


...from the President




Winners in Creative Hors d'ourves



WILD APPALACHIAN


Meet Mike & Jacque DeSousa

Mike and Jacque are our October Rally guests. Saturday at 3:00 pm in the clubhouse, following our ice cream social and trailer clinic session, they will present a visual adventure of their 6-month, 13-day Appalachian Trail hike. Yes, Mike hiked the entire 2, 185 miles and Jacque hiked parts of it in every state except Maryland. They are coming to visit us by way of Ottawa and Acadia National Park. Married 25 years and full time Airstream travelers since 2014, exploring the wild is second nature to them. Below is a chronological list of their adventures:

- 2013 6 weeks in Africa-Kenya, Seychelles, Zambia, Swaziland, and South Africa
- 2014 began full time travel in Airstream
- 2015 transatlantic cruise to Europe/90 days/26 countries, backpacking/riding Euro rail
- 2016 began bike trip riding across highest asphalt road in 48 states
- 2017 Canada and Mike's recovery from bike accident while biking across states
- 4 weeks in South America visiting Easter Island, Machu Picchu, Galapagos completed last 9 states of the bike trip across states which was delayed due to accident
- 2019 Oregon and more Canada

When they married, Mike had full custody of his 4 children and Jacque had 3 and they became a family of 9. So far, their marriage has provided them with 9 grandchildren. 
Sunsets from our camp were stunning. Flowers were everywhere and Ruthe made sure they were at our camp too.

The nights were cool and we were lulled to sleep with the sound of the surf and not much else. It was a peaceful summer with many fond memories made.








Debi Rich's Book Treasures

Debi Rich shared a few of the titles from the North Texas Airstream Book Club choices:


The War that Saved My Life
