

downhill is obvious from the fact that it requires power from the motor to get there. Then. With the motor stopped, gears in neutral, and brakes released, the car moves backward, coasting "up" the hill. Daily 9-dusk. Fee charged.

Directions to the Hopewell Rocks. Go through town on Main Street to Foundry Street. Stay on Foundry St. to Albert St. Right on Albert St., cross bridge to Rte. 114 (Hillsborough Rd.). Follow Hillsborough Rd. Rte. 114 – Watch for signs.

Hopewell Rocks Provincial Park. Charge. In 2003, we used our Golden Age passes from the US for admission. You might try this again. Allow at least 1 hour. The park is a beach on which are tall mushroom shaped sandstone columns (Flower Pot Rocks), eroded by the tides, topped with grass, balsam fir, and black spruce. The column tops become islands during high tide, so plan to be there within two hours of low tide; will be muddy on the tidal flat during low tide period. The view from the stairs leading down to the beach is dry and good.

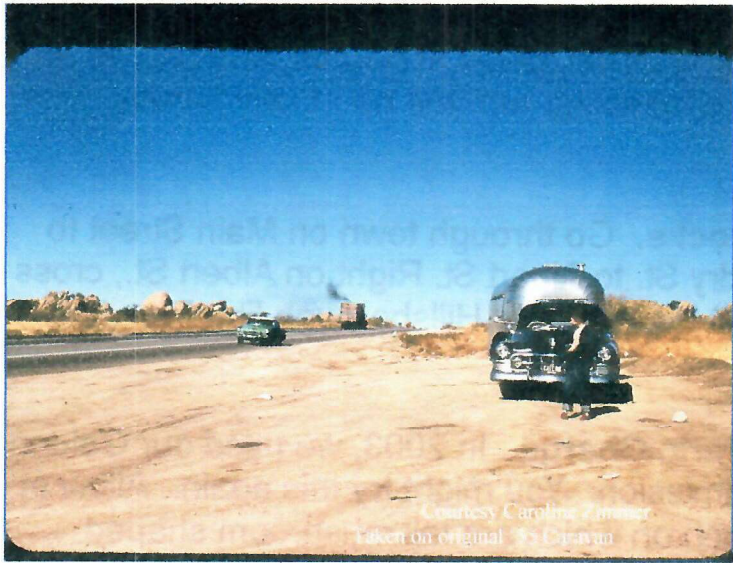
Hopewell Provincial Park Tide Tables are available at local merchants.

Admission to the ROYAL HISTORIC GARDENS will be paid; Use your badge for admission. Located 1 block south of Jct. Hwys. 8 & 1, the gardens comprise four cultivated hectares that include several theme gardens: The Victorian Gardens, Rock Garden, Governor's Garden, Knot Garden, and the Innovative Garden, where new trends in plant materials and gardening techniques are demonstrated. There is also an Acadian section, which provides a glimpse of the lifestyle of the area's early settlers. More than a mile of paths wind among the flowerbeds, fountains, and ponds.

The Tidal Power Generating Station is located near the campground and can be seen from the shores of the tidal pool. There is ample parking and admission to the gift store and museum are free. A modest admission charge is levied for those who want to tour the area where the generators are located.

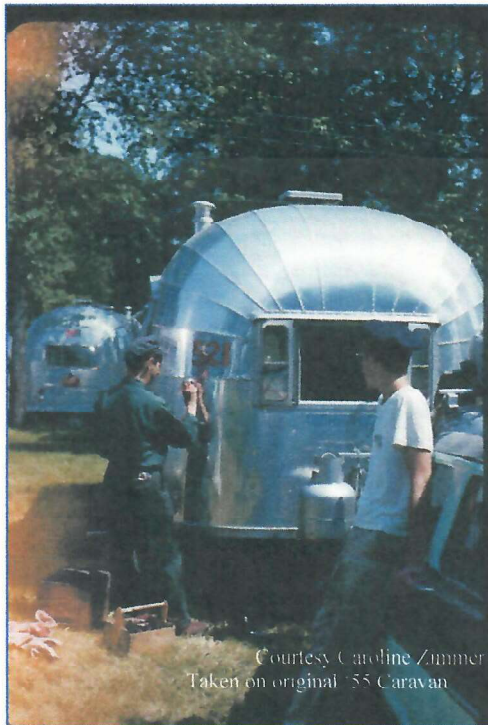

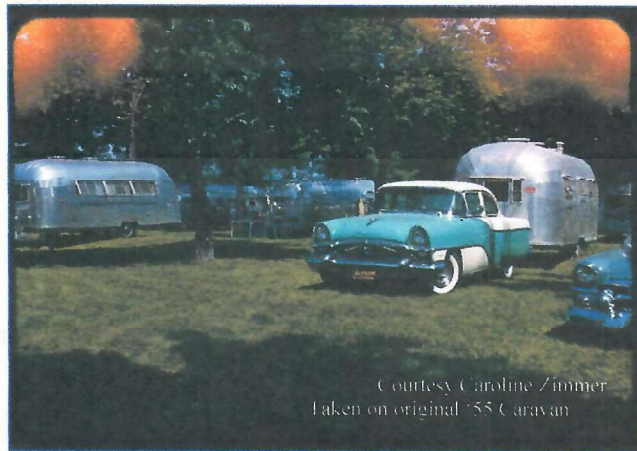

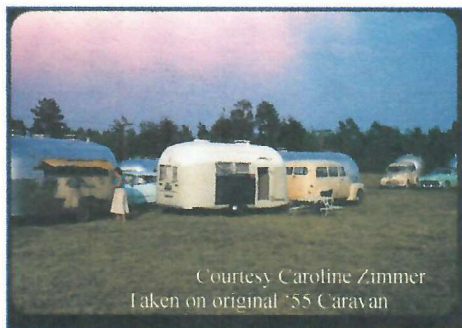
The Irving truck stop has surprisingly good scallops and seafood. Good size portions, and modest prices.



