- 2 Counsel, may I have appearances, please.
- 3 MS. MARTINEZ: Ana Martinez on behalf of the United
- 4 States. I am covering for Assistant U.S. Attorney Bertha
- 5 Mitrani.
- 6 THE COURT: Good morning.
- 7 MR. FRIEDMAN: Good morning, Your Honor, Jonathan
- 8 Friedman on behalf of Rogerio Scotton, appearing
- 9 telephonically.
- 10 THE COURT: Good morning. You sound like you are at
- 11 the bottom of a pool. Okay. You are coming up now.
- 12 MR. FRIEDMAN: I am swimming to the surface.
- 13 THE COURT: All right. You filed a motion to continue
- 14 but you did not give me -- you did not give me another date and
- 15 you did not give me an indication that you had a meaningful and
- sober conversation with your client about the waiver of speedy
- 17 trial.
- MR. FRIEDMAN: Your Honor, I apologize for that. I did
- 19 discuss that with my client, and I could supplement it with a
- 20 waiver.
- 21 THE COURT: I appreciate that.
- MR. FRIEDMAN: As far as the time required, I do have
- 23 something that is supposedly starting in June that may be a
- 24 three week to four week trial before Judge Scola. I do need the
- 25 time -- I am thinking another sixty to ninety days before I am

- 1 ready to go.
- THE COURT: How about mid July -- well, let me ask
- 3 you, first, how long do you think it will take to try this

- 7 case.
- 8 MR. FRIEDMAN: Your Honor, I would need a little more
- 9 time than mid July, if you could possibly push it some time in
- 10 August.
- 11 THE COURT: Okay. I will reschedule it sometime in
- 12 August, understanding your client is in custody and that you
- 13 are working on perhaps some bond package to submit to the
- 14 Court.
- 15 MR. FRIEDMAN: I am still working on that, Judge.
- 16 THE COURT: I will look for your supplement. All
- 17 right. This will be continued at the behest of the parties,
- 18 without objection by the Government, to sometime in August.
- 19 MS. MARTINEZ: No objection by the United States. Would
- it would be the August sixth calendar?
- 21 THE COURT: I have to go back and take a look at my
- 22 calendar.
- 23 MR. FRIEDMAN: I would prefer later in August, Your
- Honor, because of the work that I need to do, the investigation
- 25 in this case.

- 1 THE COURT: Ms. Greer.
- 2 COURTROOM DEPUTY: August 27th.
- 3 MS. MARTINEZ: No objection, Your Honor. Ms. Mitrani
- 4 would prefer to start earlier in August, but she is available.
- 5 She has a large trial starting October first, which is
- 6 specially set, but that should give her enough time.
- 7 THE COURT: All right.
- 8 MS. MARTINEZ: Will this case be tried in Miami or Fort
- 9 Lauderdale?
- 10 THE COURT: Well, I hadn't thought about that.
- 11 MR. FRIEDMAN: Your Honor, if possible defense would
- 12 prefer Fort Lauderdale. I know Ms. Mitrani is in Fort
- 13 Lauderdale as well.
- 14 MS. MARTINEZ: On behalf of Ms. Mitrani, I would
- 15 request Fort Lauderdale as well. She's a mom, and a good
- 16 friend of mine, that's why I am asking. By August 27th the
- 17 children will be in school. Of course she will be wherever the
- 18 Court needs her to be.
- 19 THE COURT: That's a fair point. Every time anyone
- 20 asks me about Fort Lauderdale I keep saying I don't know, but
- 21 hopefully Judge Rosenbaum will be there and so I won't have a
- 22 courtroom.
- 23 All right. I will keep that in mind, and I will
- 24 endeavor to see if I can't find a courtroom in Fort Lauderdale
- 25 to try this.
