A Most Important Question

Text: John 1:29–42a

Theme: What are you seeking?

Goal: That everyone listening may identify their need for forgiveness and seek after the only source of forgiveness and peace, Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God.

(Please stand as we prepare to confess our faith)

Nicene Creed

People: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life ☩ of the world to come. Amen.
