The year gone by has had its ups and downs, but Faithful one so unchanging has been our Refuge and Strength. This is a year when we are hoping to see great and mighty things through our church, our families and individually. We believe that in 2020 we are going to see great and mighty things because Jesus said, “**Greater things than these thou shall see**” We are sure that each one of you have that sense of passion and zeal that would make His name be lifted up higher through Koramangala Methodist Church Family.

This month we focus on the **Theme – Building His Church through Worship**. Worship as commonly described as the feeling or expression of reverence and adoration for a deity. Every religion has a form of worship that they express in different ways. Worship started in the heavens as the Angels worshipped God the Father and that was translated to man through Adam and the rest is History. To worship is to turn our thoughts away from ourselves toward another, and in the realm of the Spirit that Other is God. In adoration we praise the merits of One far above ourselves. The high and exalted One in Heaven and in Earth becomes the center of our thinking and of our life. We acknowledge on Supreme and Almighty Being who is above, beneath, and beyond, and yet is closer to us than breathing, nearer than hands and feet; for He dwells within our hearts.

Worship is something that should and could affect every part of our Christian’s life. Worship isn’t a plan or performance, it’s not merely the time we spend singing in Church or just fellowshiping. Worship is a heart-felt response to our Awesome God, our Wonderful Savior. **Worship is a response both personally and corporately to God – For who He is, and was and is to come, expressed in and by things we say, think & do.** Someone said that, “Prayer is most often focused on the Problem, Praise most often focuses on the Provision, **Worship, focuses on the Provider**”.

In Exodus 23:25 - Worship the Lord your God, and his blessing will be on your food and water. I will take away sickness from among you. Worship is how we express our love, adoration, admiration, and wonder at God’s presence. The Christian breathes in God’s goodness and exhales Worship. For a lot of the church, Worship has become synonymous with singing—but

that's just one way that worship expresses itself. True worship happens when our entire life becomes a declaration of trust in God's incredible mercy. Paul expressed this very idea when he said, ***"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship."*** (Rom. 12:1)

Worship should be an integral part of our everyday existence. It will not be an activity that comes from faith, but will be a natural response that arises from first-hand experience with the living God. "I need to worship because without it I can forget that I have a big God beside me and live in fear. I need to worship because without it I can forget his calling and begin to live in a spirit of self-preoccupation. I need to worship because without it I lose a sense of wonder and gratitude and plod through life with blinders on. I need worship because my natural tendency is toward self-reliance and stubborn independence." Says John Ortberg.

Our Worship will begin and it arises from right priorities. **"Nothing teaches us about the preciousness of the Creator as much as when we learn the emptiness of everything else."** said Charles Spurgeon. When we experience a life-changing encounter with God, Worship is a natural impulse. As Christians, however, we discover that worship can't simply be reactive. We must learn to be proactive in glorifying God, even when it's not our current disposition. King David was known to do, in all through his life. In times of trials, tribulation, good times he offered worship to God. There are times when something stirs in our hearts and everything inside of us responds in worship, but those are grace-filled promptings of the Spirit. It's important that we make worship a conscience choice, and a willful act.

How is our Worship? It is a ritual or does it stem from our hearts. Is it emotional or is our very being. **As KMC family, we need to enhance our Worship.** As the Glory of God descended on the Tent of the Meeting when the Children of Israel gathered, so also it is our prayer that the Glory of God would not only surround us in our everyday lives but especially during our Corporate Worship that Koramangala will know that we are a Chosen generation, a Royal Priesthood, a special people who have been called from darkness to Light to show forth Him through our Worship and in our daily living.

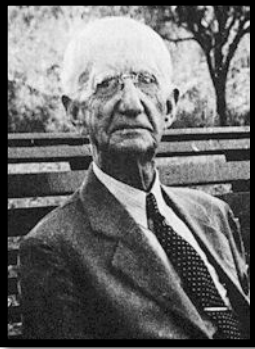
SENIOR CITIZENS CHRISTMAS ON 21 DECEMBER 2019

Hymn History **GREAT IS THY FAITHFULNESS**



Thomas Obadiah Chisholm (July 29, 1866 – February 29, 1960) was an American songwriter who wrote several prominent Christian hymns.

Chisholm was born in Franklin, Kentucky on July 29, 1866 in a log cabin and became a teacher at age sixteen. In 1893, aged 27, Chisholm had a Christian conversion experience during a revival in Franklin led by Dr. Henry Clay Morrison. He served as a Methodist minister for only one year before resigning due to poor health. In 1909 Chisholm began working as a life insurance agent in Winona

Lake and Vineland, New Jersey.

Chisholm wrote over 1,200 sacred poems over his lifetime, which appeared in many Christian periodicals, and he served as an editor of the *Pentecostal Herald* in Louisville for a period. In 1923 at age fifty-seven, Chisholm wrote the popular song *Great Is Thy Faithfulness*.

Hymnologist Kenneth Osbeck provides the background for "*Great Is Thy Faithfulness*." Chisholm had sent a number of his poems to the Rev. William H. Runyan, a musician with the Moody Bible Institute and one of the editors of Hope Publishing Company in Chicago. George Beverly Shea (1909-2013), the famous Canadian-born singer of the Billy Graham Crusades, introduced this hymn to those attending the evangelistic meetings in Great Britain in 1954 and became a favorite.

