CHRISTMAS EVE

A Multitude of the Heavenly Host Announces a Peace Which Brings Renewed Hope

Luke 2:13–14: And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!".

Outline

In the Midst of a World So Often Marred by Violence and Hatred and Hardship, a Veritable Multitude of Angelic Messengers Breaks into the Night to Announce a Living Hope: Peace for Those on Whom God's Favor Rests.

- The angelic multitude announces that true peace has come in the birth of the Christ Child—that in Christ we are reconciled to God.
- II. While the world does not understand the true nature of this peace, we know it in Christ through Word and Sacrament.

Late that First Christmas Night

Wide awake is Mary. My, how young she looks! Her head rests on the soft leather of Joseph's saddle. The pain has been eclipsed by wonder. She looks into the face of the baby. Her son. Her Lord. His majesty. At this point in history, the



human being who best understands who God is and what He is doing is a teenage girl in a smelly stable. She can't take her eyes off him. Somehow Mary knows she is holding God. *So this is He.*

He looks like anything but a king. His face is prunish and red. His cry, though strong and healthy, is still the helpless and piercing cry of a baby. And he is absolutely dependent upon Mary for his wellbeing. Majesty in the midst of the mundane. Holiness in the filth of sheep manure and sweat.
