


The second timeline follows a murder investigation of Chase Andrews, a local celebrity of Barkley Cove, a fictional coastal town of North Carolina.



#### **Big Bend Adventure**

According to Apache legend, after creating the universe, the Great Spirit tossed a large pile of leftover boulders and debris on the Big Bend. The park's name comes from the 100-mile long bend in the Rio Grande River that forms the Texas-Chihuahua-Coahuila border. At over 1,250 square miles, Big Bend is approximately the size of Rhode Island. It's so remote that it remains the least visited of the National Parks in the US. A small group set out from TAHI in February to visit this amazing wild space. We took our time getting there – stopping in Bastrop to enjoy dinner on the

Colorado River and overnight camping on Lake Bastrop; soaking up the sun in Fredericksburg and shopping at Wild Seed Farms and the historic town; and boondocking in Junction high on a bluff overlooking he Llang River

the Llano River.
We spent two

nights at Davis State Park hoping to stargaze at McDonald Observatory, but the dark skies

were too cloudy for viewing. We hiked the Davis Mountain trails and made day trips into Marfa and Alpine. The iconic Texas town of Terlingua was our home base for our four days of Big Bend adventure. We tried to make the most of each day separating our trips into the vast open spaces into four destinations: Ross Maxwell Scenic Highway and Santa Elena Canyon; Boquillas Canyon and Rio Grande Village/Hot Springs; Chisos Basin and Mountains; and the drive from Lajitas to Presidio. Each area has its own edge-of-the-world quality to it. We kept saying, "This is our favorite view... No, this one!" We didn't think anything could top the Santa Elena Canyon hike until we hiked the

Windows Trails at the Chisos Mountains. What could possibly be more aweinspiring than the views of the Rio Grande from the Ross Maxwell Highway - until vou view the Rio Grande from the high way to Presidio. The next view always sur-

passed the previous. The mountains rise out of nowhere, like a geographical mistake on the horizon. There are sandy terrains that shimmer in the desert sun juxtaposed against alpine forests in the mountains. Yucca and agave and cacti repulse and mesmerize at the same time. We saw road roaders, vermilion flycatchers, javalina, coyotes, and probably a peregrine falcon. If you put a premium on solitude, a pristine night sky, and 150 miles of empty trails that always lead to something magnificent, nothing is better than a Big Bend Adventure. We



enjoyed the trip home as well and tried to transverse as much Texas terrain as possible. We returned by way of Del Rio, Uvalde, and San Antonio. What is a trip across Texas without a trip to the Alamo? We

ended the adventure at the Gulf Coast on a brilliantly sunny day in Galveston and feasted on seafood. Two of the caravanners, Chuck and Judy Eastman from Tennessee had never been to Texas before.

Bob and Becky Kalton TGCU members from Minnesota had been to several places in Texas but never Big Bend. Rich and Terry Haworth were returning after a trip 20-years ago. Randy Robinson and Nancy Fitzgerald were back from a trip 3 years ago. Together, we managed to help each other see this wonderous place with a different lens.
