History of Valentine's Day

VALENTINE'S DAY, celebrated annually on February 14th, has its origins in both ancient ROMAN and CHRISTIAN traditions. The holiday's connection to love is believed to have evolved from the Roman festival of LUPERCALIA, which was held in mid-February. This festival, a celebration of FERTILITY and the coming of spring, involved various rituals, including the pairing of young men and women through a LOTTERY system. While Lupercalia was eventually banned by the Christian church in the 5th century, some of its customs influenced the celebration of Valentine's Day.

The association of Valentine's Day with romantic love is often credited to GEOFFREY CHAUCE, a 14th-century English poet. In his poem "PARLIAMENT OF FOULES" Chaucer writes about birds choosing their mates on Saint Valentine's Day. This idea caught on in EUROPE and began to evolve over time, with the day becoming more closely associated with expressing love between couples. By the 15th century, people started sending handwritten love notes, known as "valentines," to their admirers, a practice that would continue to grow.
