TRUE FREEDOM IN CHRIST

Much of us face our future with a yearning to be free. Free from something or free to do something. A freedom that is often defined by the world we live in rather than the Word we are called to live by. As believers, we must remember that our lives are always influenced by two things - The world / the Word. The choice to let one or the other influence us is often a subconscious choice and given our fallen state, we gravitate towards the former rather than the latter. Which means that we must make an intentional decision to define freedom as the Word defines it and to live that out in our lives.

Our verse for this month states:

For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. (Galatians 5:13)

We see how liberty or freedom is a calling. Earlier in the chapter that this verse appears, we see that liberty is a position we receive in Christ:

Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free, and do not be entangled again with a yoke of bondage.
(Galatians 5:1)

Take note that the calling and position of freedom in Christ comes with warnings to us as believers. Let us meditate on the two aspects of freedom we have with their respective warning.

Position of freedom | Do not return to bondage (vs. 1)

Once we come to Christ and accept Him as our Lord and Saviour, we are born again and robed in His righteousness. We move from being the object of God's wrath to being loved as He loves Christ. This exchange comes with mutual agreement on both sides. Christ willing gave His life as a sacrifice that I might be redeemed and made free. I then willing choose to accept His gift of salvation and come under His Lordship. This position of freedom is one that the world can never give nor take away - but you and I can walk away from it. That is why we then receive the warning to not be entangled again with the yoke of bondage! Despite the beautiful freedom we now experience in Christ, we can be deceived into letting ourselves get under the very bondage that Christ freed us from!

TRUE FREEDOM IN CHRIST

Lord grant us the grace to guard our hearts and minds from this deception. May we remember the greatness of Christ's sacrifice and the majestic freedom that you and I have in Him. The enemy and our own sin will come to tempt us to walk away from that freedom as Paul continues to expound in the chapter, but we must stand fast. Stand in your position in Christ, Stand with Christ in your life and Stand for Christ in your decisions.

Called to freedom | Do not abuse the calling (vs. 13)

This verse so interestingly describes that our calling to liberty moves us towards a life of servitude. As seen above, we first stand in a place of liberty and then we're told that we're called to liberty. This freedom then provides us with an opportunity that can be used either for me or for my brother/sister.

We see in the story of Zacchaeus that once he received freedom in Christ, he was moved to use that freedom to pay back four times more to those he had cheated and to provide half his possessions to the poor. Christ did not tell him to do it, but the freedom that Zacchaeus now experienced was far greater than the security and pleasure that his riches masked as freedom. He then used that freedom to serve others than to indulge his flesh. What might an indulgence of the flesh look like? Paul gives an impressive list in *Galatians* 5:19-21.

Let us not let the world normalize or glamorize this list for us dear ones. Be careful with anything and anyone who pulls you towards anything on this list. Also remember that the pulls starts in the heart before its seen in your actions. The antidote? Is in verse 25, *If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.*

Lord our heavenly Father, we're so grateful for Your love and Your Son Christ Jesus who came to give us a freedom so beautiful and wonderful. A freedom that comes in our position in Christ and expresses itself in the way we live. We fail to see the seriousness of the sin we have been saved from and the evil that reviles the love of Christ. This leads us to take Your love and the freedom You give us for granted. Grant us the strength to live in the Spirit and not in the flesh. In Jesus' name, Amen.

FREEDOM IN CHRIST-BIBLE QUIZ

In the "land of the free," we often confuse the true nature of freedom. For many of us, freedom has become synonymous with personal independence — the ability to make our own decisions and choose our own path in life, to do whatever we want, whenever we want. It's what I call "outside freedom." But this is not the freedom in Christ that we have been given.

When Jesus revealed himself as the Messiah, He said that He had come to Earth to "proclaim freedom" (Luke 4:18). And on another occasion, He said, "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36).

Jesus was not setting us free to do whatever we wanted; He was freeing us to do what we ought to do. He was liberating us to walk in relationship with God and to be the kind of people He created us to be. This spiritual freedom in Christ is what I call "inside freedom" — the ability to obey God and choose His will for our lives. And this is the freedom in Christ that sin had long denied us.

Jesus shocked the Pharisees, the spiritual leaders of His day, when He stated, "I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin" (John 8:34). Jesus was asserting that we are all under the power and control of a natural tendency to sin; we can't get away from it by ourselves.

Sin brings a penalty that, by ourselves, we can't escape either. The Bible says, "The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23).

How do we find freedom from the penalty and power of sin?

That comes through accepting Jesus Christ's death on the Cross as the payment for our sin. As we submit to Christ, sin loses its power — Christ's power takes over. As we choose to trust and follow Him, our sinful habits, thoughts and attitudes lose their control. Guilt disappears, and peace of mind dominates. Right habits become the norm. That's freedom in Christ — true freedom!