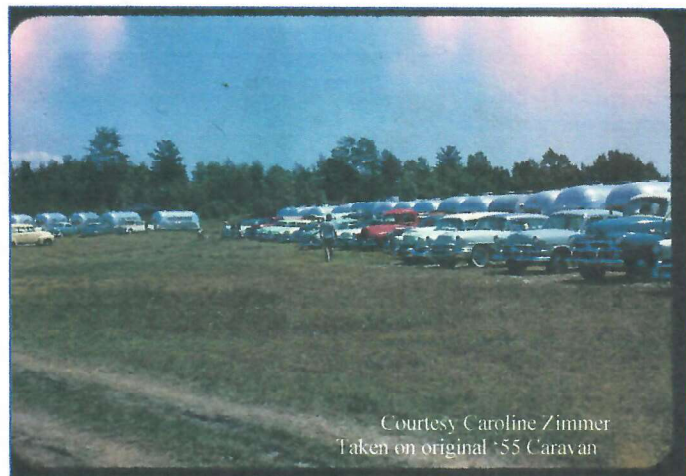

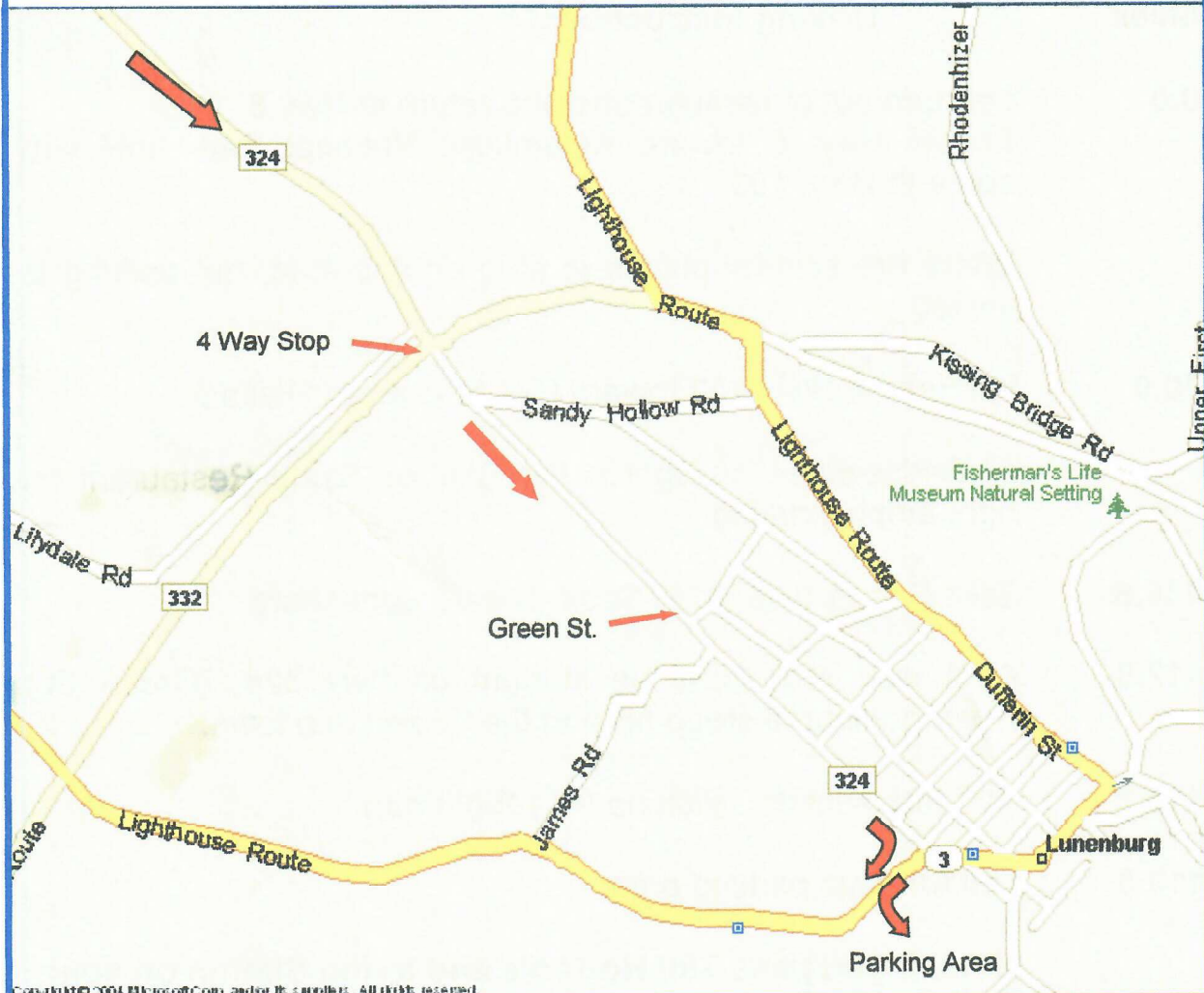

Alternative Routes

After leaving the campground, go south on Hwy 101. Take Exit 28 and continue south on Rte. 1. Continue on Rte 1 through Yarmouth, where you take Rte. 3 and Rte 103 toward Shelborne. Follow Rte. 103 to Exit 11. This route takes you the seaport towns with the following points of interest. St. Bernard Church, Point de l'Eglise, St. Marie Church, Sacred Heart Church, Megaghan River. These are described in your Nova Scotia Book. Exit 31 takes you on a circle drive through more seaport towns and the Barrington Woolen Mill, after which you rejoin Rte. 103 again.

