The Passion History of our Lord according to the four Evangelists Part 5

JESUS CONDEMNED TO DEATH

Reader: And when Pilate had called together the chief priests and the rulers of the people, he said unto them, "You have brought this Man to me, as one who perverts the people; and, behold, I, having examined Him before you, have found no fault in this man touching those things whereof you accuse Him: no, nor yet Herod; for I sent you to him: and, lo, nothing worthy of death is done unto Him. I will therefore chastise Him, and release Him".

Now at that feast the governor was accustomed to release unto them one prisoner, whomsoever they desired. And they had then a notable prisoner, called Barabbas, who lay bound with them that had made insurrection with him in the city, who had committed murder in the insurrection. He was also a robber. And the multitude crying aloud began to desire Pilate to do as he always had done to them. For of necessity he must release one to them at the feast. Therefore when they were gathered together, Pilate said unto them, "You have a custom that I should release unto you one at the Passover: whom will you that I release unto you, Barabbas or Jesus, the King of the Jews, who is called Christ"? For Pilate knew that for envy the chief priests had delivered Him.

When Pilate was set down on the judgement seat, his wife sent to him, saying, "Have nothing to do with that just Man; for I have suffered many things this day in a dream because of Him".

But the chief priests and elders persuaded the multitude that they should ask for Barabbas and destroy Jesus. The governor answered and said unto them, "Which of the two will you that I release to you"? And they cried out at once, saying, "away with this man, and release to us Barabbas"! Pilate therefore, wanting to release Jesus, spoke again to them, "What shall I do then with Jesus who is called Christ, whom you call King of the Jews"? But they cried out, saying, "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" And Pilate said to them the third time, "Why, what evil has He done? I have found no cause of death in Him; I will therefore chastise Him, and let Him go". And they were instant with loud voices, requiring that He might be crucified, and cried out the more exceedingly, "Let Him be crucified!" And the voices of them and of the chief priests prevailed.

So Pilate took Jesus, and scourged Him. Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus and led Him away into the common hall, called Praetorium, and gathered unto Him the whole band of soldiers. And they stripped Him and put on Him a scarlet robe. And when they had braided a crown of thorns, they put it upon His head, and a reed in His right hand: and began to salute Him, and bowed the knee before Him, and mocked Him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews"! They smote Him with

their hands and they spit upon Him, and took the reed and smote Him on the head, and bowing their knees, worshiped Him.

Reader: Pilate therefore went out again, and said to them, "Behold, I bring Him forth to you that you may know that I find no fault in Him". Then Jesus came forth, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. And Pilate saith unto them. "Behold the Man!" When the chief priests therefore, and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying, "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" Pilate saith unto them, "Take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him." The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and by our law He ought to die, because He made Himself the Son of God." When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he was more afraid, and went again into the judgment hall, and saith unto Jesus, "Where do You come from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. Then Pilate said unto Him, "Why don't You speak to me? Don't You know that I have power to crucify You and have power to release

You"? Jesus answered, "You could have no power at all against Me, except it were given you from above; therefore he that delivered Me unto you has the greater sin." And from thence forth Pilate sought to release Him: but the Jews cried out, saying, "If you let this Man go you are not Caesar's friend; whoever makes himself king speaks against Caesar."

When Pilate therefore heard that saying he brought Jesus forth and sat down in the judgment seat in a place that is called the pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha. And it was the preparation day for the Passover, and about the third hour (Nine O'clock): and Pilate said unto the Jews: "Behold your King!" But they cried out, "Away with Him, away with Him, crucify Him!" Pilate said unto them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar."

When Pilate saw that he could prevail nothing, but that rather an uproar was made, he was willing to content the people, and gave sentence that it should be as they required, and took water, and washed his hands before the multitude, saying "I am innocent of the blood of this just Person; see you to it." Then answered all the people and said, "His blood be on us and on our children."

Then he released Barabbas to them, whom they had desired. And when Pilate had Jesus scourged, he delivered them to their will to be crucified.

Then the soldiers of the governor took the purple robe off Jesus, and put His own clothing on Him. And they

took Jesus, and led Him away to crucify Him. And bearing His cross He went forth into a place called the Place of a Skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha. And as they came out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name, the father of Alexander and Rufus, who passed by, coming out of the country. They laid hold upon him, and on him they laid the cross and compelled him that he might bear it after Jesus.

And there followed Jesus a great company of people, and of women, who also bewailed and lamented Him. But turning to them Jesus said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, weep not for Me, but weep for yourselves, and for your children. For, behold, the days are coming in which they shall say, 'Blessed are the barren, and wombs which never bear and the breasts which never nursed.' Then shall they begin to say to the mountains, 'Fall on us;' and to the hills, 'Cover us.' for if they do these things in a green tree, what shall be done in the dry?"
