#### From the Rector

Dear Friends,

One of the greatest joys and privileges of being a priest is getting to know those who are preparing for **Holy Baptism** or a **Christening** (two different words for the same thing!). Within our tradition in the Church of England, most candidates for baptism—but by no means all!—are babies or infants. This means there is a huge responsibility placed on the parents and Godparents of the person being baptised to ensure that they are brought up in the Christian faith. Babies cannot speak for themselves, feed themselves or defend themselves, so they need the love, nurture and protection of their family to ensure their physical wellbeing. The same can be for their spiritual welfare—they need the prayers and guidance of their parents and Godparents to lead them along the right path until they can make their own decisions. They need their family to read the bible to them, to pray with them and for them, and to lead them by example.

The church recognises this responsibility at Holy Baptism by asking serious questions of the parents and Godparents. Three times they are asked to turn away from what is wrong, and three times they are asked to turn towards Jesus, to accept him and follow him. It is a powerful moment which signifies the beginning of new life in Jesus. Our old life of sin has been washed away, and we are born again to live for God.

There are many baptisms planned across the churches in Chew Valley West over the coming months, so please do pray for those who are preparing for this important, life-changing event. Perhaps you are already a Godparent. If so, take time to pray for the person entrusted into your spiritual care, whatever age they may be now! And remember that no one makes this spiritual journey alone, but with the support and love of the church.

After his Resurrection, Jesus instructs his apostles to 'go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit' (Matthew 28: 19–20). Notice what Jesus says. He does not say to his apostles, 'go and make **converts** of all [people]', but to go and make **disciples**. There is an important difference here. A disciple is someone who journeys alongside you; someone who walks **with** you and supports you, not someone who confronts you with religion until you surrender!

One of those apostles, whose Feast Day we celebrate at the very end of November, is Saint Andrew. Apart from what we are told in Scripture we know very little about Andrew's life or

ministry. His name has been associated with Scythia, Thrace and Greece, and it has been said that he suffered martyrdom at Patros in Achaia on a diagonally shaped cross. According to one legend his bones were finally laid to rest at Fife, thus his recognition as Scotland's Patron Saint since 1320.

Holy Scripture gives us three important facts about Andrew: 1. He brought his brother, Peter, to Jesus (Saint John 1: 40-42). 2. In the story of the feeding of the 5,000 (Saint John 6: 8-9) Andrew brought the young boy to Jesus. 3. In Saint John 12: 20-22 we read that Andrew brought the Greeks to Jesus.

What do you notice? On each of these occasions Andrew is introducing someone else *to* Jesus. This is our duty as Christians, to be true disciples of Jesus by bringing others to him. We do this not by standing in front of others, but by walking alongside them; by journeying with them.

If you feel your journey is leading you to consider Holy Baptism, I would be delighted to talk to you at any time.

A retiring collection in support of the work of Christian Aid was held after the service of Harvest Thanksgiving in St Mary & St Peter's, Winford on Sunday 10 October and £105.00 was raised. Thanks to all who contributed so generously to this important cause.

#### **Regil Harvest Thanksgiving and Supper**

The Harvest Supper held in the village hall on Friday 17 September 2021 was a great success, raising £689.40 for church funds. Thanks to all who made the evening so enjoyable, not least the catering team and the indefatigable Mr Morris Stuckey. The Irish sing-a-long with the Rector was particularly enjoyable.

#### **Felton Harvest Supper**

I wish to thank all those who organised and supported St Katharine's Harvest Thanksgiving and Supper on Sunday 3 October 2021. Not only was a wonderful total raised through donations, an auction and a raffle, but we enjoyed a memorable evening of food and fellowship. It was particularly good to welcome clerical friends and colleagues who had been so helpful in taking services during the interregnum: Rev Victor Barley and Rev Ann Ogram. This event (our first since the end of lockdown) was also an opportunity to pay tribute to our Churchwarden, Jan Longden, for all her efforts in keeping St Katharine's open for regular worship whenever possible during this challenging period.

#### 'There is much to do'

Our church faces many challenges about funding, organisation, credibility and appropriate approaches to mission. Where might modern slavery fit in?

Bath and Wells is a leading light within the Church of England in terms of a positive and effective response to the growing evil of modern slavery. On behalf of the Clewer Initiative, which coordinates the Church of England's work in this area, I would like to say a huge thank you to David Maggs, Sian Owen and others. They have helped the diocese lead the way in raising awareness, offering training to establish community resilience, fight back against the phenomenon of county lines (the involvement of children and young people in drug trafficking), and pioneered the development of partnerships that enable the church to play a key role in both care and prevention. Bath Abbey has been doing some ground-breaking work about monuments and the transatlantic slave trade with an approach that will be very helpful to others. Yet, with modern slavery increasing, there is much to do.

Jesus calls us to love God and our neighbour as ourselves. The gospel makes clear that the neighbour is not just the person next door, but is particularly the person everyone easily passes by — while they are suffering without hope. In Matthew 25 Jesus makes it clear that we meet Him in the poor and oppressed — or in Clewer's words, Hidden in Plain Sight.

In the modern rush to grab cheap goods and services, we rarely notice those who may suffer and are criminally controlled in order to provide them. As we rightly reorder our priorities as churches, our ways of working, our mission and service — modern slavery is a key indicator of whether we aim to serve the church as our own safe place, or whether we aim to be out on that road between Jerusalem and Jericho, looking to encounter and rescue and raise up those who are trapped and suffering and generally ignored.

Let us not rest on our laurels, but build upon our work so far, so that others may be brought good news, embraced into our communities, and given confidence to know the love of God through the love of their neighbours.

