BOISE BOUND CARAVAN 1998

(U210)

General Instructions :

The objectives of this caravan are to have fun (lots of it), see a lot of beautiful places (bunches of them), and to arrive at Boise, Id., June 25 at 1:30 p.m. **HEALTHY, SAFELY & HAPPY !!** You are encourage to travel safely each day and that often is dictated by the conditions (highway and weather). You may choose to travel alone or in small groups as conditions warrant. At social hour the day of arrival at each stop, we will have an open discussion of places to see and things to do in the area, so please be prepared to share your ideas. Carpooling to sightseeing in different areas is encouraged, although we all need some days alone to be with our sweetheart (even at our age).

Generally, each campground we will have full hook-ups, restrooms, pay phones, picnic tables, and etc. Campgrounds that have certain things like laundry facilities, propane, etc., I will mention it in the write-up of the location.

MONDAY, JUNE 8th:

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a word from Caravan Chaplain Jim Pratt

8:15 a.m. - Leave TAHI for Waco (Fort Fisher Park) - 187 miles. Most of us have traveled this route last year to Region 9 Rally.

Take Hwy 69 from Zavalla to Lufkin. Turn left on the loop 287 as you arrive in Lufkin and go to Hwy. 103. Take 103 West (15 miles) to Hwy. 7 West. Stay on Hwy. 7 West to Marlin. (You may take the loop 307 South around Crockett). At Marlin, take Hwy. 6 North to Waco. As you enter Waco, turn left on La Salle (B 77), and go a short distance to University (right) to the feeder of I-35. Turn right on the feeder a few feet to the entrance of **Fort Fisher Park** (next to Texas Ranger Hall of Fame, nice place to visit). As always, keep your CB on #14 and the parkers may be of help.

TUESDAY, JUNE 9th:

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a word from Chaplain Jim Pratt.

8:15 a.m. - As we leave Fort Fisher, we will turn right on the feeder street and loop under I-35. Go through the light and head South on I-35 to exit 330 which is Hwy. 6^{North} West. Stay on Hwy. 6 until you get to Hwy. 84 West. Take Hwy. 84 West to near Abilene where it intersects Hwy. 83, turn left to Tuscola, 3 miles. At Tuscola take FM 613 West to Hwy. 89, then left on 89 to **Abilene State Park**. Abilene SP has a park store.

Nearby Buffalo Gap was written up in Texas Highways magazine as having some interesting history and steak house known throughout.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 10th:

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a word from Chaplain Pratt.

8:15 a.m. - Depart for Clovis, NM, about 256 miles.

Hwy. 89 North toward Abilene. When you get to the edge of Abilene, take Loop 322 West (which is also Hwy. 83/84) to I-20 West. Take I-20 West past Sweetwater about 8 miles to Hwy. 84 North exit. Follow Hwy. 84 to Clovis, N.M. **Campground of Clovis** is almost 4 miles West on Hwy. 60/84.

At CG of Clovis there is laundry fac., store, propane

THURSDAY, JUNE 11th:

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a word from Chaplain Pratt.

8:15 a.m. - Depart for Albuquerque, about 217 miles.

Follow Hwy. 84 West of Clovis to I-40. Take I-40 West through Albuquerque, about 14 miles West of downtown. From I-40 (exit 149) & Central Ave, go 1/2 mi. West on south frontage road and to **American RV Park**. (American RV is a full facility park even including whirl pool)

Cheaper gas near park - (Chico's) Truck Stop good.
Albuquerque is known for many good restaurant. Old Town Plaza is a unique Indian goods and "Southwestern Art" shopping area. Hwy. 66 East across the river will take you to the area. *Supplement. No. 4000 - Good.*

FRIDAY, JUNE 12th:

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a word from Chaplain Jim.

8:15 a.m. - Begin departing for Gallup, NM., only 146 miles.

Take I-40 West toward Gallup, **Red Rock SP** is 10 mi. E of Gallup.

Take exit 31, then North on Hwy. 566 (follow the signs).

Since it is a short drive to Red Rock SP, if there is something you want to do in Albuquerque, you should have a couple of hours. West of Albq. on the way to Gallup is a Pueblo & Mission (said to be the oldest in North America, easy to visit with plenty of parking).

