PRELUDE RINGING OF THE BELLS PREPARATION

Pastor: Jesus' parables in today's Gospel are a bit difficult to understand. In the first the kingdom of heaven is hidden, like treasure in a field. In the second it is extremely costly, like a large, perfect pearl. And we rejoice that we have found the Kingdom and value it above all. But what about that third parable, in which angels sort evil and righteous people like fish being burned or saved? Can we sinner-saints be confident as that day approaches? We can, for our inclusion in the Kingdom is not because of anything we have done. First, God chose us to be a people for His treasured possession, the Old Testament Reading tells us. Then, explains the Epistle, "Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us" (Romans 8:34). Our heavenly Father sent His Son to give us His own righteousness. For our Lord, incorporating us in the kingdom of heaven was something to die for.

For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Kingdom of Heaven: To Die For Text: Matthew 13:44–52

Theme: The kingdom of heaven is hidden, costly, and universal.

Goal: That all listening understand the kingdom of heaven in terms of its "wholeness" (universalness), hiddenness, and cost, seeing their value to God in the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Sermon Outline

The Kingdom of Heaven Is Hidden, Costly, and Universal.

- **I.** Like hidden treasure, the kingdom of heaven is hidden to the eye and revealed to faith.
- **II.** Like a seeking merchant, the kingdom of heaven is precious to the seeker, worth giving all to have it.
- **III.** Like a dragnet trolling the water, the kingdom of heaven is inclusive (catholic, universal), dragging everything ashore in the resurrection.

(Please stand as we prepare to confess our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.)

NICENE CREED

People: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.

He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end. And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life \maltese of the world to come. Amen.
