PART 2

JESUS' AGONY OF SOUL IN GETHSEMANE

Reader: As Jesus sat and ate with His disciples, He was troubled in spirit, and testified, and said, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, one of you, which eats with Me, shall betray Me. But, behold, the hand of him that betrays Me is with Me on the table". And the disciples were exceeding sorrowful and looked on one another, doubting of whom He spoke. And they began to inquire among themselves which of them it was that should do this thing, and to say unto Him one by one, "Is it I?" And another, "Is it I?" And He answered and said unto them, "It is one of the twelve that dippeth with Me in the dish, the same shall betray Me. The Son of Man indeed goes as it is written of Him: but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would be better for that man if he had never been born."

Now there was leaning on Jesus' bosom one of His disciples, whom Jesus loved. Simon Peter therefore beckoned to Him, that he should ask who it should be of whom He spoke. He then lying on Jesus' breast saith unto him, "Lord, who is it"? Jesus answered, "He it is, to whom I shall give a sop, when I have dipped it." And when He had dipped the sop, He gave it to Judas Iscariot, the son of Simon. Then Judas, which betrayed Him, answered and said, "Master, is it I"? Jesus said unto him, "You have said". And after the sop, Satan

entered into Judas. Then said Jesus unto him, "What you do, do quickly". Now no man at the table knew for what intent He spoke this to him. For some of them thought, because Judas had the bag, that Jesus had said unto him, "Buy those things that we have need of against the feast; or, that he should give something to the poor. He then having received the sop went immediately out. And it was night.

Therefore, when he was gone out, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in Him. If God be glorified in Him, God shall also glorify Him in Himself, and shall straightway glorify Him".

And as they were eating in the night in which He was betrayed, Jesus took bread, and gave thanks, and broke it, and gave it unto His disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is My body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of Me". Likewise, also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them saying, "Drink ye all of it: this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins. This do as often as ye drink it, in remembrance of Me". And they all drank thereof.

"Little children, yet a little while I am with you. You shall seek Me; and as I said unto the Jews, whither I go, you cannot come; so now I also say this to you. A new commandment I give unto you, that you love one another. As I have loved you, you also love one another. By this shall all men know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another". Simon Peter said unto

Him, Lord, "Where are you going"? Jesus answered him, "Where I go, you cannot follow Me now; but you shall follow Me afterwards". Peter said unto Jesus, "Lord, why can't I follow You now? I will lay down my life for Your sake". Jesus answered him, "Will you lay down your life for My sake? Simon, Simon, behold, Satan has desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: but I have prayed for you, that your faith does not fail: and when you are converted, strengthen your brethren". Then Peter said unto Jesus, "Lord I am ready to go with You, both into prison, and to death". Then Jesus said, "Verily, verily, I tell you, Peter, the cock shall not crow this day twice before you shall three times deny that you know Me".

And He said unto them, "When I sent you without purse, leather bag for food, and shoes, lacked you anything"? And they said, "Nothing". Then said He unto them, "But now, he that has a purse let him take it, and likewise his scrip. And he that has no sword let him sell his garment and buy one. For I say unto you, that this that is written must be accomplished in Me: 'And He was reckoned among the transgressors.' For the things concerning Me have an end". And they said, "Lord, behold, here are two swords." And Jesus said unto them, "It is enough."

HYMN

Reader: When Jesus had spoken these words, and when they had sung a hymn, He came out, and went forth, as He was wont, over the brook Cedron, to the Mount of Olives, and His disciples also followed Him. Then Jesus said unto them, "All of you shall be offended because of Me this night: For it is written, "I will smite the Shepherd, and the sheep of the flock shall be scattered abroad'. But after I am risen again, I will go before you into Galilee." Peter answered and said unto Him. "Though all shall be offended because of You, yet will I never be offended. Jesus said unto him, "Verily I say unto you, that this night, before the cock crow twice, you shall deny Me three times." Peter spoke the more vehemently, "Though I should die with You, yet will I not deny You in any way". Likewise also said all the disciples.

Then Jesus came with them unto a place called Gethsemane, where there was a garden, into which He and His disciples entered. Judas, who would betray Jesus, also knew the place, for Jesus often met there with His disciples. And when He was at the place, He said to His disciples: "Sit here while I go and pray over there. Pray that you enter not into temptation".

And He took with Him Peter, and James and John, the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be sorrowful, and very heavy. Jesus said unto them: "My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death; tarry here and watch with Me".

And He was withdrawn from them, and went forward a little, about a stone's cast, and kneeled down, and fell on the ground, on His face, and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from Him. And He said: "Abba, Father, all things are possible unto you: take away this cup from Me; nevertheless, not what I will, but what You will; not My will, but Your will be done". Then He came to the disciples, and found them asleep for sorrow, and said unto Peter, "Simon, are you sleeping? What, could you not watch with Me one hour? Watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The spirit truly is willing, but the flesh is weak". Jesus went away again the second time, and prayed saying, "O My Father, if this cup may not pass away from Me, except I drink, Thy will be done". And when He returned, He found them asleep again, (for their eyes were heavy), neither knew what to answer Him. And He left them, and went away again, and prayed the third time, saying the same words. And there appeared an angel unto Him from heaven strengthening Him. And being in an agony, He prayed more earnestly: and His sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling down to the ground.

And He came the third time to His disciples and found them sleeping and said, "Sleep on now, and take your rest. Behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Rise, let us be going: behold, he is at hand that will betray Me."
