After church Sunday 12 rigs pulled out for a few days in Lafayette!


Remember the April rally will be the FIRST weekend in April on the 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th. See you then!

HEMPHILL: PATRICIA HUFFMAN SMITH COLUMBIA SPACE SHUTTLE MUSEUM



The museum tells the story of space exploration from the first mission of the Columbia to its last mission, STS-107. It also reveals the efforts of local citizens during the recovery of Space Shuttle Columbia, STS-107 and its crew. An area is dedicated to each crew member who was lost in the tragedy, including the Texas Forest Service employee and the helicopter pilot who lost their lives during the recovery effort. The families of the crew have contributed personal items belonging to their loved ones to be on permanent display. The museum houses many items and artifacts from NASA and its contractors, the families of

STS-107, as well as from other individuals.

The museum features two simulator interactive devices that emulate activities of the shuttle and orbiter. A planned classroom/digital leaning center will provide an excellent opportunity for the advancement of education for people of all ages.

The Museum also features a terrific documentary film of the efforts and American Spirit of the Hemphill people and other local East Texans in their recovery activities..

Bring your boat if you can..but if you can't or don't have a boat...no problem. Several TGCU members who live at TAHI have boats and will be glad to take guests out.



A Cajun Caravan led by Terry & Alice McFillin

Sunday, March 11th through Wednesday, March 14th, a caravan of TGCU members was treated to the hospitality of Terry and Alice McFillan near their home in Lafayette, Louisiana. The caravan left Texas Airstream Harbor in 3 groups, each with a "wagon-master," and piggy backed our way to Terry and Alice's "museum/shop/playground" property in Lafayette. On arrival, we enjoyed cracklins, crawfish pies and other Cajun appetizers, followed by a chicken and sausage gumbo and king cake. Everyone enjoyed looking at the McFillan's treasures so beautifully organized in the "museum" and Terry proudly showed everyone his collection of vehicles and machinery representing decades of organization and restoration.

On Monday morning, Terry and Alice, with their transportation fleet "People Haulers," drove us to the Jefferson House for a tour of the mansion, and then lunch in the restaurant. The gardens were beautiful and the antiques in the home were breathtaking. Next, we traveled to Avery Island where we toured the world famous Tabasco Museum and did a little shopping at the gift shop, followed up by a riding tour of the gorgeous Jungle Gardens. We made an unscheduled stop at a Rice Factory store where we sampled some coffee, other goodies, and did a little shopping. The exhausted Airstreamers returned to our rigs for dinner on our own (most of us had leftovers from our lunch!), and a good night's sleep.

On Tuesday, we once again boarded Terry and Alice's transportation to the Cathedral of St. John the Evangeline. The docent who gave us the tour of the cathedral was a walking encyclopedia of history about the stained glass windows, the history of the 3 different cathedrals which have sat on that spot and tons of other information. We saw an oak tree which is believed to be over 500 years old and with a branch estimated to weigh 72 tons! After the cathedral, we dined in Lafayette's very own Dwyer's café before driving to the Jean Lafitte Historical National Park. We learned so much about Acadian history and what makes this group of people so very unique and special as we toured the Vermillionville Historical Village. To put the "icing on the cake," we stopped for ice cream at the very last Borden's ice cream shoppe still operating in the United States.

Just to make a perfect caravan even better, Terry and Alice presented each caravan member with an "honorary Cajun" certificate, along with a hat for each man and a Louisiana cookbook for each lady on the trip. **We didn't want it to end!**

On Wednesday morning, we took off in our final ride in the People Haulers—this time to McGee's landing, where we boarded a boat for a 1+ hour tour of the Atchafalaya Basin. Our tour guide was knowledgeable and funny and we all had a great time listening to his stories about growing up in Cajun country. When the boat ride ended, we went to Crawfish Town, USA for a final group lunch before returning to Terry and Alice's property, saying goodbye, and returning to TAHI.

This was my first Airstream caravan, but for everyone else, they said it was one of the best they'd ever been a part of! For me, the bar has been set pretty high—and so far, no one has said they're willing to plan the next one!


