The entries for the Mini Regional Dressage Challenge included tests from Introductory Level Test B to Training Level Test 1. Notably, for the first time, Barbados had a Mini Dressage Challenge as a member of the Open Freestyle Class team.

In the Regional Dressage Challenge, Roberta Foster and Chichic, riding to a compilation of music from home-grown superstar Rihanna in the FEI Intermediate 1 Freestyle, achieved the high score of the day – 75.24 per cent.

Maia Archer and Daisy topped the Mini Dressage Challenge scores in USEF Training Level Test 1 with 68 per cent. The Regional Dressage Challenge Children's Team of Rylee Pinheiro and Vivaldi, Imogen Hutchinson and Amagold, and Josiah Straughn and Professor had a team score of 191 per cent.

The Adult Team of Foster and Bandit, Paige Tryhane and Corlato, and Adriana Watson and Sargeant Vaughn achieved a score of 202.21 per cent.

The Open Freestyle Team of Foster and Chichic, Gina Hunte and Vivaldi, and Rylee Pinheiro and Vanity returned a team score of 217.20 per cent.

One of the highlights of the weekend was a presentation to the decorated former high jumper Anton Norris, who became the first athlete to win a bronze medal for Barbados at the 1962 Commonwealth Games. The Barbados Equestrian Association was deeply honoured by and appreciative of his presence. (SW)
