What is an Aerator



That small piece at the end of a faucet does more than you might think.

An **aerator** mixes air into the water stream to create a smoother, more controlled flow that helps reduce splashing and water use while still maintaining a strong, comfortable feel.

Some aerators also include screens that can catch small particles and debris before they come through the faucet. Over time, mineral buildup or debris can clog the aerator, which may cause reduced, uneven, or spraying water flow.

Knowing the correct term makes it easier to describe a flow problem or ask for the right replacement part when speaking with a plumbing professional.
