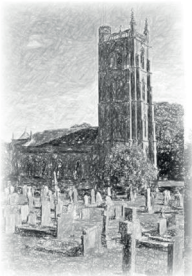

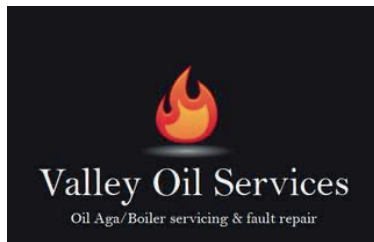

Dear Friends,

I was hooked on the news coverage of the recent NASA Artemis II mission and the images that were beamed back to us from such a distance in space. No matter how hard I try, I can't get my head around the fact that we are seeing our own planet, and that somewhere down there is me! ... and everywhere and everyone I've ever known.

You might remember similar images from the Apollo missions—our beautiful planet looking so peaceful, suspended in complete darkness, lit by the sun. These images reminded me of words from Psalm 8, *"when I consider Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and the stars...what is mankind that You are mindful of them?"*

From such a distance the divisions that so often concern us seem to fade into insignificance. From space there are no borders and we can see no conflicts or differences. All we can see is a shared home which has been beautifully and wonderfully made. Genesis reminds us that, *"God saw all that He had made, and it was very good."* I think that beauty has not been undermined by scientific discovery but deepened by it.

Hopefully the Artemis missions will not only advance human exploration but also renew our sense of humility. To see our planet home from afar is to be reminded how vulnerable and precious it is. It challenges us to be good stewards of this wonderful, sacred creation.



Christians are called to see the world with fresh eyes. Our planet is not merely a place we inhabit; it is a gift we are called to cherish. In so doing we join both science and faith in a sense of wonder and gratitude.

Bishop's Letter - Called to Care

I heard about one of the earliest scientists to get involved in climate change research. When he began, the researcher said, he'd believed that if we could just get the science right, all the challenges could be resolved. The best information would enable humankind to find the right technologies and take the right actions to bring climate change under control. Twenty-five years on, the scientist said, he'd realised he'd got it all wrong. What we need to sort-out, he said, is the human heart. We know what to do to address the climate emergency. Our challenge is that we're all too liable to place the actions we need to take into the 'too difficult' box, or just deny there's a problem altogether.

Yet, whether we like it or not, the climate emergency is a reality that is advancing upon us. It's seen in rising sea levels and increased freak weather. Talk to our brothers and sisters in Zambia and they'll tell you that the climate emergency is upon them now in increased droughts and floods. Last year the National Emergency Briefing on the Climate and Nature Crisis saw leading experts brief an audience of over 1,200 politicians and leaders from business, culture, faith, sport and the media. The Briefing outlined the implications of climate breakdown for health, food systems, national security and the economy. If you've not seen it please can I encourage you to find out where you can watch it.

I invite us all to think too about the next steps we can take to address an issue we'd probably rather ignore. The Church of England has set the bold target of becoming Carbon Net Zero by 2030. Our churches can make a difference in local communities towards achieving this ambitious goal, and I urge you to make whatever difference you can where you are. Such actions are a sign of us turning around – away from denial of what's wrong towards putting things right – and can be signs of the change in heart that all of us need to make.

Parish Council News from Annemieke Waite, District Councillor

Dear All,

I'm writing this two days before our big community event on **Felton Common, knowing how worried we all are about its future**. The Common means so much to so many of us. And while it might feel like a quiet patch of green on our doorstep, it is about becoming part of something much bigger – and I don't mean the airport! Across our region, the West of England Combined Authority is developing a **new Wildlife Index**, designed to track changes in biodiversity and guide where protection and investment are most needed.

As part of building a strong evidence base, the *Wildlife Index* is establishing a yearly count of plants and animals at sites across the region. Twenty new monitoring sites have already been set up, capturing a wide range of habitats. **Felton Common is one of these selected sites**, helping to build a clearer picture of how different landscapes support wildlife. This work depends on local people. By taking part in simple surveys, you can help fill important gaps in existing data and contribute directly to understanding how nature is recovering across the West of England.

Projects supported by organisations such as the Bristol Natural History Consortium are already showing how powerful this approach can be, turning everyday observations into information that helps shape real conservation decisions. Across the region, initiatives like “No Mow May,” new ponds, hedgerows and micro-forests are creating better habitats for birds, bats and pollinators.

This is why Felton Common matters so much. As pressure grows from potential airport expansion, we risk losing a valuable wildlife habitat that contributes to this wider effort. Once lost, these spaces and the wildlife they support are incredibly difficult to replace.

Protecting Felton Common is not just about preserving a view, it is about safeguarding a vital part of our region's nature recovery network.

ANNUAL BAT SURVEY

You can also get involved directly through an exciting local wildlife project. This summer, **the North Somerset Bat Survey**, run by North Somerset Council in partnership with the University of Bath, is inviting residents to take part in a hands-on citizen science project running from May to October. Choose a one-square-kilometre area near your home and borrow an acoustic bat detector for six nights. These devices record bat calls, helping experts identify species and understand how bats use our landscape, including rare and protected species such as the horseshoe bat. All recordings are shared with the Bat Conservation Research Lab, contributing to research that helps guide conservation and planning decisions across North Somerset.

It is simple, fascinating and makes a real difference, and no experience is needed. It also highlights how important places like Felton Common are for wildlife, especially for species that depend on dark, undisturbed habitats.

A Little Bird Told Me...

The Big Birdwatch this year – which counted 9m birds across 80 species – finds the humble house sparrow is still the most frequent garden visitor. The blue tit is a close second, starlings are on the up, with wood pigeons and blackbirds the next most common. But, the greenfinch has faced a 67% decline since 1979, largely due to disease, and is now on the UK Red List.



