Pastor: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

The Passion History of Our Lord According to the Four Evangelists Part 3 Jesus before the Sanhedrin

Reader: And immediately, while Jesus was yet speaking to His disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane, one of the twelve came; and with him a great multitude with swords, clubs, lanterns, torches and weapons, from the chief priests, scribes and the elders of the people. And Judas went ahead of them. Jesus therefore, knowing all things that should come upon Him, went forth, and said unto them, "Whom do you seek"? They answered, "Jesus of Nazareth". Jesus said to them, "I am He". As soon as Jesus said to them "I am He", they fell backward to the ground. Jesus asked again, "Whom do you seek"? They said, "Jesus of Nazareth". Jesus answered, "I have told you that I am He: if therefore you seek Me, let

these go their way: that the scripture might be fulfilled, 'Of them which You gave Me have I lost none'".

Now he that betrayed Jesus had given them a sign saying, "Whomsoever I shall kiss, that same is He; take Him, and lead Him away safely". And as soon as Judas was come, he went straight to Jesus and drew close to Jesus to kiss Him, and said, "Hail master", and kissed Him. And Jesus said unto him, "Friend, wherefore art thou come? Judas, do you betray the Son of Man with a kiss"?

Then came they, and laid hands on Jesus, and took Him. When they who were around Jesus saw what would follow, they said unto Him, "Lord, shall we smite with the sword"? And, behold, one of them who were with Jesus, Simon peter, having a sword, stretched out his hand, and drew his sword, and smote the high priest's servant and cut off his right ear. The servant's name was Malchus. And Jesus answered and said, "Suffer you thus far". And He said to Peter, "Put up again your sword into the sheath; for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword. The cup which My Father hath given Me, shall I not drink it? Don't you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He shall presently give Me more than twelve legions (72,000) of angels? But how then shall the scriptures be fulfilled that thus it must be"? And He touched Malchus' ear, and healed him.

In that same hour Jesus answered and said to the multitude, unto the chief priests, and captains of the temple, and the elders, which were come to Him, "Are you come out as against a thief, with swords and clubs for to take Me? I sat daily with you teaching in the temple, and you stretched forth no hands against Me: but this is your hour and the power of darkness". But all this was done, that the scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled. Then all the disciples forsook Him and fled. Then the band and the captain and the officers of the Jews took Jesus, and bound Him, and led Him away.

And they that had laid hold on Jesus led Him away to Annas first; for he was father-in-law to Caiaphas, who was the high priest that same year. Then led they Jesus away bound to Caiaphas, where all the chief priests and the scribes and the elders were assembled. Now Caiaphas was the one who gave counsel to the Jews that it was expedient that one man should die for the people.

And from a distance Simon Peter followed Jesus to the high priest's palace, and so did another disciple. That other disciple was known by the high priest and went with Jesus into the palace of the high priest. But Peter stood at the door outside. Then that other disciple who was known by the high priest went out and spoke to her who kept the door, and brought in Peter. And the servants and officers stood there, who had made a fire of coals; for it was cold: and they warmed themselves. And Peter went in, and sat with the servants, to see the end.

Reader: Then one of the maids of the high priest, the damsel who kept the door, when she saw Peter as he sat by the fire warming himself, earnestly looked at him and said, "And you also were with Jesus of Nazareth. Are you not also one of this Man's disciples"? But Peter denied before them all, saying "Woman, I know Him not, neither understand I what you are saying.

And Simon Peter stood by the fireplace to warm himself. And after a little while (after the first denial), as he went out into the porch, the cock crowed. And another girl saw him, and began to say to them that stood by, "This fellow also was with Jesus of Nazareth". They said, therefore, unto him, "Are not you also one of His disciples"? And another said, "You are also of them". And again Peter denied it with an oath, saying, "Man, I am not; I do not know the Man". And after a little while, about the space of one hour, another confidently

affirmed, saying, "Of a truth this fellow also was with Jesus; for you are a Galilean, and your speech agrees to that and betrays you. One of the servants of the high priest, being his relative, whose ear Peter cut off, said, "Did not I see you in the garden with Him"? Then began Peter to curse and to swear, saying, "I know not this Man of whom you speak". And immediately, while he was yet speaking the cock crowed the second time. And the Lord turned and looked at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how He had said to him "Before the cock crows twice, you shall deny Me three times". And he went out and wept bitterly.

The high priest then asked Jesus about His disciples, and about His teachings. Jesus answered him, "I spoke openly to the world: I always taught in the synagogue, and in the temple, where the Jews always meet; and have said nothing in secret. Why do you ask Me? Ask them who heard Me what I have said to them; behold, they know what I said". And when He had thus spoken, one of the officers who stood by struck Jesus with the palm of his hand, saying, "Do you answer the high priest that way"? Jesus answered him, "If I have spoken evil, bear witness of the evil; but if well, why do you strike Me"? The chief priests and elders and all the council sought for false witness against Jesus to put Him to death and found none: yes, though many false witnesses came and bare false witness against Him, yet found they none; for their witness did not agree together.

And there arose at last two, who bare false witness against Him, saying, "We heard this Fellow say, "I am able to destroy the temple of God and to build it in three days. I will destroy this temple that is made with hands, and within three days I will build another made without hands." But neither did their witness agree together.

And the high priest arose, and stood up in the middle, and asked Jesus, saying, "Won't You answer anything? What is it which these testify against You"? But Jesus kept quiet and answered nothing. Again the high priest asked Him, and said to Him, "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed? I adjure You by the living God, that You tell us whether You are the Christ, the Son of God". Jesus said unto him, "It is as you said, I am.

Nevertheless I say unto you, hereafter you shall see the Son of Man sitting on the right hand of power and coming in the clouds of heaven".

The high priest tore his clothes, saying, "He has spoken blasphemy; what further need have we of witnesses? Behold, now you have heard His blasphemy. What do you think"? And they all condemned Jesus and said, He is deserving of death".

Now the men who held Jesus, mocked Him, and some began to spit on Him, and to cover His face, and to beat Him; and others struck Him with the palms of their hands, saying, "Prophesy unto us, thou Christ, who is He that struck you"? And many other things they blasphemously spoke against Him.
