# Judging guidelines

#### -Pageant Judging Guidelines by Category-

#### Appearance

1. Attractiveness with self-confidence.

Grooming: This should include neatness and cleanliness in every detail including complexion, hands, fingernails, hair, hat, boots, and other wearing apparel. Meticulous care in general grooming is essential for a girl to be considered.
Photogenic Quality: Judges will conduct a review of a single 8"x10" photo that the Contestant will have submitted with her entry.

4. Posture: How a Contestant carries herself is very important. The Judges will be looking for Contestants to carry themselves straight and tall and exude self-confidence and poise.

5. Poise and ladylike behavior in every situation: Judges will be looking for Contestants to handle each situation in which they are involved with grace and style. Judges will also be looking for Contestants to have a substantial knowledge of proper etiquette.

6. Western Fashion Sense: Contestants should pick outfits that reflect fashionable and tasteful western clothing. Judges will be paying particular attention to Contestant's ability to use colors to enhance her natural coloring, appearance and eye appeal.

7. Proper fit of clothing: Contestants should pay particular attention to the fit of their outfits. Outfits should be figure flattering and altered to fit her personally. Judges will be looking for a properly fitting hat that is shaped to flatter the Contestants face. Contestants should remember that this is not a clothing contest. It is not necessary to invest an excessive amount of money in clothing. Judges will be looking for versatility and imagination and a Contestant's ability to carry out a "total look".

8. Knowledge of Western clothing: Contestants should be familiar with the major manufacturers and the latest trends in the western wear industry.

#### Personality

1. Intelligence and good common sense.

2. Conversational ability in varied circumstances, with an emphasis on grammar and enunciation.

3. A g<mark>ood</mark> sense of humor.

4. Self-confidence, high moral standards, sincerity, and integrity.

5. Genuine interest in other people and consideration of others.

6. Self-Projection: the ability to project one's personality, whether it is from horseback or appearing on stage before a crowd.

7. A happy outlook on life.

8. Promptness in keeping the pageant schedule.

9. Maturity.

10. The ability to clearly express ones educational and career goals.

#### Horsemanship

- 1. Horsemanship-Control of the horse and the way the Contestant handles each situation that may occur.
- 2. Balance- The ability to sit steady in the saddle.
- 3. Position of hands, feet and seat.
- 4. Understanding and skill will be judged and not the horse or the equipment.

5. There will be one go round of horsemanship competition. Each Contestant will be required to execute the designated pattern for her age division. At the discretion of the judges, patterns may be altered due to the arena conditions. Any changes and /or alterations to the Horsemanship patterns will be announced to the Contestants before the horsemanship begins

6. Showmanship: How well a Contestant projects her personality to the audience from horseback.

### Pageant Judges

Amy is no stranger to the pageant and equine world. She resides in the little community of Norco, California where there are more horses than people. Amy married her High School sweetheart and lives with her husband of 28 years. Together they have a daughter and son along with several horses and dogs.

Amy has multiple jobs. In her personal life, she's a coach, nurse, driver, groomer, hairdresser, fashion coordinator to name a few. She has been involved with horses since her daughter was 4 years old. She figured it was a phase and would pass. That was almost 20 years ago. Both her kids were active in rodeo. She is a mother of a rodeo title holder, and her son was a bull rider. She has spent many hours in an arena supporting not only her children, but other kids too. Currently, her daughter travels throughout the country competing in Mounted Shooting so she is her travel partner. Together, they have traveled several thousand miles hauling horses and creating memories.

In her professional life, Amy has spent over 3 decades helping entrepreneurs increase their business through referral marketing. She works for a Global Organization that has over 300,000 business professionals and is an accomplished speaker on an international stage.

Although her kids no longer participate in rodeos, she continues to support her community by participating with rodeos lending a hand behind the gates. Although she is no longer active on Queen Committee for Hesperia Wranglers, she is still in touch with the board and is up to date with the activities.

Amy is passionate about being spontaneous and loves to travel. You'll find her spending time along the Colorado River enjoying water sports or in Montana. She is always with her family.

A Norco California, also known as Horsetown USA, is where Haley Brown resides with her 4 horses and 3 dogs. She moved to Norco in 2011 and is a graduate of Norco High School. Haley began riding horses at the age of 4 and never looked back. She was active with Pacific Coast Junior Bull Riders, a youth bull riding organization located in Norco. She opened each rodeo by presenting the American Flag. It was through this organization, she learned how to handle rough stock. She's had the opportunity to work closely with pro stock contractors.

In 2015 Haley competed and won the title of Jr. Miss Rodeo Norco Horseweek. Then in 2016, Haley competed and won the title of Miss Rodeo Norco Horseweek. In 2017, Haley completed and won the title of Miss Hesperia Wranglers. She was fortunate enough to participate in rodeos throughout California with her horse, Skeeter. She had the privilege and opportunity to ride in the Hollywood Christmas parade and the Rose parade.

During her time as Miss Rodeo Norco Horseweek, she presented our Nations colors during a Mounted Shooting event in Delmar. In 2018, as her time as Miss Hesperia Wranglers was coming to an end, her Mounted Shooting journey began with Silver Dollar, Ranch, Kenny Lawson. She has professionally competed throughout the country, including World Finals in Amarillo, Texas. She is passionate about the sport and continues to compete with her horse Poco.

In 2020, Haley lived and work on a Cow / Calf operation in Montana. She worked throughout the state for 2 years working on different ranches. It was an experience of a lifetime.

Today, Haley supports people by exercising and training horses throughout Southern California. She continues to be very active both on Norco's Rodeo Committee and the Norco Horseweek Queen Committee. She works under Performance Horse trainers and still finds time to compete in Mounted Shooting.

In her spare time, you'll find her riding the trails in Norco with her horses. She still travels to Montana to spend time with family and friends.

Even though she no longer wears a crown, she believes, "Once a queen, always a queen." She is a true ambassador for the sport of rodeo. She wants to encourage young ladies to get out and follow their dreams. It's her mission to give back to those who are running for a title.