A phrase in Lamentations 3:22-23 provides a basis for the refrain: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." Stanza one emphasizes God's unchanging nature: "... there is no shadow of turning with thee;/thou changest not, thy compassions they fail not" Perhaps James 1:17 provides the scriptural basis for this concept: "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows"

In stanza two, the natural created order, including the cycle of the seasons, bears witness to the faithfulness of God. The final stanza brings the eternal, unchanging God into contact with humanity. We receive from the presence of God "Pardon for sin and a peace that endures" Indeed, William Runyan's tune was the ideal musical complement to the warmth of the text. The subtle changes in harmony and the

solemnity of the melody amplify the text, bringing the climax on the word "faithfulness" perfectly at the end of the refrain.

This hymn appeared in many evangelical hymnals and song collections, but was not chosen for an official Methodist hymnal until the current United Methodist Hymnal (1989), even though the author was a Methodist. It was a very popular hymn of the former Evangelical United Brethren Church and had been included in their hymnals.

According to Carlton Young, "Great is thy faithfulness" was second only to "In the garden" as the most requested hymn for inclusion in The Methodist Hymnal. A survey conducted in 2000 by Dean McIntyre, Director of Music Resources, Discipleship Ministries, revealed that "Great is thy faithfulness" remains one of the favorite hymns among Methodists. Towards the end of his life, Chisholm retired to the Methodist Home for the Aged in New Jersey and died in 1960.

About William M. Runyan

William M. Runyan (1870–1957) was a Christian composer from the United States who wrote the music to the well-known hymn Great Is Thy Faithfulness. In 1870, William Marion Runyan was born in Marion, New York to a Methodist minister Rev. William White Runyan and his wife Hannah Runyan. At age fourteen, Runyan and his family moved to Marion, Kansas. As a youth, Runyan served as a church organist and graduated from Marion High School in Kansas. Runyan was ordained as a Methodist minister at age twenty-one and then pastored various congregations in Kansas.

In 1923 Runyan composed the music to the song "Great is Thy Faithfulness," originally a poem by Thomas O. Chisholm, a friend and fellow Methodist minister. Runyan wrote of the hymn: "This particular poem held such an appeal that I prayed most earnestly that my tune might carry over its message in a worthy way, and the subsequent history of its use indicates that God answered prayer. It was written in Baldwin, Kansas, in 1923, and was first published in my private song pamphlets."

Runyan retired from Hope in 1948 and received the honorary Doctor of Letters from Wheaton College. He lived for a period of his retirement in Galveston, Texas and died on July 29, 1957 in Pittsburg, Kansas. Runyan's survivors endowed "The Rev. William M. Runyan Endowed Memorial Scholarship" at Baker University with the royalties from his song "Great is Thy Faithfulness."

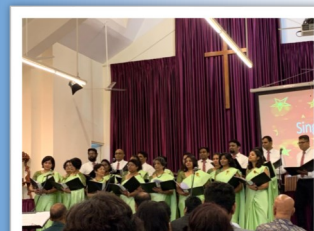

10,000 REASONS - WORSHIP IN THE GOOD & BAD

“I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need”

Philippians 4:12

He is not just the God of our good times. He is the God of all times. Which means he’s also the God of our worst times.

He is not just God when we abound, as Paul writes in Philippians 4:12, but also when we are brought low. He is God when we have plenty to eat and when we experience hunger. He is God in our abundance and God in our need. He is God in any and every circumstance, and this is wonderfully good news — because life is so much more than just the good times.

Even and Especially the Bad Things

When Paul says in Romans 8:28 that “for those who love God, all things work together for good,” his point is not to persuade us that all the good things in our lives work for our good. We already believe that. It’s easy to imagine that the good things work for good.

The point is that even and especially “the bad things” in our lives, and our hardest of times, are being worked for our eternal good by our almighty and merciful Father.

To make sure we get the point, the next few verses list some of the worst possible things: tribulation, distress, persecution, famine, nakedness, peril, sword (Romans 8:35), even being put to death for the faith (Romans 8:36). Will these bad things, the greatest difficulties, the worst sufferings ultimately bring us down and work for our bad? “No,” he says, “in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us” (Romans 8:37).

The Most Meaningful Moments

It is true that the good times in life are for singing, “Bless the Lord, O my soul.” God means for us to worship his holy name when life is good, when the sun comes up, when a new day dawns. He wants us to sing in gratitude and praise when all is well and when it’s easy to see his kindness and love and patience and goodness. In the best of times, yes, we should be on the lookout for some of the ten thousand reasons we have for praising him.

But the times that we truly sing like never before are when the “whatever may pass” is hardest, and the “whatever lies before me” is most difficult. It’s in life’s toughest seasons, as we feel life’s greatest losses, that we learn to worship at new depths and with thicker, richer substance.

Life’s most meaningful moments and the seasons of most soul-stirring worship typically come not when life feels at its peak, but when our strength is failing, even when our end, or the end of a loved one, is drawing near. These are the times when we discover like never before that God truly is with us and transcends the blessings of this life and really is all we need.

We may have ten thousand reasons to praise him in the best times, but this one reason can suffice in the worst times: He is God. And no matter what else we lose, nothing can separate us from him.

I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
