The theme for our upcoming May rally is appropriately designated the Armed Forces Day Rally.

Armed Forces Week officially begins on the second Saturday of May and culminates with the celebration of Armed Forces Day on the third Saturday of May. It was established as a single holiday for citizens to come together and thank our military members for their patriotic service in support of our country. The first Armed Forces Day was held on May 20, 1950.

first Armed Forces Day was held on May 20, 1950. This inaugural observance was celebrated with parades, receptions, open houses, and air shows. Approximately 10,000 American troops marched past the President in Washington D.C., while 33,000 people in New York City commemorated the occasion "under an air cover of 250 military planes of all types." Famous World War II warships were in harbors nationwide for the public to see, and precision flying teams filled the skies. Throughout the years, events have taken place in cities across the country to honor those who serve, including parades, military service displays open to the public, educational exhibits to teach children about the armed forces, "Support the Troops" motorcycle rides, and more. The bugle call "Taps" has often been played at these events, including at Texas Airstream Harbor, to show respect for those who died for their country. It is hard to say what will happen nationwide this year. Regrettably, a recent survey indicated that 48 percent of Americans surveyed have trust and confidence in the military, down from 70 percent in 2018. Undoubtedly, that will affect the appreciation shown for those who have honorably served in the American military. But that is not the case at TAHI. The Armed Forces Day Rally is our opportunity to express our deep appreciation to those who have answered the call to serve in America's Armed Forces -especially those among us at Texas Airstream Harbor. We are proud of you, and we thank God for you. Serving your country in the Armed Forces took courage, honor, and commitment. It required sacrifice, and it was always possible that it might require the ultimate sacrifice.

There is something special about those who choose to serve in the

opportunity to express our appreciation. To all our TAHI veterans of

the American Armed Forces and our veteran of the Israeli Armed Forces, thank you for your sacrifice and your service to your country



TGCU Rally Host Duty Reminders

- Coordinate plans together with rally host team; first couple listed is team leader.
- If an appointed team member is unable to participate, it is his responsibility to find a replacement & communicate that change to the host team leader at least two weeks prior to the event.
- Plan activities & meals for Thursday evening through Sunday morning.
- Send rally schedule to Debra, to post in newsletter (by 25th of month prior to rally, i.e. Mar. 25 for April 13-16 rally).
- Shop for food & decorating items needed, keeping receipts (reimbursable any time during the rally); check boxes in store room first for available décor—food & decorating budget for each rally is typically \$300 for 40-50 in attendance. [Saturday breakfast is pre-planned & not included in team responsibilities or expenses.]
- Check supplies on hand in clubhouse before ordering more. Decorate accordingly.
- Make coffee each morning; prepare and serve meals; remember to plan in advance to have propane turned on if oven is to be used.
- Post daily activities on clubhouse whiteboard.
- For each event, make sure kitchen is clean & restrooms supplied.
- Set up tables & chairs for meals, TGCU meeting & Sunday Devotional.
- Ask someone to lead in prayer before each meal.
- Make announcements & remind members of Sunday Service, informing them that our collections always go to the Zavalla Food Pantry.
- Clean up after each meal.
- Take trash to dumpster as needed.
- Turn off lights after each event **OR** arrange for those remaining later to do so.

News & Views...

Work Day crews have been called in the last few days to do some maintenance items at the water plant in the Pressure Pump house and to work on the road situation on Willow street. Rains over the past two years has created a bit of a wash (to say the least) to almost impassable in a spot or two. Materials and equipment is being used to give that street a bit of a face lift and major improvement. Another work project is ongoing weed edging around the old sewer plant and the water plant...and pulling vines from the fence around the water plant.

The Beekeeper managed to box up the queen and the hive of bees and removed them during the night time to avoid any of the bees from leaving the hive box.

The latest update on the proposal to place well number three online will be a board and membership decision that will be addressed in the membership meeting on Saturday, May 13th. Currently our well permits for three wells has been renewed by water conservation service and are good for an additional 5 years.

The travel season is upon us. Several of our TAHI residents are signed up and getting ready to caravan to Wyoming for the International rally to be held in late June. Others are planning trips across other states for vacations and visits. This is a reminder that you hopefully have made plans to have someone care for your yards while "on the road" and have emergency access with someone just in case. Safe travels to everyone. His dad brings him out and he mows, trims and uses a blower to clean the grass cuttings. 
