and stretched.

Reflection Questions

- 1. What is God asking you to "stretch" in this season (faith, trust, giving, forgiveness)?
- 2. How do you respond when obedience requires action before the outcome?
- 3. Is there an area in your life that has "withered" due to fear or doubt?

"The Atmosphere for a Miracle"

Scripture Focus

Mark 5:35–43

Scripture Context and Insight

 While Jesus is en route to heal Jairus' daughter, word arrives that the child is dead. Yet Jesus urges Jairus not to fear. When He arrives, He removes the mourners and doubters—then speaks life into the child. His actions show us how creating the right spiritual environment can usher in a miracle.

Key Verse

"He took her by the hand and said to her, 'Talitha koum!' (which means 'Little girl, I say to you, get up!')" – Mark 5:41

Discussion Points

- Doubt and disbelief can suffocate miracles—sometimes you must clear the room.
- Jesus calls for faith even in the face of bad news.
- Creating space for resurrection power means controlling the voices and spirits around you.

Reflection Questions

- 1. What environments or relationships are influencing your faith right now?
- 2. How can you remove doubt and create room for the miraculous?
- 3. What part of your spiritual life is Jesus calling to "get up"?