At the park the annual Navajo Pow Wow will be going on and special ceremonial events, i.e. Singing and Dancing (not "rain" I hope). Check the schedule upon arrival.

SUNDAY, JUNE 14th:

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a **short time of devotion.**

As always, attending a local service/mass is encouraged.

I tried to not travel on Sunday or if necessary, a short distance but I was unable to meet that objective.

8:30 a.m. - Depart for Page, Az., (248 mi.).

Go back to I-40 West to Gallup, and take Hwy. 666 North to Hwy. 264 W. Stay on 264 West until you get Hwy. 160 (just before Tuba City). Take Hwy. 160 West for 12 miles to the intersection with Hwy. 89. Go North on 89 to Page, AZ.(70 mi.). From Page, at Hwy 89 & 89L, take 89L East 1 3/4 mi. to Copper Mine Rd., South 1/2 mile to **Lake Powell CG.**

There are lots of things to see and do around Lake Powell. You may want to take a boat ride to see the beautiful lake and formations.

TUESDAY, JUNE 16th: *→ great food - frozen ice cream at Pizzeria in Galdonia, AZ*

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a word from Chaplain Jim.

Depart to Kanab, UT. (88 miles) for after 12 noon arrival. Return through Page and take Hwy. 89 North to Kanab. In Kanab, take Hwy. 89

Alternate South 1-block (by the Pizza Hut) to **Kanab RV Corral**.

Three nights will be spent in Kanab. One day you may want to visit the North rim of the Grand Canyon. The second full day may be to visit Zion NP and make the loop south of Zion seeing other Monuments and Parks.

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a word from Chaplain Pratt.

Depart to Panquitch, UT. (69 miles) for after 12noon arrival.

Take Hwy. 89 North to Panquitch, **Hitch-n-Post CG** is on 89N. in town.

SUNDAY, JUNE 21st:

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a short time of devotion

As always, attending a local service/mass is encouraged.

8:30 a.m. - Depart for Kaysville (232 miles).

Continue north along Hwy. 89 to Gunnison. At Gunnison Hwy. 28 North goes to Nephi and I-15 North which will take us to Kaysville (15 minutes north of Salt Lake City). To get to **Cherry Hill Camping Resort**, take exit 326, then go 2 miles North on Hwy. 89 to Cherry Hill.

Cherry Hill park is a full facility park with miniature golf, swimming, etc.

TUESDAY, 23rd:

Continue on I-15 North to Tremonton. At that point take I-84 North to Twin Falls. Take exit 173, then go take Hwy. 93 North for 1-mile to **KOA Twin Falls/Jerome**.

Two nights are scheduled to see sights such as the Ice Caves, etc.

Wednesday Evening caravan sponsored dinner is planned to have our last hurrah before our arrival at the International Rally.

THURSDAY, 25th:

8:00 a.m. - Final information and a final word from our Chaplain.

9:00 a.m. **Depart to Boise**, (131miles). We will depart with time to stop along the way for lunch.

41st INTERNATIONAL RALLY AT BOISE, IDAHO
DIRECTIONS TO RALLY SITE

ALL TRAFFIC SHOULD ARRIVE IN THE BOISE AREA ON INTERSTATE 84 AND USE EXIT 50 AS FOLLOWS:

FROM THE EAST:

Exit at Exit 50A, stay in right lane as you come around onto Cole Rd. Stay in right lane at traffic signal at Overland Rd., then move over one lane left to go through traffic signal at Frontage road. Continue south on Cole Rd. one mile to Victory Rd. Stay in middle lane at traffic signal at Victory Rd. Continue south 0.6 mile to Site entrance.