The RSPB has issued new feeding guidelines to help reduce the spread of disease around bird feeders to ensure garden feeding is a positive force for nature. They ask the public to make some small changes that can have a big impact: to offer small amounts of mealworms, fat balls or suet year-round, but to pause seeds or peanuts during the summer; to clean bird feeders weekly and avoid build-up of contaminated debris underneath; to change water daily and clean water baths weekly.

Some good plants to grow to support birds are *field scabious*, *dog rose* and *lavender*, attracting insects and providing a rich source of food for them.

They will thank you.

Winford Parish Council Meeting – Held on Monday 16th March 2026

Open Forum. Representatives from ‘*Save Felton Common*’ Campaign Group provided an update on their progress to raise the profile of the issues surrounding the Airport’s proposals to erect landing lights on Felton Common. The Parish Council agreed to allow the group to bring a telehandler onto the Common in order to provide a visual representation of the proposed height of the landing lights.

A representative from ‘*Voluntary Action North Somerset*’ provided an overview of a new initiative for Winford: the ‘*Good Neighbour Scheme*’ [see last page]. The Scheme supports people 65+ in rural villages across N. Somerset to maintain a good quality of life, remain independent and stay happy by volunteers undertaking ‘odd jobs’ and small practical tasks in and around their home.

Footpaths & Highways. An application to Bristol Airport Environmental Amenity Fund has been submitted for a contribution towards the costs of road safety improvements outside of Winford Primary School.

Following a request made by the Parish Council to the owner of an overgrown hedge line obstructing a pavement in Winford, the owner had informed the Clerk that they were willing to maintain the hedge, however the dangerous location meant they were not able to do so due to safety issues and insurance. They were not able to access the brambles from their land due to the presence of Victorian railings. They had previously been told by North Somerset Council (NSC) that they were not able to remove the railings. In the first instance, the Clerk would write to NSC to request they cut the said brambles, to allow ease of access along the pavement.

Felton Common. The Parish Council were informed that NSC could potentially serve an enforcement notice on the Parish Council, as owners of the Common, and Felton Common itself, in an attempt to resolve the long-standing issue of unauthorised parking associated with the Airport. This would prohibit the use of the land for parking, other than for the use of the Common.

Following a number of complaints regarding the poor surface of the track from Rock Cottage at the top of Felton Street, to Big Bullock Farm on the edge of the Common, the Clerk would facilitate improvement works to the track on the basis that the owners of these properties finance the improvements.

Following a request from a group of individuals, it was agreed that they could perform a ‘live action role play’ event at the location on 17th October 2026 provided that no damage was caused to the Common during the event.

A water source had been located on the Common and that this was not located on a bridle path. The Parish Council were in the process of obtaining a quote for the installation of a water trough. The Parish Council did not agree to fund the subsequent water rates at this time.

The Felton Common Working Party were meeting again in April, and would invite commoners who were grazing cattle on the Common, with a view to discussing the management plan moving forward.

A vehicle was continuing to drive onto Felton Common to access a neighbouring field without a formal right of access. The Clerk had written to the land owner reminding them that they were not permitted to drive onto the Common without a formal request being received. The Parish Council would continue to monitor the situation.

The owner of abandoned farming machinery on Felton Common had been asked to remove it.

Airport. Representatives from the Airport’s Planning Team had shared their intention to submit their planning application for 15 million passengers to NSC by the end of March 2026 and provided a summary of the highlights of the planning application. This included their intention to erect landing lights on Felton Common, and to offer a number of schemes to mitigate the impact of the expansion plans. The Parish Council were told to expect correspondence regarding the acquisition of the Common imminently.

Compost Site & Allotments. Two signs would be erected on the gates at the Compost Site informing residents of the closure.

Parish Property. Representatives from the Parish Council were meeting with NSC on 17th March 2026 to discuss the possible acquisition of Vee Lane Play Park.

A contractor would be appointed to cut the grass within the Parish.

Any other business. The three Defibrillators within the Parish required an upgrade. The Clerk would obtain quotations for their replacement.

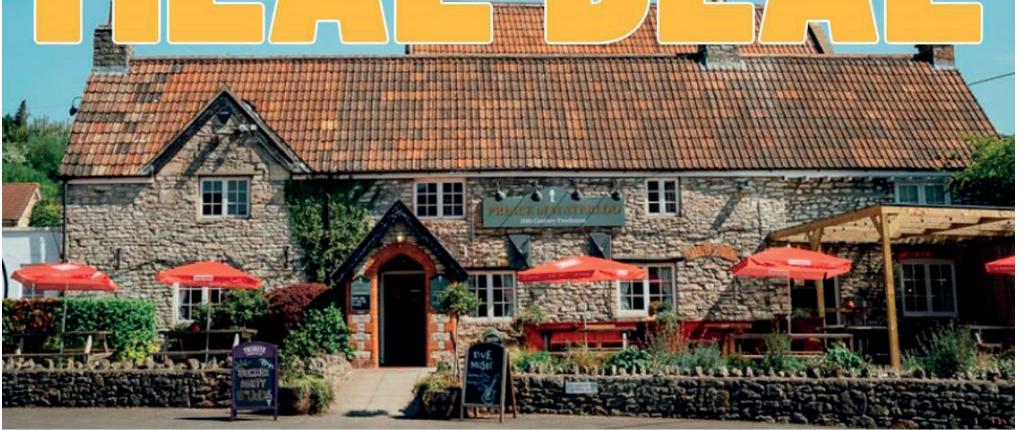