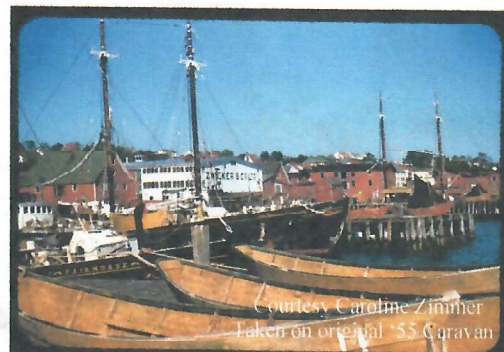
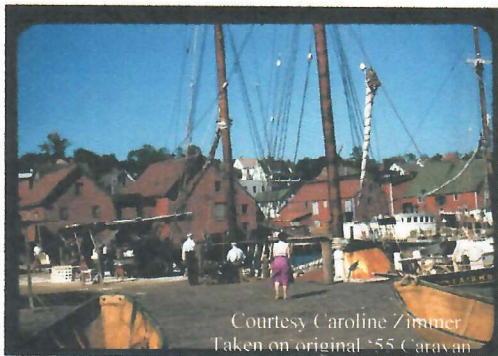

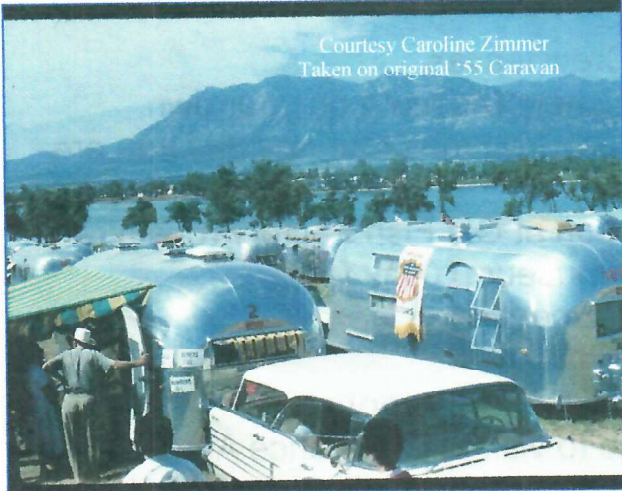
A drive to neighboring towns offers great views of the beautiful scenery.

Visit Mahone Bay and the Ovens National Park. On the waterfront of Mahone Bay are 3 Churches worth visiting.

