Team Update ARISE, LET US BUILD



God had given KMC the vision for an extension church at Sarjapur and God has indeed blessed the sacrifice and labours of His people with steady growth and expanding ministries in the Church. A permanent place of its own and a more-functional building will enable us to continue to equip people for ministry and reach people for Christ.

Since early 2018, the Church has been involved in the Arise, let us BUILD

project helping extension church grow and increase funding to help aid the land purchase for new Church facility in Sarjapur area and as we continue through the planning and processes involved it is great to see God work in different ways; opening doors at times for better opportunities and closing doors at other times to point us in a different direction.

As we are almost close to spot the land, initiate the legal procedure and draw the plans for payment schedule, the coming 4-6 months will be both exciting and challenging. This vision has required and will still require a great deal of commitment and sacrifice from all of us. It is clear that nothing great had ever happened without commitment and sacrifice and just like the investment that Godly men and women made thirty plus years ago is impacting us with the current KMC Church facility, the investment that we are willing to make for a new Church at Sarjapur will impact for generations to come.

Current plan is to acquire about 100 by 100 ft land with approximate cost of 2.4 Cr. This is situated on the left of Kodathi Village towards Varthur Road. Once our lawyers give a green signal to go ahead we need to get into an Agreement of Sale with Seller and finish the purchase

within 4-6 months timeline with all necessary due diligence.

Our Capital Fund accumulated for this purpose is 1 Cr, we are still needing funds to pursue this land option and all contributions are welcome. Over the two years since we draw the first plans, the land prices have gone high resulting in down-sizing of our land requirement from 1-acre to about a quarter of its size. We are at danger of further shrinking or shelve the project on further increase of land prices. Reaching our full ministry potential will need all of us.

What will YOU do to help us to raise money for Arise, let us BUILD Fund? The Arise, let us BUILD Fund needs your help, don't leave it to others. Can you make a difference?

Article WHAT IS A WITNESS?

In more than 50 years of traveling around the world, I have never had anyone witness to me about their Christian faith, though several have confessed their faith after I initiated a conversation. Surveys indicate that the vast majority of Bible-believing Christians do not witness to others about their faith in Christ. Eighty-five percent never invite anyone to church, and 95 percent never win anyone to Christ.

What does it mean to witness? Before the Lord Jesus ascended into heaven, His last words were, "You shall be witnesses to me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8, NKJV). Witnessing was a command, not a choice. The disciples boldly testified, "We were eyewitnesses from the beginning" (Cf. Luke 1:2) and "eyewitnesses of his majesty" (2 Peter 1:16, NKJV) and "we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20, NKJV).

The word *witness* needs little explanation. A witness testifies to what is seen or heard and verifies what is true. In court, a witness must swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, so help him God.

A witness can be a symbol. For example, Abraham gave Abimelech seven lambs as a witness in a land agreement (Genesis 21:27-30). Jacob made a pile of stones as a witness to mark a boundary between him and Laban (Genesis 31:44-50). The tribes of Reuben and Gad made an altar as a witness to Israel (Joshua 22:34). For Christians, baptism is a witness and confession in identification with the death, burial and resurrection of the Lord Jesus (Romans 6:3-5).

God is a witness: He testifies to the veracity of His Son. Jesus is a witness of Himself and the Father by His words and actions. The Holy Spirit is a witness to Jesus. The Scriptures are a witness of the Trinity. The Law and the Prophets were a witness. The apostles gave witness. The angels witness. People's actions are a witness against themselves. The human conscience is a witness of the laws of God. People witness to their experience, and believers are to be witnesses of the Gospel to the entire world (John 5:32, 5:39, 8:18, 15:26; Romans 3:21; Acts 10:43; Matthew 23:31; Romans 2:15; John 4:39; Acts 1:8; Matthew 28:19).

The New Testament lists people in biblical history and calls them faithful witnesses. Hebrews 12:1-3 uses the imagery of a stadium in which a crowd views a great contest. Those viewing the contest have been in the arena themselves. This picture challenges every Christian to persevere because these faithful witnesses are watching. Therefore, run the race, look to Jesus.

He is the Author and Perfecter of our faith; He endured the cross and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. And finally, the Lord Jesus is proven in Revelation 1:5 and 3:14 to be the faithful, true and ultimate Witness.

What prevents a person from witnessing? Cultural pressure makes people hesitant. Many assume that witnessing creates intolerance. Witnessing about the cross of Christ is foolishness to those who don't believe, the Scriptures say. The fear of losing friends silences a witness. The insecurity of not having the right answers for other religions prevents some from sharing their faith. In many parts of the world, persecution is a threat. Other times a lack of conviction that people are lost prevents witnessing. The failure to live a consistent Christian life negates a convincing witness. But none of these obstacles can compare with the tragedy of Christians doing nothing as people on every side enter eternity without Jesus Christ. May God make us all faithful witnesses.

