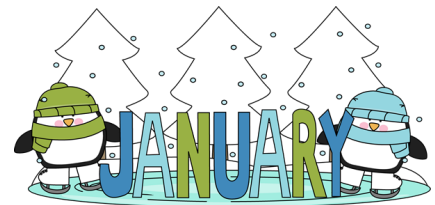

Recipe - VFW's Mulligatawny Soup

Many of you who attended the guild's Christmas party seemed to really like the soup. The VFW staff shared the following recipe for Mulligatawny Soup.

MULLIGATAWANY SOUP

1 lb chicken tenders (diced)
Few slices bacon, diced
3 tbl butter
1 small onion
2 stalks celery
2 carrots
2 ½ tsp fresh garlic (minced)
1 ¼ tsp thyme
1 ¼ tsp marjoram
1 15 oz can diced tomatoes
2.5 oz chicken base
¼ tsp baking soda
1 cup cooked rice
1 tbl curry powder
½ qt half & half
¼ tsp fresh grated lemon peel
1 large braeburn apple, unpeeled (or any crisp red apple variety)

In standard soup pot, sauté bacon over medium heat until lightly crispy. Drain excess grease; add 3 tbl butter, onions, celery, carrots, thyme, garlic and marjoram. Saute briefly; add chicken and cook until almost cooked through. Add tomatoes and stock to desired level. Add rice, curry and lemon peel. Bring soup to a simmer and add baking soda. Add a small amount of roux for thickening, than add the half & half. Stir in the apple and check seasoning. Balance flavors as needed.

Note: if the chicken is pre-cooked, add at the last with the apples. If you are cooking the soup ahead and plan to re-heat it later, do not add the apples until you are ready to re-heat to keep them from getting too mushy.
