With Mary's beautiful song, the Magnificat, we exult that God has "done great things" and that "His mercy is on those who fear Him from generation to generation" (*LSB*, pp. 248–49). With Mary, we rejoice that God "has shown strength with His arm" especially to those who are lowly and humbled. Text: Luke 1:26-38

Sermon Outline

Gabriel Comes Again as God's Special Messenger, This Time to Mary, Announcing a True Message of Hope Even in the Midst of the Seemingly Impossible.

- I. Gabriel appears to a shocked and amazed Mary to announce a great miracle.
- II. He comes with a message of hope: Nothing is impossible with God.
- III. The message of hope is repeated to us in the miracle of the incarnation and inspires our hope for all things.

CREED The Third Article

Pastor: The Third Sunday in Advent is a joy-filled Sunday in which we can thank God for His gracious plan for our salvation and for the Holy Spirit, who guides our lives of faith and joins us together in the community of the Church. We speak the words of the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed with joyful confidence:
