**Lucia Mar:** focused on student retention this year – revamping procedures for programs. Instituted an enrollment period every 8 weeks. Each cohort group is given a teacher who is their main contact. Everyone is focused on pre/post testing, retention, and checking in. Small goals along the way to make sure they progressing in their programs. Also assisting with future goals, have students know they are part of a school community. If they aren't meeting expectations then they counseled/encouraged.

**SLOCUSD-** developing an online system for students has been a very time-consuming experience, enrollment online, orientation/pretest is in person. Will change in spring – most likely, to more in person contact at every stage and every program. 65 enrolled in HSD, 25 graduates. Not offering a jail program due to Covid. ESL is down about 50% but their attendance is positive. Child care group-just presented a new report. Child care is a very large need in this county. We need to develop this workforce. Spanish community needs to be a large part of the training for this program.

**Templeton:** 66 enrolled in HSD, 10 graduates. Looking to outreach to local businesses in the spring to get the word out about our program in the north county. Working on new curriculum for students, piloting new curriculum this year to determine if it is a better fit.

**Cuesta:** Technology workshops are a huge success, targeting ESL students because of drop in enrollment, by advertising. 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester raised enrollment, moved from synchronous to hybrid asynchronous learning and this is working great. Constant reinforcement of learning

and computer skills. Across all student populations they are sending newsletters, enhancing a sense of community

**DOR:** Providing services mostly virtually, if we have people with disabilities who need services please send them to DOR. Referrals are down and would love to help more students. Working to have more warm handoffs between agencies. Need to create a team (workgroup) between WDB, DOR, NCI and SLOCAEC to help students find jobs after they received their education/certificates/diploma.

**WDB:** We are purchasing an online platform to provide job fairs in the county. Will work with Cuesta to imbed this software in programs during the 2021/22 academic year. Eckerd focus is gaining skills so when they people return to work they will be competent. Jobs aren't the focus right now but it will be in the near future. Labor market is changing quickly in this county.

**Literature for Life:** Look to us for help with literacy for students.

They provide a tutor/mentor for students who are having difficulty with English. Would be glad to assist our students with their literacy needs.

LFL has money available to spend on Chromebooks. If you need assistance with this please contact Bernadette at LFL.

c) Credits for Adult High School Diploma:

The discussion has come up for lowering HSD graduation requirements for all of our programs in this county. Proposing a work group to look at this issue to develop a county wide credit requirement.
