PRELUDE THE RINGING OF THE BELLS PREPARATION

Questions to Live (and Suffer) By Text: Job 38:1-11

Theme: instead of questioning God when we suffer, we can remember his questions to Job, which remind us of his wisdom and his live for us in Christ.

Goal: that the hearers be strengthened in faith to trust in God through times of suffering.

Outline:

- 1. When we face suffering like Job's, we often question God as Job did.
- God doesn't answer those questions, but rather, he reminds us of his infinite wisdom by asking his own questions of us.
- 3. Through these questions, God leads us to trust his wisdom and his love for us in Jesus.

Instead of Questioning God When We Suffer, We Can Remember His Questions to Job, Which Remind Us of His Wisdom and His Love for Us in Christ. (Please stand)