EXCEPTIONS:

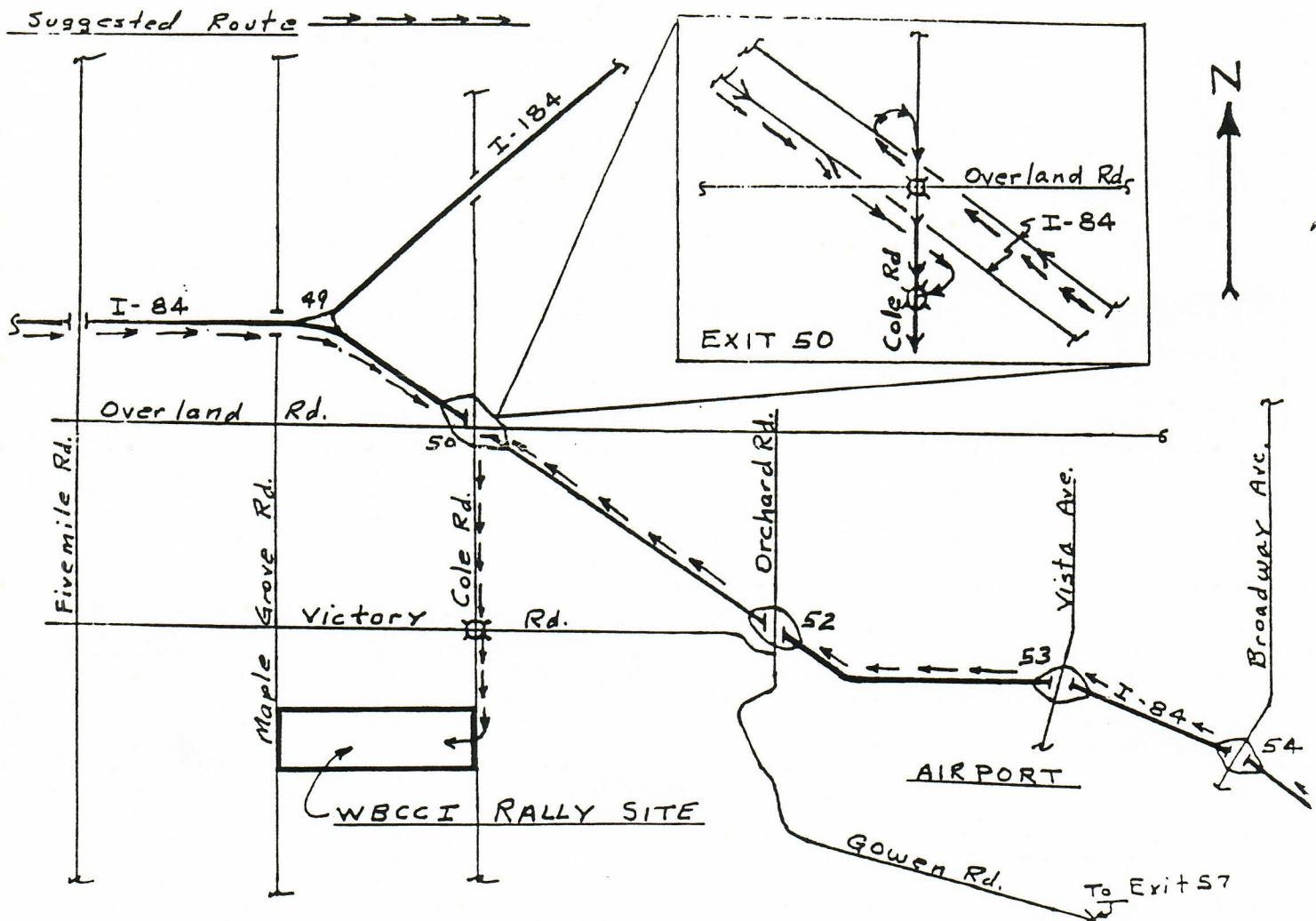
Caravans arriving from the east on June 23, 24 and 25 should exit into the Rest Area at MP 63 on Interstate 84 for a Police Escort to the Rally Site.

FROM THE WEST:

Exit at Exit 50B, this is a two lane exit, stay in the left lane as you come around to the traffic signal at Cole Rd. Turn left on Cole Rd. and continue south one mile to Victory Rd. Continue as above to Site entrance.

NOTE:

Rush hour traffic in Boise is very heavy, therefore it is strongly recommended that all WBCCI traffic plan to arrive after 9:00 AM and before 3:00 PM.



