



Things to see and do on your own

****Admission is paid for the Jasper Tramway, located on (north of Whistlers Campground), 2 1/2 miles west of Rte. 93. You may ride the tram at your convenience on any of the four days.

Athabasca Falls, Sunwapta Falls, Edith Cavell Lake and Angel Glacier, accessed by a side road off Rte. 93A approx. 14 miles. Maligne Canyon is 6 miles NE of Jasper Town Site. Maligne Lake is 22 miles SE of Jasper Town Site on the same road as Maligne Canyon.

Wal-Mart in Hinton - 48 miles.

Tour Directions from Mile Post

Jasper Tramway - located on Whistler's Mountain Road. Your admission is paid.

Mount Edith Cavell Lake and Angel Glacier - Just North of Whistler's Cg. A 9 mi. switch -back road climbs s to a viewpoint under the mountain's north face. The lake is a beautiful shade of powder blue.

Athabasca Falls - Turn right out of campground onto 93A South, approximately 10 miles. The most powerful and breathtaking falls in the Rocky Mountain. The Athabasca River roads follow a narrow gorge.

Sunwapta Falls - After seeing Athabasca Falls, go south on Hwy. 93 to Sunwapta falls. Indian name means "turbulent river". The river plunges in a cloud of spray into a deep canyon.

Maligne Valley - Go onto Hwy 93A to Hwy 93. At Hwy 93 go left (north) to Hwy 16. Turn right onto Hwy 16. At Maligne Canyon road turn right.

Maligne Canyon - This shows the power of water to sculpt rock - the canyon is 165 feet deep.

Medicine Lake - Due to underground drainage system, the water level of the lake varies... sometimes it actually disappears.

Maligne Lake - 2nd largest glacier lake in the world. A 1 ½ hour tour narrated boat cruise to Spirit Island is a available. A chalet / restaurant sits at the end of the raging Maligne River.

Town of Jasper - If you haven't seen enough wildlife, visit the den in the lower level of the Whistler's Motor Hotel, 105 Miette Ave. in downtown Jasper across from the train and bus station. With audio commentary, you'll learn about the 150 displayed animals of the National Park.




Copyright Explained





Things to do: Tour on your own.

In New Hazelton, stop at the Travel Infocenter for maps and brochures.

Leave Infocenter, turn left and go 1.2 miles to the Hagwilget Bridge. This is a majestic suspension bridge which hangs 300 feet over the Bulkley River. Good picture opportunity.

Cross bridge and go 3 miles to "Ksan Indian Village and Museum, consisting of 7 tribal Houses: the Frog House of the Stone Age, the Wolf House or Feast House, the Fireweed House, the studio, the "Ksan Shop and the carving shed and workshop. Guided tours are available. Daily 9-6.

A showplace of Indian culture, Hazelton originally was called Git-an-maks, meaning "where people fish by torchlight". European settlers arriving in 1872 renamed the area Hazelton, after the profusion of hazelnut trees covering the fertile farmland. Considered holy by the Gitksan Indian community, the forest land within a 64.4 kilometer (40 mile) radius of Hazelton has the province's greatest concentration of standing totem poles.

Retrace your route back 1.2 miles past "Ksan and uphill to the Kispiox Road junction. Turn left and drive 7.8 miles via a paved road to the Kispiox Indian Village. There you will see 15 totem poles and a small salmon hatchery.

Continue on to Moricetown Canyon in/near Moricetown, BC. This once was a site of the largest village of the Bulkley Valley Indians., whose diet depended on salmon. Here the wide Bulkley river roars down through a narrow canyon on the Moricetown Indian Reserve. The Carrier Indian gaff hook, harpoon, and net salmon. Then they smoke their catch at the traditional native fishery as they have been doing for thousands of years.



Tracy Arm Fjord.

This narrow fjord twists and turns for over 30 miles, culminating in a spectacular view of the twin tidewater Sawyer Glaciers. Your captain will navigate as close as the ice floe allows, stopping for an extended stay at the face of the glacier. Watch for seals relaxing on the icebergs, bald eagles soaring above the cliffs and many other animals that call this area home. Learn about the natural history of the fjord, its glaciers and the wildlife from our onboard naturalist. Gain insights into Tlingit Native culture. Overcast days will not dampen your enjoyment as clouds and mist only heighten the drama of the fjord and intensify the glacial blue color.

Point of interest:

Bob Bennett, WBCCI Caravan Chairman graduated from Juneau High School and lived in Juneau for a total of 11 years. He recommends a restaurant close to your hotel - the Fiddlehead Restaurant & Bakery located at 429 Willoughby, your hotel is at 435 Willoughby. Bob said he has been there for breakfast - it is good. Bob also has a classmate (Carolyn Reddekopp) who owns "Georges" a place to eat, another one is The Twisted Fish Co. Carolyn will talk to us and answer any questions concerning Juneau when we arrive.

Mountains of Ice - Glacier -

Glaciers - blue-white in color, with long frozen tongues reaching into the water - cover more than 75,000 square miles in the US, and most are found in Alaska.

But how is a Glacier formed? Glaciers are created when more snow falls each winter than melts the following summer. As areas receive snowfall year after year, new snow layers create pressure on existing layers of snow and ice. This creates firn, small granules of compacted snow. Firn from previous years is buried and turns to ice through crystallization. The process continues, increasing the pressure on the ice field until air diminishes and solid crystalline ice is formed.

As the layers of snow, this firn and ice thicken, the lower ice can no longer support the weight of the mass, and it moves downward, smoothing surrounding mountain walls and floors and leaving groves in a U - shaped valley.

Why is glacial ice blue? Its actually not. Glacial ice is so concentrated that it absorbs all colors in the light spectrum except blue, which is reflected back at the viewer - making the ice appear blue. The lack of oxygen in the ice causes it to melt much more slowly than ice created in your freezer. Keep in mind almost 90% of an iceberg is below water.
