Because of the "occasion", other than you having to bring your Set-ups and beverage to all meals, Thursday's dinner, Friday coffee and treats for breakfast and of course dinner, Saturday's breakfast, and Saturday's dinner and desserts each night, the rally fee will be \$20 per person. No cooking or bringing any food.

Thursday evening will start with Happy Hour and open **practice** for the "NASCAR" Blindfolded Golf Cart Driver Race (instructed by passenger) obstacle course teams.

**Saturday** morning, if you have a few Pink Flamingo Lawn Art Ornaments, (put your name on the bottom of them) please bring them, because "They Too" will be having a Membership Meeting on the Clubhouse Lawn whilst we will have our TGCU Membership

Meeting, followed by the TAHI Membership Meeting.

The afternoon is packed with a Pampered Chef Party/Hair Magic, Trailer Clinic, Happy Hour and some "Other Activities" that you WILL NOT want to miss. Let's not forget the entertainment!! Break out your best '50s attire and prepare to dance.

I've (we've) been very lucky and have assembled a Fantastic Host Team. We've had several meetings and emails getting this October Rally, celebrating 55 years of TGCU and 50 years of TAHI, in order, for it to be a rally for the history books. Please text or email me, (and I will confirm), if you're attending so we are sure to have proper supplies as well as not to go too far in the RED. FYI, for normal rallies, it takes 17 people to just pay for the Clubhouse for 3 1/2 days. TAHI has always been beyond gracious with the rate they charge, and there is nowhere else to get such a deal. The point is, it's NOT FREE, as some may think.

**November Rally Date change**. Back to normal dates of 10-13<sup>th</sup>. The date was originally changed in hopes of a Panama Canal cruise, but for numerous reasons that didn't work out. We are planning on doing the "Fitz-Rob Turkey Shoot" which is always a good time. So mark your calendars accordingly.

Now for some 2023 International Rally info—it is being held in Rock Springs, Wyoming, June 24-30, 2023. The first day of registration, at this year's Intl, there were almost 500 in person registrations. Haven't heard about on-line registrations yet. I think were up to 5 going from TGCU so far. There are 3,000 Full Hook-up sites. YES. Full Hook-up, 50 amp sites. It's located in the High desert, 6700 feet, so drink lots of water. Rally is in June

and they average around ½" of rain. There is a free 5 Dinosaur display as well as an exhibit with 125 different animals. Fantastic fishing, Green River Floating, but no beer allowed. A 27-hole golf course. Bring your guns, a skeet shooting range close by. Tons of nature stuff. A 24 mile loop tour, sand dunes, Desert Elk, old mines, Pony Express trail. A river that disappears into a cave and comes out 3 miles away, cleaner than it went in. Grand Tetons. You can stay extra days at \$20 a night until the 5<sup>th</sup> of July and have excellent 4<sup>th</sup> of July fireworks viewing.

#### **Fryeburg International Rally update**

The Constitutional Amendments 1 & 2 were voted on and approved at the International Rally in July.

- 99 of the 104 local clubs participated in the vote
- Members-at-Large from the 12 regions voted
- Amendment #1 passed with 77% "yes" vote
- Amendment #2 passed with 71% "yes" vote
- A *whopping* 21.3% of the total membership took the time to vote

### What does it mean moving forward?

No major changes this year but get ready for election in the spring of 2023 where the members will vote for a full slate of Executive Council (EC) members.

The full International Board of Trustees (IBT) will select the International Officers from the slate elected by membership.

A special nominating committee headed by Past INTL. President Mona Heath, with members from our own Region 9 has been formed to look at the nominations process.

I've been a member for 20 years this month, and I'm not usually a huge fan of change, but after speaking with several

International and Region Officers, as well as other Unit Presidents from across the country, I believe that the State of the Club is strong. Membership growth is very strong, with many young folks joining as well.

There are no longer Mid-Winter IBT Meetings, Delegates Meetings at International Rallies, and other traditional and nostalgic experiences. Instead, there are now quarterly Zoom Meetings, allowing for a quicker response to CLUB needs, and getting information out to Region Officers. The quarterly Zoom meetings also allow



information and Motions able to flow back up the chain of command.

My Main Reason for attending the International Rally is no secret. It was to witness and record TGCU's very own Dr. Nancy Fitzgerald being sworn in as Region 9 President. Especially since her sister Ms. Pam Pearson, at the last minute wasn't able to attend, and I had the privilege of knowing their parents, and her father being a two-time past President of TGCU, and it is the first time in our 55 year history, that anyone has climbed the ladder to Region President, it's a BIG Deal. At least it is to me, anyway. And to top it off, the Kaelin's, Lou & Byron, who purchased Ms. Nancy's parents' trailer, were at the rally, so by extension, her parents were also "there."

### **Other International Rally News**

Several new Intra-Clubs have approved to join the ranks of the Vintage Airstream Club, Classic Airstream Club and the Ham Radio Club. The Stella's Sisters, open to all, is primarily for women Airstreamers helping other Women Airstreamers. Boondocker's and Pride Streamers, I believe the names are, and are self-explanatory.

**The Mardi Gras Rally**, that TGCU is Co-Sponsor of, is now a fully recognized National Rally. That's Wonderful News. Bad News – the 2023 Rally sold out in like 24 hours, and the wait list is a good sized one.