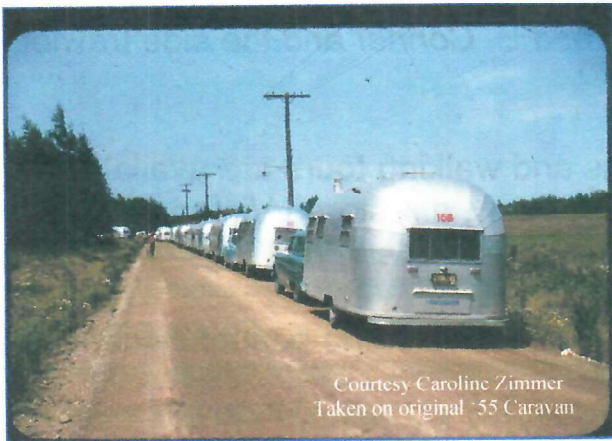




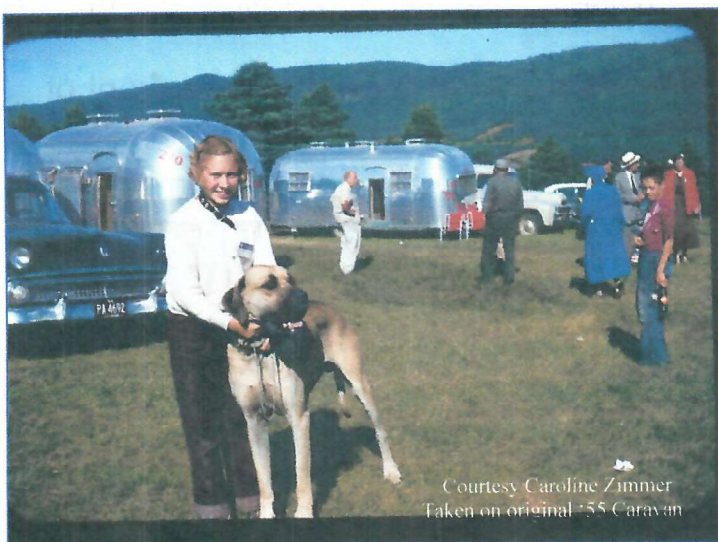

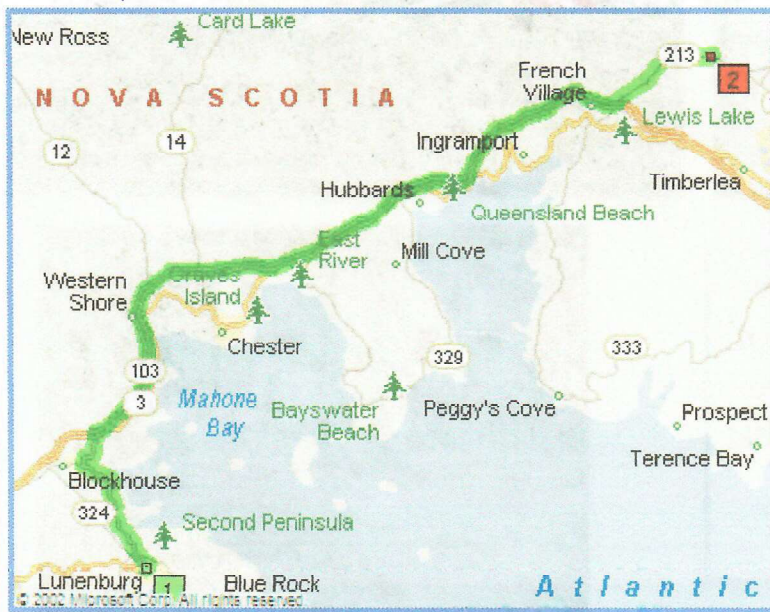

Wilderness RV Park

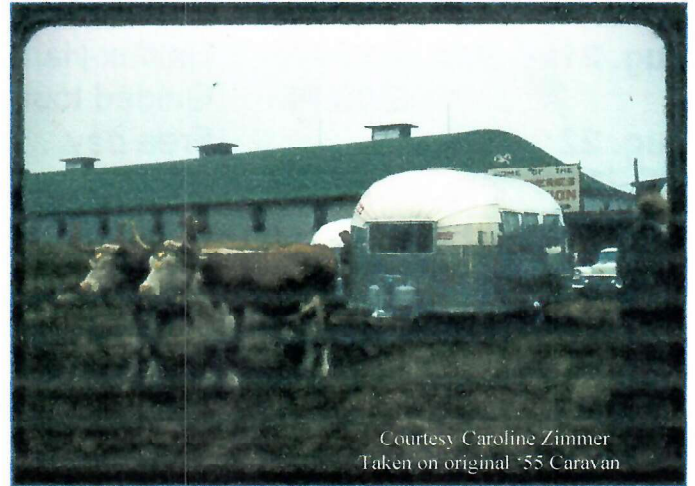
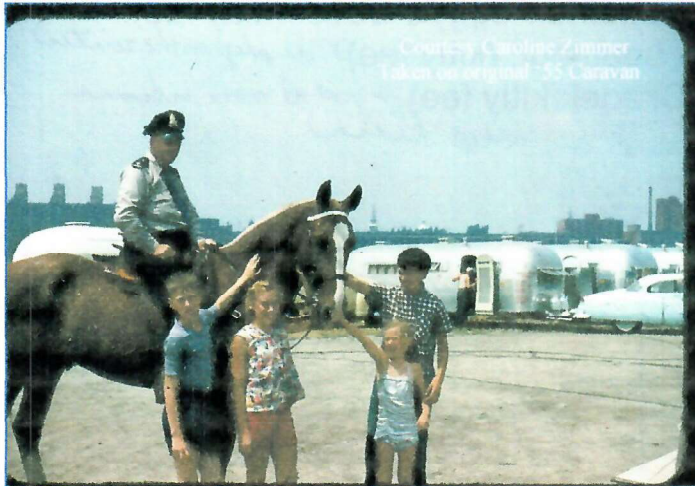
Other Attractions

Peggy's Cove - It used to be a quaint fishing village around the snug harbors of the craggy south coast. The airplane crash there a few years ago has brought out many tourists and bus tours now. The only post office located in a lighthouse is situated there.

The cove is located on Hwy 333 about 25 miles south of Exit 2 on Hwy 103. Follow the signs.

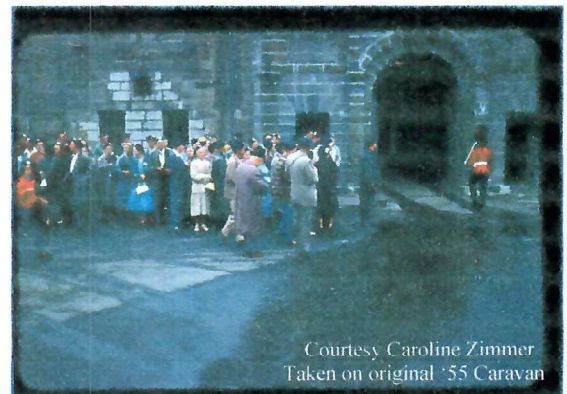

The town of **Antigonish** is a small but growing town, and just walking the streets is interesting. St. Ninian's Cathedral