Another crew worked on replacing water faucets while still another re-organized our work and storage buildings.

The ladies worked on weeding around the clubhouse and getting set up for the rally weekend.

The rain had soaked our grounds so much that we were not able to get our heavy equipment in the field to overhaul a couple of water lines that needed some attention.

And believe it or not, the county brought in a load of Oil sand to fill in the potholes just outside our gate..finally a little help from our local county commissioner.

The TAHI clubhouse is being used for all kinds of activities. This month (October) we've had a rally, an Octoberfest celebration, a football tailgate party and movies in our TV lounge. The clubhouse is open for use by our members and guests and is

becoming a gathering place for domino and card games and a few happy hours out of the weather!



During our October membership meeting the members were informed about the progress of the Water Tank rehab. Weather delays (rain, rain) have been long, but progress is being made as sandblasting continues as well as new sealing and painting.

Lawnmowers are gone! after many attempts to patch and repair three rider lawn mowers we've finally scrapped them. One small rider is still available that can be used but it too is in a fragile condition. The board decided last year not to furnish mowers to be used by the members to mow their personal lots. They have become cost prohibitive to replace and were being terribly abused in use. Since that time lot owners have been responsible to mow their lots or hire someone to take care of that chore. If you're unable to take care of your lot, TAHI will have your lot(s) mowed at the going rate and pass that expense to you. Currently that rate is \$25 per lot for mowing, trimming and blowing.