### **Region 9 Leaders and WBCCI**

Our Region 9 Leadership team is as strong as ever. We are planning opportunities for fellowship in 2002-23 as well as opportunities for leadership growth. Tracy Elkins serves as First VP, and Keith Ferry continues to serve as secretary. Anna Brandon assumes the treasurer position and Tom Bundy remains our Webmaster and Amy Van Artsdalen is our Membership Chair. Joanne Miller continues as Region 9 Parliamentarian and is also the International Parliamentarian. Immediate Past President Bill Miller is our Nominations Chair and Advisor to our team. Consider submitting your resume to Bill Miller for Region 9 Second VP. As a VP you will participate in IBT meetings, travel throughout our Region to join rallies, and help the team plan for vital Region rallies. WBCCI membership is on the rise and each Region 9 local club is also growing. Headquarters is processing an average of forty-eight new memberships each week across the entire organization. This is an exciting time to be a leader at either the local level or the Regional.

### International Rally in Fryeburg, Maine

Region 9 made its presence known at the International Rally in Fryeburg this past July. Scott Graham, Heart of Texas President, envisioned, organized, and executed a first ever blood drive at an International gathering that almost overwhelmed the area Red Cross which had no idea the level of commitment Airstreamers make when asked to give. Every one of our ten Region 9 local clubs was represented at the delegates meeting. Even though the votes for the changes in Constitutional Amendments did not turn out the way most of our Region voted, we will continue to support WBCCI proactively as we navigate change. Next spring each WBCCI member will vote for Executive Council Members. The entire International Board of Trustees (IBT) will then vote by secret ballot for the Executive Officers (President, VP, Secretary, and Treasurer). The officers so elected will take office at the start of the WBCCI fiscal year. No officer will serve more than two consecutive terms. Mona Heath will chair a reconfigured Nominations Committee which will retool the nominations process. Jennifer Dice from the North Texas Airstream Club was asked to serve on the committee. The committee will make its recommendations at the next IBT meeting in November.

### **IBT Meetings and Motions**

Two motions approved at the IBT meetings: a change in National Rally focus and name; and the creation of Interest Groups for members. Kathi Mitchell, Region 9 member, has "retired" as Chair of National Rallies. Excellent job, Kathi and thank you for helping our

Mardi Gras Galveston Rally achieve National Rally status. Kate Coast assumes the Chair and a name and focus change was approved for National Event Rallies. The scope will broaden to develop an Event Leader Guidebook, standardize event information and processes, provide elevated levels of service to new and existing event sponsors, and initiate "newbie" Rallies. Kate comes with experience as a former Superintendent of National Park services. Region 9 's Philip Vasquez was asked to serve on the committee as well. The other IBT approval was for the formation of Interest Groups. Members may now form a group of like-minded Airstreamers to gather to share special interests. For example, a bird-watching group or fly-fishing group can gather for rallies or social meetups. They can choose to host a social media or online page, and members are not required to elect officers or pay dues. Interest groups are not to be confused with Intra-Clubs which are formalized groups that have charters, treasuries, and dues.

### Save the Date for Region 9 "Come and Stream It" Rally - March 28-April 2, 2023

Our Region 9 Rally will be in Gonzales TX at the JB Wells Expo Center March 28-April 2, 2023. Full hookups with fifty amp will be available. We are planning a Texas/Oklahoma sized event because our goal is one hundred rigs! Online registration will be available this fall with a schedule that promises barbeque, boot scootin', stargazing, and Texas history storytelling. Your registration will include catered dinners, breakfasts, happy hours, and more. The Expo center is a beautiful area complete with local golf course nearby, Guadalupe River access for kayaking and canoeing, bike and hike areas, and an historic downtown filled with turn of the century homes, museums, shopping, and dining. Gonzales is where the ancient rallying cry of "Come and Take It" was reborn with the first shots of the Texas Revolution. The "Come and Take It" flag is a symbol for the Battle of Gonzales that has prevailed through 183 years of Texas History. The flag stood for defiance against Mexican dictatorship and today the flag's meaning remains rooted in Texas pride. Gonzales is near many interesting sites: Shiner Bock Brewery, Chisholm Trail Museum, Painted Churches in Schulenburg, and of course the "Come and Take It" canon. I hope you will "Come and Stream It" in March with Region 9.

### **Looking Ahead**

Getting the most of the club experience always occurs with greater involvement. Are you hosting a rally this year? Are you attending Region Rallies such as Airstreams at the Price, or Mardi Gras Galveston or the Region Rally in Gonzales? Will you caravan to International in Wyoming next June? The clubs in Region 9 offer great opportunities for us to Rally Together.







# Texas Airstream Harbor ...from the Prez...

Welcome back to Texas Airstream Harbor all travelers and members to the Texas Gulf Coast Unit. It has been a long hot summer here..in fact almost the hottest 100 degree weather on record anywhere in Texas.





The heat was a little too much for our 5-ton air conditioner in the front kitchen dining area of the clubhouse. We installed a new unit just before our annual 4th of July celebration of fireworks and just in time to keep our "train" playing members cool during their gatherings this summer. Of course there was a couple of gatherings in the clubhouse, too with members

enjoying a little time together for food fun and fellowship.

A lot of membership lot transfers have taken place this summer. Just in August, Roy and Brenda Moore purchased Linda Williams two lots on Holly street. Bill Pearson and Rick Nelson repaired the water drips at the water plant in reference to our May water inspection for resolves. Thanks guys.. A big "Thank You" to Robert Warner and others too that have been keeping our common area grasses mowed and trimmed. It makes a difference.

TGCU officers and members are planning a lot of activity as the Gulf Coast Unit also celebrates its 55th Anniversary. The rally planning committees have been brainstorming and getting ready with special celebration activities.
