But I shall overcome..for I am strong.


I have slipped the bonds of Earth and stand watch over the uncharted new frontiers of space from my vantage point on the moon.





December is our annual membership meeting and we hope that everyone will attend. On the agenda will be voting for three members to serve on the board of directors of the park.



repair and re-pave three of our streets, Magnolia, Oak and Pine. The goal is to repave all of our streets as money will allow.

It's been a long year working on our water system water tank. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) required us to install a new device on top of our water tank to control trihalomethane imbalances. Once installed on our new water tank we received from the city of Zavalla, we discovered that the tank had a few leaking spots which required us to have the tank sand blasted, recaulked and painted on the inside. Once completed our water tank should be good for 20 plus years..

Other improvements have been new LED lighting in the clubhouse that will shed new light (pun intented) on a new TV/Movie lounge, Pool table, Ping Pong table and brand new round tables for gatherings.

Outside the clubhouse there has been a lot of landscaping improvements..including new shrubs at the entrance, on the street corners and on many individual lots.Thank you Can Do Club. Speaking of Can Do there was a successful fund raiser in October at "Octoberfest"...

Other events are scheduled for January and March, 2019. Funds raised at these events will be used for additional improvements at our clubhouse. Please support these fun events.
