THE DOOR OF JESUS' CROSS

Text: John 10:1–10 (Today's Gospel Reading)

Theme: The voice of our Shepherd calls us to follow him through the door: Jesus himself on the cross.

Goal: That everyone listening hear Jesus as, by his cross, the one calling to eternal life and the only door to it.

NICENE CREED
