#### From the Rector



After a disappointing summer the weather seems to have taken a turn for the better. The air is milder and the evenings seem longer again after a chilly, misty start to autumn in the Chew Valley. It has been a trying year for our farmers and growers. As we celebrate Harvest Thanksgiving across our parishes this month, we will do so mindful of the challenges faced by those who work the land as we share our gratitude for their perseverance.

This spell of warm, settled autumnal weather might be known as 'St Luke's Summer' in honour of the saint whose festival day falls on October 18<sup>th</sup>. Luke is an important figure in Christianity. You might recognise him as one of the four writers of the gospels (along with Matthew, Mark and John), but he also wrote a second volume in the New Testament which gives us the history of the spread of the early church in the years immediately following the resurrection of Jesus (called The Acts of the Apostles).

We know that Luke was a physician. So, his Feast Day might be an opportunity for us all to thank God for the tireless work of our NHS staff in our local hospitals and in the district. It can also be an opportunity for us to pray for our paramedics, our Air Ambulance Service and for those who care for family members at home.

If you have a Bible at home, why not read some of his Gospel this month. It is the story of the Good News of Jesus told from the perspective of an outsider (Luke was not one of the twelve disciples). Luke's Gospel is a wonderfully human, inquisitive and fresh book told with an eye to human need. He tells the story of Jesus in such a way that challenges us to care for the poor and needy—we have Luke to thanks for the story of the Good Samaritan. Luke was also a champion of the equal role of women in society and understood that healing involves the body, mind and spirit.

So, read it for yourself. Who knows, the healing warmth of Luke the physician and evangelist might lift the autumnal chill this year, even when his Summer gives way to winter.

#### A Light which shines in the darkness

The custodial sentences imposed on many of those involved in the recent riots in communities across our country have highlighted, yet again, the issue of criminal justice and the pressures and strains within the prison system. The seemingly ever-increasing size of the prison population; the appalling conditions within many of our older prisons, especially those in our inner cities; the almost total lack of provision for education and rehabilitation and an apparent unwillingness by those elected to Parliament to consider whether the whole of our justice system needs a radical overhaul, have all resulted in much media comment.

But one part of the prison system which has not been mentioned is the invaluable role played by those who serve as Chaplains. Prison and restorative justice have been a constant thread almost throughout the whole of my life beginning with my first visit while still in my teens to what was then called a Borstal.

Since then, I've had the privilege of working with chaplaincy teams across the whole of the prison estate. I've witnessed at first hand the extraordinary work done by those teams, lay and ordained, of all faiths, working together to witness to God's love in Christ and caring for all those in the prison system, both staff and prisoners. I've often said to those on the outside, if you want to know what true collaborative ministry looks like in practice, look no further than a chaplaincy team. While each member remains true to his or her particular faith, the barriers which often divide people of faith have no part in that shared work of witness and service.

Sadly, all too often, the work of Chaplaincies not just in prison but in all aspects of our human life, in education, hospital, mental health, care homes and many other places, is barely known—that is, until we need their care. But Chaplaincies are the yeast which leaven our society. The light which shines in the darkness. Society, as we long and pray for it to be, would be the poorer without them.

#### Have you tried the Bus yet?

By the time you are reading this, our new Winford Pioneer (P1) bus will have been trundling around our lanes, via Felton, Winford and Dundry into Bristol. I've had some lovely feedback from those who have given it a try. Much of the bus information has been shared on Facebook and WhatsApp, but I know not everyone uses social media. I want to make sure we reach everyone, so you will all get an information leaflet and timetable sent via Royal Mail to your home address. These should be landing on your doorstep early October.

#### Flexibility/Access Needs

Working with our bus company, the Big Lemon, we took the results of our surveys and included as many of your preferred stops as we could. We also tried to fit the timetable to what you had said you needed. The Big Lemon really wants our bus to meet the needs of our community. For this reason, if you have access needs and can't walk to the bus stop and if you live within the main village locations (the pink areas on the map), you can ask the bus company to come and collect you from home. If you need this service, please call the bus company the day before you plan to travel, so they can put it in their schedule. Their telephone number is **0117-2447337**.

#### **Council Budgets**

When I first wanted to become your local ward councillor, more than one person warned me off. They told me I was mad – that there was no money in local government.

I was stubborn. I knew finances would be bad, but the reality is much worse than I expected. After a year in, I now have a better understanding of our budgets, and I know where the money comes from. You might be surprised to hear it, that our council tax and government grant are much lower than that of most other councils in England. I've also seen how from 2010 onwards our income was reduced year after year. This means that, compared to other councils, we have less money to work with, and that every year we have had to do more with less.

You may have read in the national papers that local councils struggle to manage their budget once again. Only this year, things are much worse. We are seeing an increase in the number of vulnerable children and adults needing social care support. These cases are becoming more complex, which means a higher cost of care, and more demands for our services, housing and home to school transport. The cost for adult social care and children's services now makes up more than 60% of our whole budget. As a result of these increases, our budgets show we are short of about £23.5 million pounds. We have a legal responsibility to balance our books, so we can't have a shortfall. Adult social care and children's services are 'statutory', so we have no choice but to provide and pay for it. And this means we need to cut our spending in other areas.

I can't sugar-coat this. In the months ahead, as councillors we will have to take very difficult decisions. In non-essential areas of our work, there will be things we can no longer do. We will work closely with Parish Councils to plan for these changes, and to see if there are things parishes might be able to take on. These discussions have started and there will be more news throughout the autumn.

I'm afraid it's a depressing message, but I do want to leave you with this final thought. Whatever happens, we will always prioritise our services for vulnerable people, and I will continue to represent you and be your voice at North Somerset Council.
