Letter from our Rector, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

The winter months of early darkness and shortening days will soon be punctuated by many thousands of tiny, blazing lights. Homes, schools, businesses and churches in our villages will be bathed in the glow of countless glistening fairy lights and candles each evening in the run-up to Christmas.

In church, the four weeks preceding Christmas are set aside as a special time for preparation. This season of Advent is really all about darkness, and how darkness was broken by a wonderful light. 'The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light' wrote the prophet Isaiah in the Old Testament, foretelling that our dark world would one day be visited by a great light and would never be the same again.

The season of Advent is important not just because it gives us an opportunity to step aside from the busyness of December. Advent is also important because darkness has a part to play in our spiritual development. A difficult part of being a Christian is being able to admit to ourselves that we cannot expect to see and understand everything clearly. We stumble in the darkness, disorientated and unsettled. We know that there are gloomy shadows in our world and in our lives that artificial light cannot dispel.

Christmas reminds us that God sent a light into this dark world in the most unlikely form of a helpless child. A light which 'shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it' (John 1:5). As we enjoy the festive glow of Christmas lights, let's remember the 'true light' of the world who came to save us from the darkness..

May the peace of the Light of the World, the Christ-child, shine into your homes and your lives this Christmas.



<u>Shop and security</u> – the village shop has been open for 6 months now and is proving very popular with the community. Sadly, the shop was broken into in early October. Very quickly £1150 was raised by Crowdfunding to help the shop tenant purchase security shutters, and CSPC and the Ward Councillor are still looking for further grants to boost this.

The new parcel lockers at the front of the shop are partly positioned here for security reasons. A member of the community shop group is liaising with the shop tenant. <u>Bristol Airport</u> - Bristol Airport's application for 12 million passengers a year (MPPA) has been approved. The airport has a new master plan with growth to 20 MPPA for 2040 and a pre-planning application for growth to 15 MPPA much earlier. The effect on local villages could be significant, CSPC are members of the Parish Councils Airport Association who are monitoring this and meeting regularly.

<u>Bristol Road</u> -The proposals for changes to Bristol Road to make a safer crossing area are progressing in B&NES. Neighbouring residents to be notified by B&NES shortly with a view to undertaking the works in mid-December. The road surface at the Quarry Hay junction is to be buff colour, the pavement corners to be built out (to reduce the width of the road for pedestrians and to slow traffic) and bollards will be positioned along the length of pavement to improve sight lines for pedestrians by preventing pavement parking. <u>Speeding and road safety</u> – a working group has been formed (1 councillor and 6 residents) to assess various aspects of road safety and speeding in the village and approach roads. Work is underway on various projects and the PC will be updated prior to monthly meetings.

Chew Stoke was awarded a Silver Gilt Award in this year's <u>SW Village in Bloom</u> <u>Competition</u>. Chew Stoke Church School also won an award in the 'It's Your Neighbourhood' category. Thank you to everyone who helped over the summer to make this a success. Winter planting is underway, and plans being discussed to enter again next year. <u>Westaway Field and Cooks Meadow</u> – would you like to dedicate a tree in Chew Stoke to remember a loved one, or mark a special occasion? The PC has a few young trees in Cooks Meadow available, please contact the <u>Clerk</u> for more details. <u>https://</u>

www.chewstoke.org.uk/parish-council/westaway-fields-and-cooks-meadow/ CSPC attended the Parish & Town Council Briefing on the Local Plan Reset on the 7th Nov. B&NES have been asked by the new government to increase housing supply from 717pa to 1466pa (104%) over the next 20 years. This new demand could set the Local Plan update back by a year. It is important to remain involved with discussions, to contribute views about the 5-year housing land supply. As much of B&NES is a World heritage Site, there may be pressure for more rural areas to take a higher proportion of the new housing.