What Is the Witness of the Christian Faith?

Christians have been commissioned by Jesus Christ to testify to the following:

The Gospel: "For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Sriptures" (1 Corinthians 15:3-4 NIV).

The Divinity of Jesus, That He Is the Savior of the World: "We have seen and testify that the Father has sent the Son as Savior of the world" (1 John 4:14. NKJV).

The Love of God: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16, NKJV).

The Forgiveness of God: "[God] commanded us ... to testify that it is [Christ] who was ordained by God to be Judge of the living and the dead. To Him all the prophets witness that, through His name, whoever believes in Him will receive remission of sins" (Acts 10:42, 43, NKJV).

The Grace of God: "that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God" (Acts 20:24, NKJV).

The Hope of Eternal Life: "Always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear" (1 Peter 3:15, NKJV)

Hymn History ABIDE WITH ME



Henry Francis Lyte (1 June 1793 - 20 N o v e m b e r 1 8 4 7) w a s an Anglican divine, hymnodist and poet. He was the second son of Thomas and Anna Maria (née Oliver) Lyte and was born at Ednam, near Kelso, Scotland.

After studying at Trinity College, Dublin, and with very limited training for the ministry, Lyte took Anglican holy orders in 1815, and for some time he held a curacy in Taghmon near Wexford. Lyte's "sense of vocation was vague at this early stage. Perhaps he felt an indefinable desire to do

something good in life." However, in about 1816, Lyte experienced an evangelical conversion.

In 1817 Lyte became a curate in Marazion, Cornwall, and there met and married Anne Maxwell, daughter of a well-known Scottish-Irish family. She was 31, seven years older than her husband and a "keen Methodist." Furthermore, she "could not match her husband's good looks and personal charm." Nevertheless, the marriage was happy and successful. Ann eventually made Lyte's situation more comfortable by contributing her family fortune, and she was an excellent manager of the house and finances. They had two daughters and three sons, one of whom was the chemist and photographer Farnham Maxwell-Lyte.

Lyte was an expert flute player and according to his great-grandson always had his flute with him. Lyte spoke Latin, Greek, and French; enjoyed discussing literature; and was knowledgeable about wild flowers. At Berry Head House, a former military hospital at Berry Head, Lyte built a magnificent library - largely of theology and old English poetry - described in his obituary as "one of the most extensive and valuable in the West of England."

Of his hymns, "Abide With Me" is the best known. According to the traditional story given in the Remains, Lyte wrote it a few hours after conducting the final service at his church, which was probably 5 September 1847. More likely the hymn was actually written in July or

August of that year. Lyte himself created for the hymn what his biographer has disparaged as "a dull tune." When Hymns Ancient and Modern was published in 1861, the editor, William H. Monk—whose three-year-old daughter had just died—composed his own tune, "Eventide," for Lyte's poem.

The hymn became a favourite of George Vand George VI and was sung at the former's funeral. The hymn also inspired Field Marshal Herbert Kitchener and General Charles "Chinese" Gordon, and it was said to have been on the lips of Edith Cavell as she faced a German firing squad. "Abide with Me" has been sung at the FA Cup finals since 1927 when the association secretary substituted the hymn for the playing of "Alexander's Ragtime Band." In Rugby league, the hymn has been sung before the Challenge Cup final since 1929, the first year the match was staged at Wembley Stadium. The hymn is also the Portora Royal School victory song and is sung at its remembrance service.

A hymn which, as Erik Routley put it, "looks death itself in the face" and embodies the human craving for companionship in extremis. It was misremembered from Luke 24:29, where the disciples meet but do not recognise the resurrected Jesus. "Abide with us," they ask him, "for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent." As has often been remarked, the change to the singular pronoun is what gives the hymn its comforting emotional intimacy. Lyte wrote Abide with me to his own tune, but today it is sung to Eventide, composed in 10 minutes by the organist William Monk, during what his widow recalled as "a time of great sorrow. Hand in hand we were silently watching the glory of the setting sun (our daily habit) until the golden hue had faded... Then he took paper and pencilled the tune which has gone all over the world."

Abide with me was hugely popular in the trenches of the First World War, and was sung by Nurse Edith Cavell the night before the Germans shot her for helping British soldiers to escape from occupied Belgium. On Sept 21, 2001 it was unforgettably played at Ground Zero by a Salvation Army band during the commemoration of the September 11 attacks.
