#### Letter from our Curate, the Rev Fran Smetton

Dear Friends,

The eagerly awaited rain has finally made an appearance, bringing muchneeded relief to our surroundings. The lawn has regained its vibrant green hue, the grass in the fields is beginning to flourish once more, and familiar puddles are forming along the roads. Despite the unmistakably autumnal chill in the air, there is little room for complaint, given how desperately we have needed the rain.

October marks the period when most of our parishes come together to celebrate Harvest. During this time, we gather to express our gratitude for the crops that have been grown and gathered, and to thank God for His enduring goodness. While it may seem unusual to offer thanks at a time when farmers are already resorting to winter fodder for their livestock and our gardens still bear the scars of a dry summer, Harvest serves as a reminder that much in life remains beyond our direct control.

Take this opportunity to acknowledge the gifts that this interconnected community offers, and to give thanks for the role we all play within it.



1. A multi-agency meeting was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept to discuss road safety issues and recent dangerous driving incidents in the parish and Chew Valley. This was hosted by CSPC and was a productive and helpful meeting. Avon &Somerset Police, B&NES and representatives from other Parish Councils in the Chew valley attended. A&SP have been working hard in the background and are committed to resolving the issues and specifically the car and motorbike meets and racing witnessed at Herons Green. A&SP asked for residents to report as many incidents as possible, details below. By reporting, the police can record accurately and implement the necessary resources to tackle the issue. A&SP will continue to plan over the winter with regular meetings with Parish Councils. Discussed various powers A&SP can use to resolve the situation. Police staffing numbers are due to be increased in the Chew Valley. CSPC will consider joining a Chew Valley wide Community Speedwatch. Regarding the chronic speeding in the area and through the villages, the police speed

camera will continue to focus on the Chew Valley. (806 penalty notices have been issued in

the last 3 months).

- 2. There is currently 1 Councillor vacancy on the Parish Council, CSPC would welcome hearing from anyone interested in becoming a Councillor.
- 3. Work to improve the surface of the footpath from Church Lane towards the waterfall has commenced, the footpath is closed for 3 weeks.