The International Day of Prayer in association with Release International will be observed on Sunday 21 Nov 2021 during the Parish Communion, 11.00 am at St. Mary & St. Peter's, Winford

Christians have been persecuted since the time of Jesus. Today, more are persecuted than at any time in history and these hard-pressed believers — our brothers and sisters in Christ — tread the same narrow path as centuries of believers before them in choosing to follow their Lord, often at the cost of their own lives or freedom.

The International Day of Prayer seeks to generate a global wave of prayer for our suffering brethren. Release's partners provide prayerful, pastoral and practical help to persecuted Christians in over 25 countries – from North Korea and Afghanistan to India and China, from Syria and Somalia to Nigeria and Malaysia.

Release International was founded over 50 years ago, inspired by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand (who died in 2001). He endured 14 years of imprisonment and brutal torture in communist Romania, after which he became a voice for the voiceless in the West. He is a modern day giant of faith whose courage and testimony, along with many others, is very humbling. They can teach us so much about true Christian discipleship, if we will let them.

All are most welcome to this service of Holy Communion. There will be a retiring collection for Release International.

I will give you two ideas that you can make in advance and just refresh the plant material when necessary. Choose one or both, or just come along a do something of your own choice. **Design A) "Silver Snowflakes"** - A simple design suitable for a table or a sideboard.

You will need

shallow round dish approx. 12" /30cm.

Ivy heads sprayed silver (if possible)

Small pieces of conifer blue/grey (if possible)

Small white flowers e.g. spray carnations, small roses or similar, or you could choose a more traditional colour scheme spraying the ivy heads gold and use red flowers.

I will provide a small wire wreath ring and felt to cover it, also a small plastic dish to fit the centre.

#### Design B) A Wired Leaf Table Arrangement

You will need

a glass bowl ideally "fish bowl" shape or similar.

A selection of Christmas baubles, cones, glass pebbles.

2 taper candles

4 wired leaf shapes, which we can make.

A small dish to fit the top of your bowl.

A selection of short bushy foliage, e.g. pittosporum, hebe, cupressus.

Small headed flowers, e.g. roses, lisianthus, spray chrysanthemums, spray carnations, berries

You will need to bring scissors or secateurs and a cover for your table.

I will have Oasis, plastic dishes, tape, wires etc. for you to purchase at modest cost.

#### Winford Parish Council Meeting - Monday 20 September 2021

Matters arising: It was noted that litter picking equipment could be requested via the Clerk.

**Open Forum:** One member of the public attended to ask for the Parish Council's assistance with securing home to school transport for local pupils attending Backwell School. It was agreed to seek further information on the relevant policy from North Somerset Council (NSC).

Highways and Footpaths: The Clerk agreed to chase various outstanding issues, in particular broken and missing signage that had been reported many months previously. The Clerk would ask the Highways Officer

to inspect the road surface between Lower Strode and Manor Farms. The vegetation had been cut down on the corner of the B3130 opposite Regil Lane, but elder trees had been left. It was agreed to ask a contractor to cut these down too.

It was noted that the potholes on Hen Lane were due for repair very shortly, and that the Highways Officer was investigating stones placed on the verge of Kingdown Road. It was agreed to write to Bristol Water asking them to cut back the hedges at Rocks Lane Reservoir and to repair the fencing.

**Planning Matters:** District Councillor Hugh Gregor agreed to follow up the reasons for delay in determining a planning application that had been in the NSC system since February 2021.

**Felton Common:** The police had issued a fixed penalty notice for a vehicle that had been parked on the Common whilst the owners flew from the airport. An offence could clearly be demonstrated based on the sign at the top of Church Trees carpark stating "No Vehicles" with the Road Traffic Act and Section displayed. It was agreed to ask NSC for similar signs for all the entrances to the Common. It was agreed that the Felton Common Working Party would be asked to consider whether additional signage regarding the byelaws and Public Space Protection Orders was needed. It was also agreed to write to the British Horse Society asking that their members be reminded that, for the safety of all Common users, they must stick to the bridlepaths and must not race or ride at excessive speeds.

**Play Areas**: It was agreed to accept a quote of £1,025.45 to replace the cable on the zipwire. At the same time, Touchwood would be asked to attend to outstanding issues with the rubber surround of the seat chain, rot to the platform and the overly low hang of the seat. A request for an additional goal was considered, but it was agreed that there was insufficient room for this in the play area. A complaint had been received about hedges overhanging neighbouring fences at Vee Lane, and it was agreed to ask a contractor to cut the hedges back again.

The Parish Council's usual contractor would be asked to cut back the hedges on the path leading up to the Winford Crescent play area. It was also agreed that he should reduce the height of the grass in the new wood by Felton Village Hall.

Compost Site: No progress had been made with discussions with NSC to decide the future arrangements for payment of land fill credits. The Parish Council had already incurred significant outgoings when clearing the large backlog of green waste from the site (c200 tonnes), and would not be able to continue with the scheme without reassurances that these and future costs would be met. Councillor Hugh Gregor was asked to intervene with NSC officers to get a meeting arranged as a matter of urgency. With respect to the proposed diversion of the footpath across the site, it was agreed that if necessary a fence would be erected on the boundary between the neighbouring property and the public open space, removing any incentive for the public to walk across the neighbour's lawn. Next steps were NSC would issue the order for decision, and await any comments.

Any other Urgent Business: The mobile library operator had reported that only buses were legally permitted to park on the new layby on Winford High Street. Since this had been included in the planning conditions expressly so that the school bus and mobile bus had somewhere to stop, it was agreed to raise this with the Highways Engineers.


