The Last Best Place

and the Virtues That Make It That Way A Short Series by A New Airstream Owner

My wife and I are very new to life in an age limited residential RV community, but we have been looking for one for a long time – even when we didn't know it.

TAHI News



Oh my gosh, it's 2022! RutheAnn and I wish each of you a Happy New Year and hope that it is prosperous and bountiful for everyone. I hope you had a big helping of cabbage and blackeyed peas!

We're Off to a new fiscal year at TAHI... and 2021 was a very good year! ... during our annual Membership meeting on Saturday, December 10th, we elected board members Bill Pearson, Lloyd Burton and yours truly to a term of three years. We also announced Marsha Barnhart as the new Treasurer to TAHI. Mary Waterman has served in that position since 2014. Mary remained as a board member. The new board met following the membership meeting to elect new officers for the coming year. They are: President, Fred

Richardson, Vice-President, Bill Pearson, and

Selena Hodges, Secretary.

Construction has been in full swing at TAHI. A new foundation was poured on December 16th that will be the platform for our new Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP). Plans are underway to move the plant from

Huntington to TAHI in the first weeks of January. Once the plant is placed on the pad work will get underway to get it operational.

Other construction going on in the park includes Jack & Kim Stewart on Pine street, Lee & Jennifer Deland on Elm, Jon and LaVerne Villanti at Elm & Angelina, George & Angie Embry on Magnolia and Allison Steele and Lawrence Baitland on Dogwood. Jack Stewart along with assistance from Roy Moore will be handling permit applications in 2022.

Assessments: Your assessments are due as we entered into our new fiscal year, December 1, 2021. If you have not paid your assessments, this is a reminder that you need to get them to our Treasurer as soon as you can. Assessments not paid by January 31st will begin to accrue penalty. TCEQ: Things are good at the Water Well. We have a new fan blade and motor to place on the Trihalomethane tower, finally. It has taken about 12 weeks to order a new fan blade and it will be installed shortly, probably during a Work Day. We have a new 29 page form to fill out thanks to Senate Bill 3 to let them know that we have a backup power supply to provide water to us and Sun & Fun for up to 48 hours or more should we lose electrical power. I think this was imposed because of state wide power failure like the winter freeze last February and previous electric outages from hurricanes and floods. The sewer plant is also in good shape. I've enlisted the help and professional services of member Allison Steele to begin the permitting process to bring the new WWTP online.



Texas Airstream Harbor is protected by fire from the Zavalla Volunteer Fire Department, but thanks to member Charlie Petrillo, we now have our very own "Fire Truck". Complete with lights, sirens, water hose hookups, fire extinguishers and Dalmatian puppies. Charlie began with a vision of taking an old golf cart and making it new and functional as a "mini fire fighting vehicle". Engine 27 led the Christmas parade of golf carts through our neighborhood and our neighbors at Sun & Fun. Hopefully we never have a fire but we're ready if we do. Thanks Chief Petrillo!

As we venture into 2022 I ask everyones support in making Texas Airstream Harbor a great place to visit and live. We have accomplished much over the past years in exposing TAHI to the Airstream family all across America and Canada. What makes TAHI so memorable?...it's YOU, the people...a recent visitor from Michigan said "gosh everything is so beautiful here ..and people friendly...so many people came by and welcomed us"... that's the message I hope all our visitors and members take with them...Keep the Son in Your Eyes!