highlights include impressive hand-painted frescoes, high Gothic ceilings, handsome woodwork and two square towers that rise 125 feet.

Sherbrook Village is a restoration of a 1660's lumbering and mining town. They have about 27 buildings, including a blacksmith shop, general store, tearoom, craft workshop, boat building shop, sawmill and ambrotype photography studio. Such traditional handicrafts as weaving and quilting are demonstrated. Food is available.

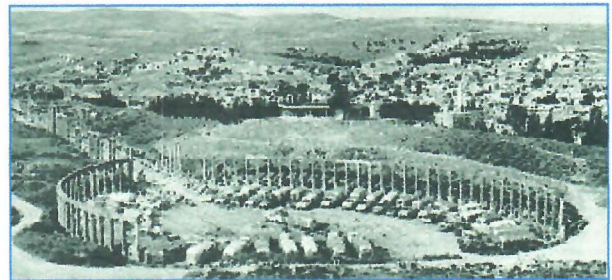
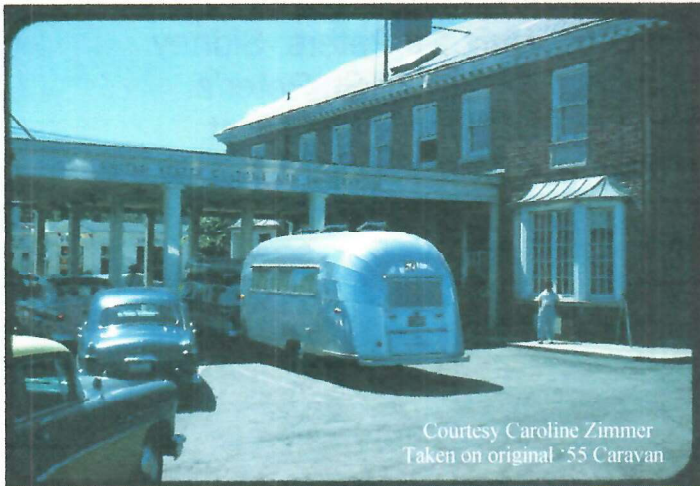
The Miners Museum in Glace Bay is worth the trip. One of the highlights is an underground tour of an actual coalmine. With a retired coal miner as a guide, you will see first hand the mining techniques used in this area.

