Jesus Is Risen! Bodily!

Text: Matthew 28:1–10

Other Lessons: Acts 10:34–43 *or* Jeremiah 31:1–6; Psalm 16; Colossians 3:1–4

Theme: Jesus is *really*—bodily!—risen!

Goal: That everyone who listens may appreciate the certainty and importance of Jesus' physical resurrection.

Nicene Creed
