

(The following are only to be used as a guide and are just estimates.)

Debris Type	Weight in Tons Per Cubic Yard
Slate Shingles	4.5 – 5
Concrete / Asphalt	1.75 – 2.1
Bricks	1.25 – 1.75
Sand	1.5 – 1.6
Stone	1.3 – 1.4
Dirt	1-1.5

Debris Type	Weight in Tons Per Cubic Yard
Asphalt Shingles	1.2 – 1.3
Drywall	.25375
Yard Waste (no dirt)	.235
Wood	.1525
General Household Trash	.0752
Goose Feathers	.0611



*Snow, Ice and Water can add a lot of unwanted weight. We recommend strapping a tarp as cover during weather.





HEAVY DEBRIS:

Sod tear up
Dirt excavation
Concrete demolition
Asphalt removal
Sidewalk replacement

SMALL PROJECTS:

Basement, attic, garage cleanout Bathroom remodel Deck tear down (around 250 square feet) Kitchen upgrade Single layer roof of shingles (1500 square feet)



It is better to use a smaller dumpster for heavy material to avoid going over the legal limit of 15 tons.



MEDIUM-HEAVY DEBRIS:

Large stone
Dirt removal
Sand and clay
Concrete and asphalt
Old mulch

SMALL - MEDIUM CONSSTRUCTION:

One or two room remodels Garage cleanout

LANDSCAPING:

Tree removal
Landscaping path



MEDIUM - LARGE PROJECTS:

Larger construction jobs
Whole residence cleanout
Cleanup from new construction
Renovating multiple rooms
Cleaning out a large basement

Replacing a roof
Old house siding
Home additions
Window replacements



Never overfill the dumpster where debris hangs over the top or sides. Any fines for overfilling is passed onto customer.



LARGE PROJECTS:

New construction
Whole home renovation
Office building cleanout
Large home siding replacement
Commercial roofing

BIG MESSES:

Flooding or fire cleanup

Large parties

Big weddings

Community events

Neighborhood spring cleaning

Hazardous waste – chemicals – paint – oil filters – car batteries – pesticides – flammable liquids – propane tanks – aerosol cans – vehicle oil - antifreeze

Items that CANNOT be put in dumpster.

Tires- computers – electrical appliances – contaminated soil – televisions – microwaves – monitors – all liquids

Medical waste – barrels – railroad ties – asbestos – lead – explosives – fluorescent tubes – radioactive materials - animals