If you have time, take a trip to Sidney. We came through there on our way here.

If you want to fish for fun, you can go on one of the piers and fish for Mackerel. You can buy the necessary lures in town. They are good on the barbeque. No license is necessary.

In the past we have chartered one of the idle lobster boats and gone fishing for cod. You would have to make your own arrangements. It is hard work using hand lines. Just like the fishermen did a hundred years ago. Don't forget to bring sun block and a pair of heavy gloves to protect your hands from the line.

Also we have in the past bought snow crab from one of the boats. They are very reasonable and have to be steamed by you, but worth the effort. Mary in the office can give you more details

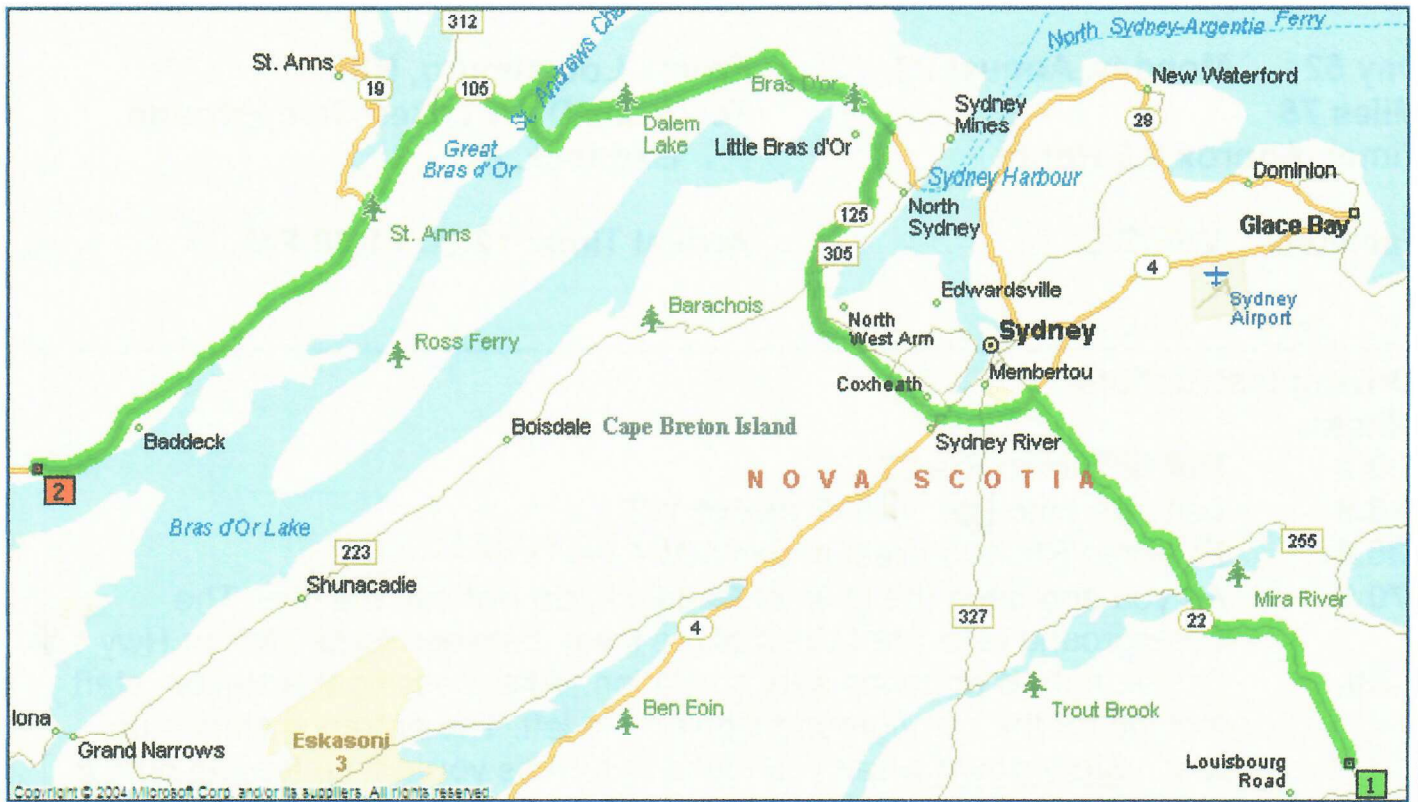

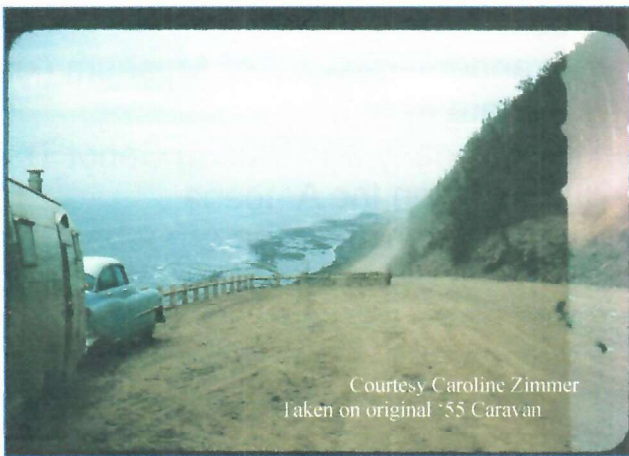
The Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site is at the east end of town on Hwy 205, and contains a museum displaying one of the largest collections of artifacts, photographs, and personal mementos commemorating the life and work of inventor Bell.