In 1998 I was retired but Judy was still working, therefore, we left the Boise Caravan after the Cherry Hill stop so we could see more of the country rather than just Boise for ten or so days. 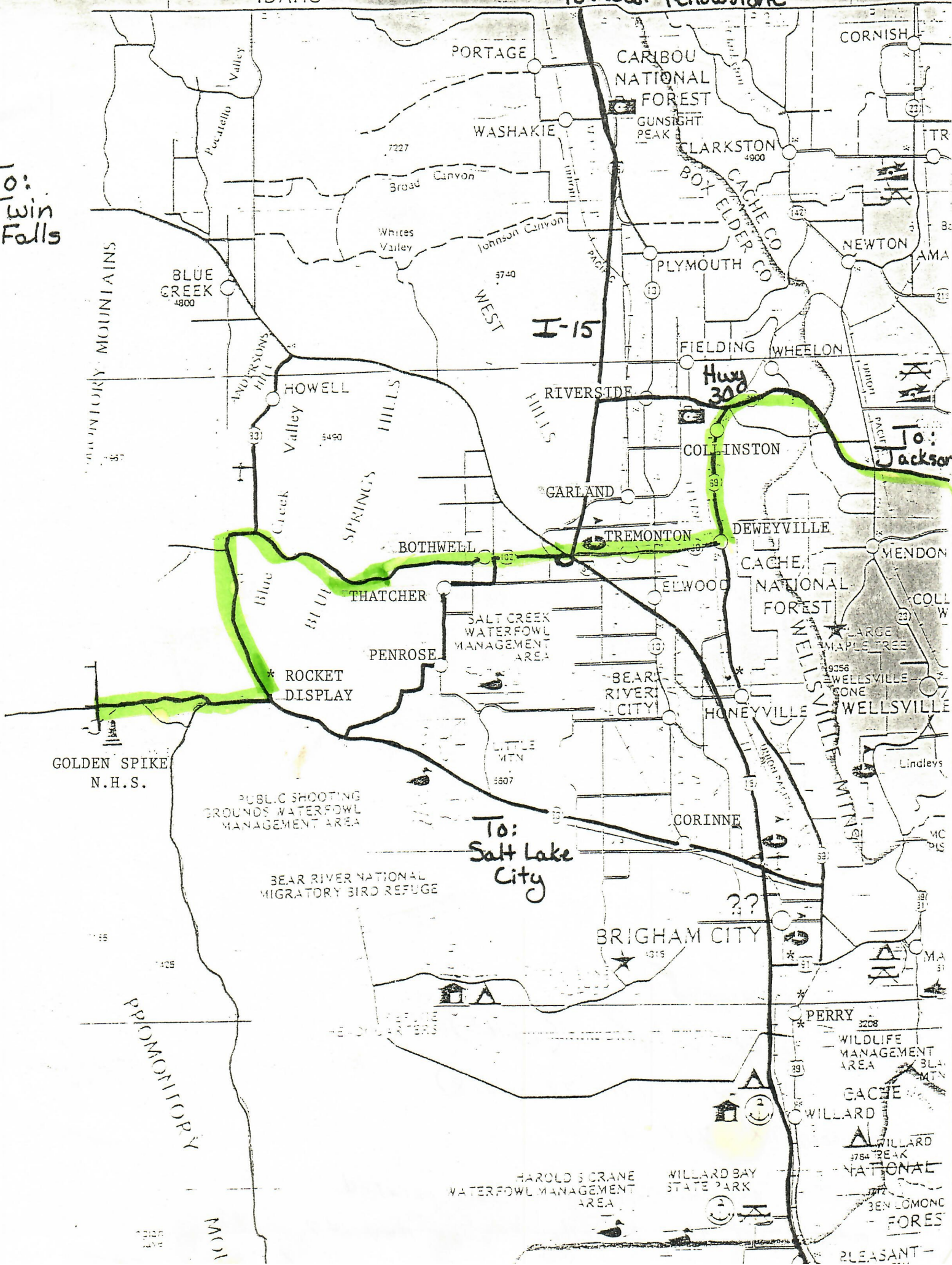
