Chemical Imbalance

There are no actual tests to determine if a person is suffering from a mental illness and the <u>chemical imbalance theory</u> has once again been debunked as nothing more than a marketing ploy with no basis in science, it is factually known that the drugs prescribed by psychiatry come with a long list of horrific <u>side effects</u> and adverse reactions.