The Cabot trail, a road around Northern Cape Breton, begins and ends at the town courthouse, and runs through Ingonish, Cape North, and Cheticamp. Driving the trail counter-clockwise will provide better views of the water. Stop at the Shepherd's Cottage and the Lone Shield, in the National Park.

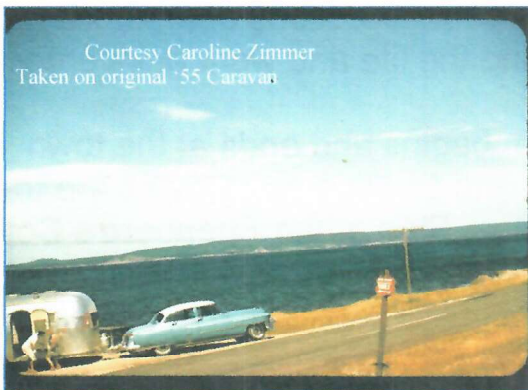
The Nova Scotia Highland Village is the only museum in NS depicting the life style of the Highland Scot. (About a 30km drive in Iona).



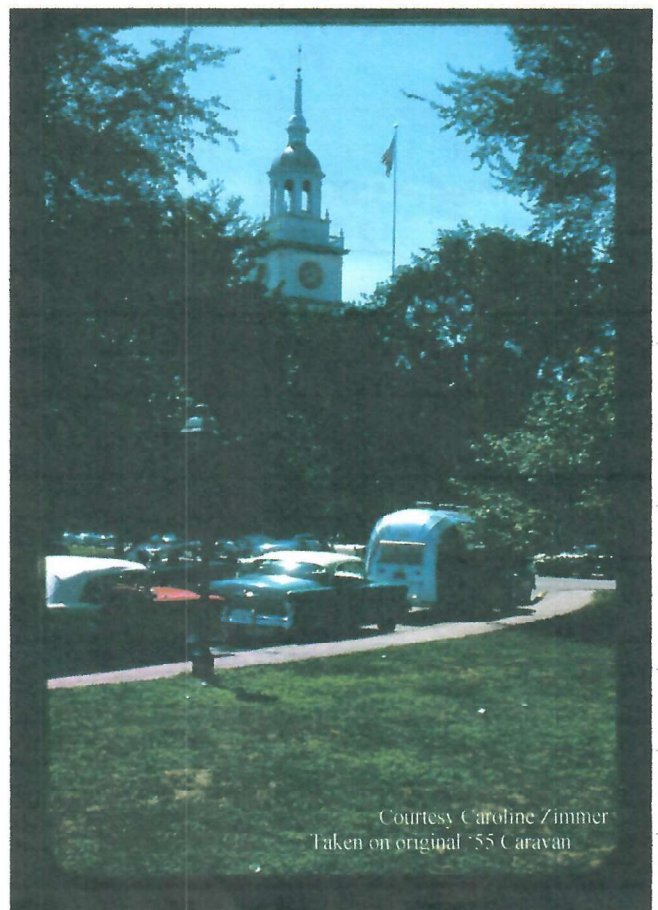
Map from Louisbourg to Baddeck

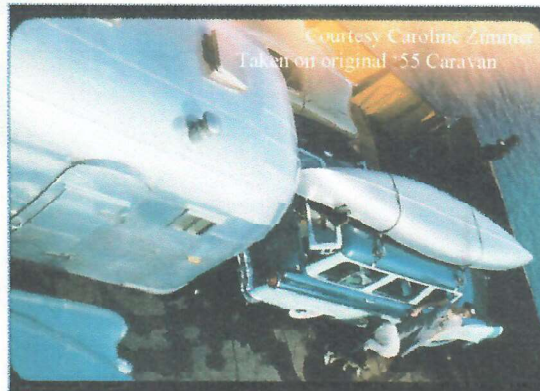
Things to see and do in New Glasgow

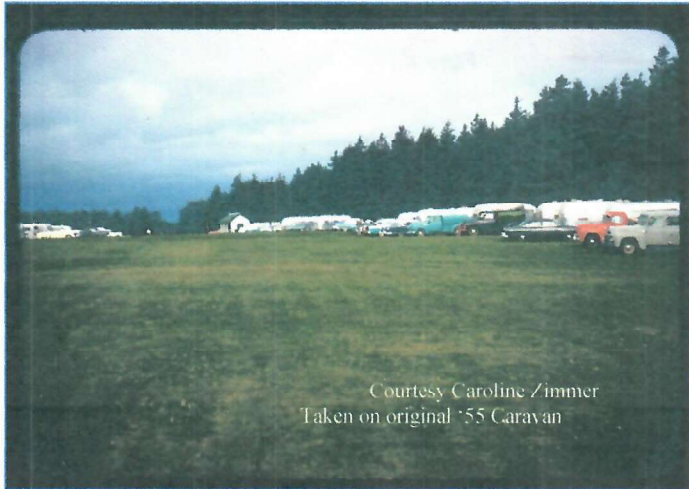
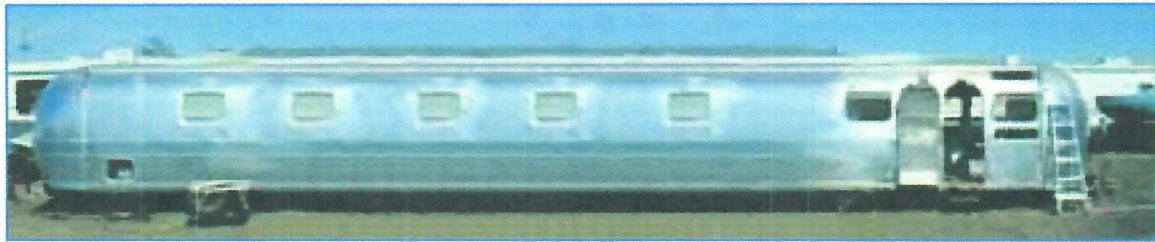
Note: PEI has Blue Laws, and most retail businesses are closed on Sundays.

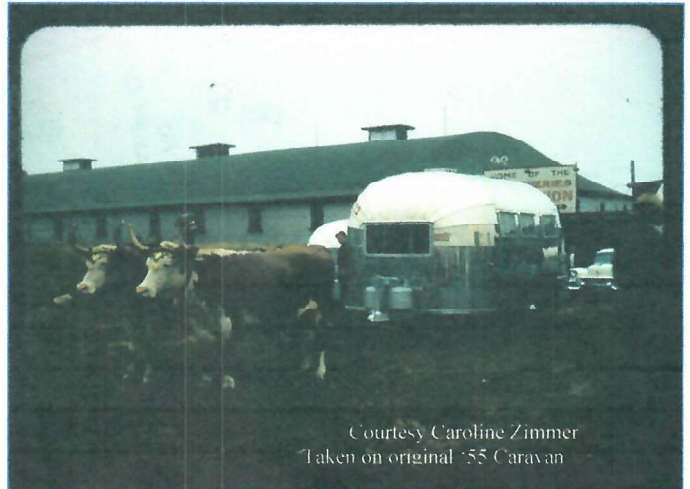

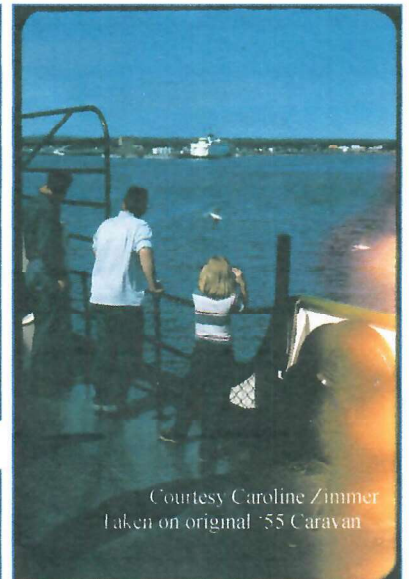

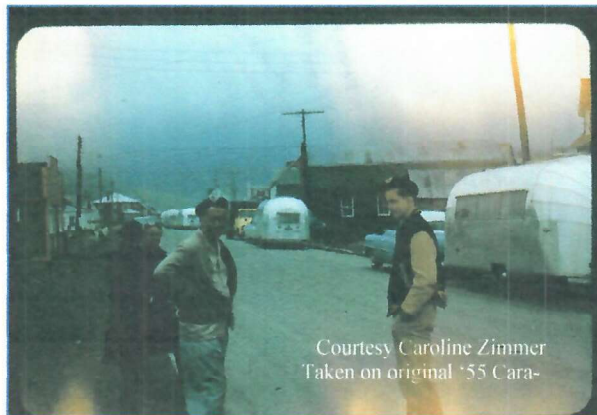

Irving Nature Park lies on the amazing ecosystem of Fundy, a perfect place to experience the highest wildest tides in the world.

Pick up a brochure at a local Tourist Information Centre for a self guided historic tour.

Gagetown is about 60 miles from St. John and provides abundant history of the area.

