Phoenix Alliance Of African American Athletes Holds Annual Awards Ceremony

The Phoenix Chapter of the National Alliance of African-American Athletes hosted its much-anticipated 2024 Awards Ceremony, shining a spotlight on the remarkable accomplishments of young athletes who have not only excelled in their respective sports but have also exhibited outstanding academic prowess and determination. The event was held in the sanctuary at Valley Gate Church in Tempe.

The Chapter remains steadfast in its mission to empower and support African-American athletes in their pursuit of excellence, both on and off the field. The organization's commitment to nurturing well-rounded individuals who contribute positively to society was evident throughout the ceremony which was held in the sanctuary at Valley Gate Church in Tempe.

The event kicked off with a list of enthusiastic speakers, starting with Tamika and Dr. Duane Wooten, both of whom are running campaigns for office.

Lorenzo Alexander, who played 15 years in the NFL, focused on the

topic of "Perseverance to be Successful." Miss Vail USA Khajal Ramey graced the stage with the message of "working hard will get you to your dreams." The keynote speaker was Kenneth Page. He related some great stories and kept the crowd engaged and energized before the athletes were announced.

Among the standout athletes recognized, basketball guard Devan Fowler from Cortez High School took center stage. With an impressive 3.3 GPA, Devan stood out not only for his athletic prowess but also for his impressive academic achievements.

He finished his high school career as Cortez's all-time leading scorer with 1,634 points. He finished the season making 56 percent of his three-point shots, sinking 74 shots on 132 attempts, along with averaging 23.7 points per game.

Fowler also was selected for the last two years to represent The Phoenix Chapter in Washington, D.C. At the Watkins Award.

As the cheers and applause filled the church, it was evident that these athletes are not just stars on the field, but also role models who inspire future generations. The awards ceremony was a powerful reminder of the incredible potential that lies within young individuals who are determined to make a positive impact on the world.

Class of 2024 Scholar Athletes

Zuri Glenn Corona Del Sol High, track, football, receiver, 3.7 GPA: Competed in Nike Nationals this summer in long jump. His last 2 years had 1,258 yards receiving, and 11 touchdowns.

Noah Giffit Ironwood High basketball, 4.7gpa: Was all-conference, all-region, and all-state 1st team. Led the team to 5A Champs by scoring 27 points.

Mekhi Toms Desert Vista High, track, football, 4.2gpa: Finished the football season with 89 tackles, 2 interceptions, and 1 touchdown. On the track was conference champ in the 110m and 300m hurdles and the 4x100m relay.

Josh Jackson Florence High, track, football, 3.6gpa: Finished the last 2 season with 1,465 yards rushing, and 19 touchdowns.

Aiden Miller Brophy Prep football, defensive back, 3.7 GPA: Ranked #20 in the 2024 class. As a junior had 50 tackles, 1 hurry, 4 pass deflections and 1 interception. Is on several colleges recruit boards.

Rest of Class

Nathan Spivey Jr (class 2025), Salpointe High football, 3.5 GPA: Finished the year with 68 tackles, 2 sacks, 7 interceptions, and caused 2 fumbles. Was 1st team all-state 6A defensive back.

David Daba (class 2025), Iron Ridge High, football, basketball, 4.48 GPA: On the football field he finished the season with 39 tackles, 4 sacks, 22 receptions, 319 yards receiving and 2 touchdowns.

Jeffrey Nwalor (class 2025), Perry High, basketball, track, 4.0 GPA: A leader on the Open Division State Champion basketball team. Select 1st AIA All-Academic Team. Elijah Beamon (class 2025), Castrol High football, safety, receiver, quarterback 4.0 GPA: Finished this season with 9 touchdowns, 563 receiving yards, 2 interceptions, 14 tackles. Was 2nd team all-region.

Isaac Bolden (class 2025), Lake Havasu High swimming, basketball, guard, 3.5 GPA: Was honored by the City of Lake Havasu because of contributions to the city. Has scholarships offers in both sports.

Seth "Buddy" Graham (class 2026), Perry High football, linebacker, 4.0 GPA: Played linebacker, safety, DB, WR and special teams. An all-around good athlete that with great leadership skills. Is on a lot of college recruit boards.

Devin Sarpy (class 2026), Perry High, football, basketball, 4.0 GPA: A good athlete that has proven himself on the football field and basketball court.

Kameron Williams (class 2027), Mesa High, football, track, 3.5 GPA: On the football was selected Offensive Player of the Year.

Jacoby "JC" Franklin (class 2027), Perry High, soccer, football, 3.5 GPA: Has been praised by coaches from both sports for having great work ethic and footwork.

Tate Horton (class 2028), Hampton Cove Elementary School basketball, forward/center, 4.0 GPA: A very skilled 6'1 basketball player with a good 3pt shoot and inside game. His dream is to play at Stanford or Harvard.
