Destination Imagination – Challenges & Special Awards

Destination Imagination teaches life skills and expands imaginations through team-based creative problem solving. The program has two components:

"Instant Challenges" – Teams receive an Instant Challenge and the materials with which to solve it. Team members must think under pressure and apply appropriate skills to produce a solution in a period of just 5 to 8 minutes. In a world with growing cultural connections, increased levels and types of communication, and a new need for real-time teamwork and problem solving, Instant Challenges enable our participants to face dilemmas with optimism and confidence. Instant Challenges are performance-based, task-based, or a combination of the two. Although each Instant Challenge has different requirements, all reward teams for their teamwork. Instant Challenges are kept confidential until the day of the tournament & account for 25% of a team's overall score.

"Team Challenges" – Destination Imagination Team Challenges are designed as a fun and engaging system of learning. Each participant gains knowledge and experience in creative and critical thinking, project management, team building, conflict resolution, STEAM, perseverance, and a completion mindset --- the very skills needed to thrive in any chosen career. Students work together to create and develop solutions on their own without interference from Team Managers, parents, or other individuals who are not on their team.
