From Twin Lakes Campground, Chocowinity NC To KOA Wilmington, NC

Turn left out of the campground and proceed to the intersection of US-17 (stoplight) Follow US-17 south for about 30 miles to New Bern

As you cross the first bridge system, move to the left lane or middle lane.

Pay especial attention to the signs while and after crossing the Neuse River Bridge into New Bern. US-70 and US-17 both use this bridge. The marked exits for New Bern are NOT the right way to go.

As you exit the first bridge you may find yourself in an exit-only lane, and you don't want this exit, so move left again. The exit for US-17south is on solid ground, about a mile AFTER you leave the second bridge. It is marked US-17 toward Jacksonville.

At the bottom of the exit ramp, turn LEFT. If you make the correct turn you'll find the highway lined with businesses and malls for a couple of miles. If you find yourself headed west and no mall in sight, you're on the wrong road!

Continue south on US-17 for about 90 miles, passing through the towns of Pollocksville, Maysville, Jacksonville, Holly Springs, and Hampstead.

As you approach Wilmington (actually you're in the suburb town of Ogden at this point) you'll note the Porters Neck Mall on your right. Move into the right lane. The entrance to the Wilmington KOA is on your right about two miles past the Porters

Neck Mall mall. Look for the KOA sign and the parkers.

Total driving for this trip is about 120 miles This trip will take about 3 hours of driving time.

Arrival time at the Wilmington KOA is 3:30-4:30 p.m.

Possible side trips along the way to Wilmington include:

Tryon Palace in New Bern was the seat of colonial government before 1775. Once burned to the ground, it has been fully restored.

There are many good restaurants with parking space near the intersection of US-70 and US-17 in New Bern.

Marine Corps Base Lejeune in Jacksonville is the largest USMC base in the world. Poplar Grove Plantation at Scott's Hill (on US-17 between Ogden and Hampstead) is

a restored antebellum mansion and outbuildings right on the highway.