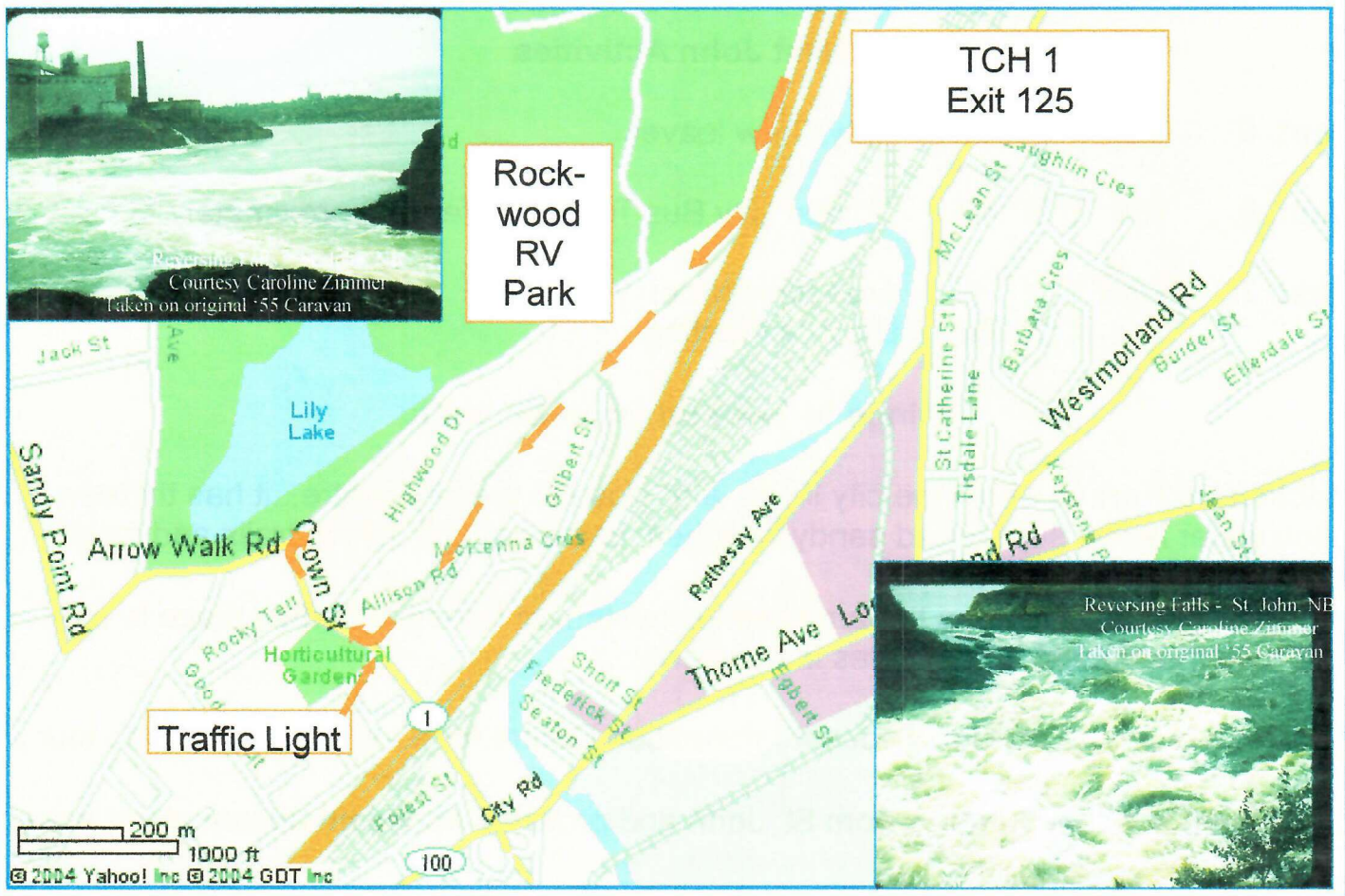

THE REVERSING FALLS are an interesting phenomenon caused by the incoming tide pushing a large volume of water through a restricted area. The Visitor Information Centre, off Exit 7, Route 1, is the best viewing point.

St. John has the highest tides in the world and fascinating wild life. New Brunswick's Bay of Fundy is one of the Marine Wonders of the World.

The city streets are steeped in history – 400 years to be precise – and they are just plain steep. King Street, sloping to the harbour, is the shortest, steepest main street in Canada.

Points of Interest: Aitken Bicentennial Exhibition Centre, Barbour's General Store, Carleton Martello Tower, Cherry Brook Zoo, Exhibition Park Raceway and Fort Howe Lookout. Don't forget to explore the downtown area. There are frequently street fairs during the summer, with free concerts in the park at the top of the hill and on the waterfront. Shop the downtown area indoor markets and malls. St. John has the friendliest people. You will be frequently stopped and asked questions especially when you wear your badges and are marked as a tourist.

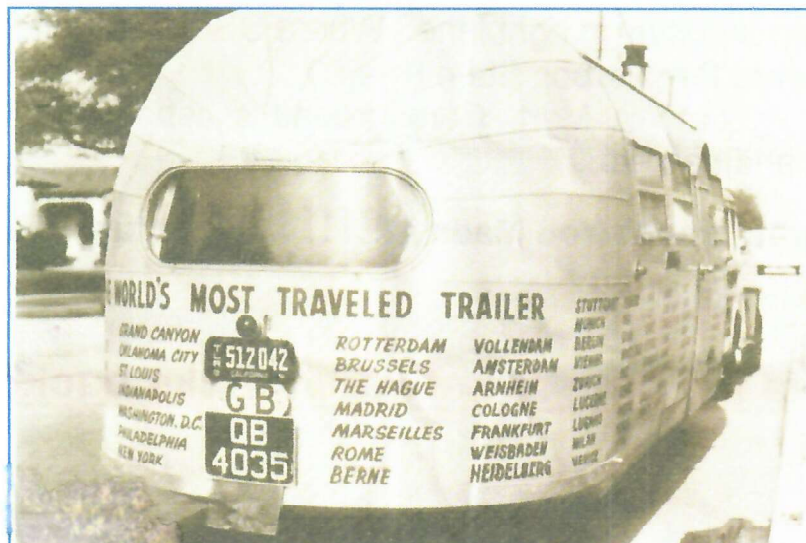

ACADIA NATIONAL PARK, is ours largely through the efforts of two families; George B. Dore and John D. Rockefeller Jr. The Dores and friends contributed 6,000 acres, and Rockefellers contributed 11,000 acres, a house and 57 miles of nearly level carriage trails with 16 distinctive, hand cut stone bridges used for their Sunday afternoon carriage rides. Carriage rides could, and I hope, still be booked at a minimal charge.

Bar Harbor and its beaches are interesting, but the smaller towns on Mount Desert Island are more so. There are dozens of inns and other places to eat, although a hand packed lunch might save some driving at times.

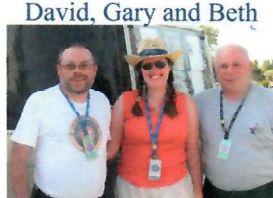
