Holy Communion

When we receive the Holy Communion at a church, we are making a public statement that we agree with the teachings of that church (1 Corinthians 10:14-18). The Bible cautions us against receiving the body and blood of Christ in a manner that is spiritually harmful (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). Therefore, we invite to the Lord's Supper those who have been instructed and confirmed in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

WORDS OF WELCOME
PREPARATION

Pastor: ***“That was a foolish decision.”*** Maybe you have said that to yourself after a thoughtless word or action. Our human foolishness is noted in two hymns in *Lutheran Service Book*. In the paraphrase of Psalm 23 in **“The King of Love My Shepherd Is,”** we sing of our Good Shepherd: **“Perverse and foolish oft I strayed, but yet in love He sought me”** (*LSB* 709:3). And in a hymn based on the parable of the prodigal son, we sing, **“As rebels, Lord, who foolishly have wandered”** (*LSB* 612:1). Foolishness is not generally seen as a positive attribute. But Paul reminds his Corinthian readers and us that we are called to a certain special foolishness in Christ. **“But God chose what is foolish . . . ; God chose what is weak . . . ; God chose what is low”** (1 Corinthians 1:27–28). And Paul writes to the Ephesians, **“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who . . . chose us in Him before the foundation of the world”** (Ephesians 1:3–4). We can live as reflections of God’s most gracious choosing!

EPISTLE *1 Corinthians 1:18–31*

For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, “I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart.” Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to

Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men. For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption, so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

Theme: Heaven's Great Reward

Goal: That everyone listening be encouraged to live victoriously.

CATECHISM *The Third Article*

Pastor: The Third Article of the Apostles' Creed is focused on the Holy Spirit and the ways in which the work of the Spirit blesses our lives. Often given the heading "Sanctification," the Third Article presents and emphasizes what matters for our spiritual lives now and forever.

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

What does this mean?

I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

Pastor: Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs: We pray for the church, the Bride of Christ, that through her the message of salvation be proclaimed and the gifts of God be shared. 
