Letter from our Rector, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

After a disappointing summer the weather seems to have taken a turn for the better. The air is milder and the evenings seem longer again after a chilly, misty start to autumn in the Chew Valley. It has been a trying year for our farmers and growers. As we celebrate Harvest Thanksgiving across our parishes this month, we will do so mindful of the challenges faced by those who work the land as we share our gratitude for their perseverance.

This spell of warm, settled autumnal weather might be known as 'St Luke's Summer' in honour of the saint whose festival day falls on October 18. Luke is an important figure in Christianity. You might recognise him as one of the four writers of the gospels (along with Matthew, Mark and John), but he also wrote a second volume in the New Testament which gives us the history of the spread of the early church in the years immediately following the resurrection of Jesus (called The Acts of the Apostles).

We know that Luke was a physician. So, his Feast Day might be an opportunity for us all to thank God for the tireless work of our NHS staff in our local hospitals and in the district. It can also be an opportunity for us to pray for our paramedics, our Air Ambulance Service and for those who care for family members at home.

If you have a Bible at home, why not read some of his Gospel this month. It is the story of the Good News of Jesus told from the perspective of an outsider (Luke was not one of the twelve disciples). Luke's Gospel is a wonderfully human, inquisitive and fresh book told with an eye to human need. He tells the story of Jesus in such a way that challenges us to care for the poor and needy—we have Luke to thanks for the story of the Good Samaritan. Luke was also a champion of the equal role of women in society and understood that healing involves the body, mind and spirit.

So, read it for yourself. Who knows, the healing warmth of Luke the physician and evangelist might lift the autumnal chill this year, even when this Summer gives way to winter.



At the MAJESTIC Aka Chew Stoke Village hall Thursday 31 October

Bristol Rd Crossing - CSPC are awaiting an update & further proposals from B&NES Highways Team regarding options for a crossing that won't require lighting on Bristol Road.

Chew Lane - Traffic Regulation Orders proposing double yellow lines near the school on Chew Lane for a short length to enable passing places, and white lines outside driveways near the Dairy Way junction are open to public consultation. CSPC agreed to the proposals, and to work with the GP Surgery and the Rugby Club initially to see if improved and safe parking can be achieved with white lines nr Dairy Way. If this is not successful to reconsider the need for double yellow lines near the junction, but not the whole length of Chew Lane. CSPC have asked about the use of the grass area at the surgery to create more parking spaces.

Agreed to purchase a new sign to erect on the wall on Bristol Road in memory of Hilary Padfield which has gone missing.

Agreed to respond to the **B&NES Strategic Travel Plan** and to request pavements on Stoke Hill to Woodford Lodge and on Pagans Hill from the junction with Bristol Road and Chew Lane.

Complaints have been received from residents concerning noise and light disturbance at night from The Stoke Inn due to the airport parking business run from there. Anyone affected should report these to B&NES. CSPC has discussed the concerns with The Stoke Inn, and have requested that the bus stop is no longer used for parking minibuses there as it is back in use as a bus stop.

Speeding on Stoke Hill (& rest of the village), agreed to reconsider purchasing an 'autospeedwatch' camera, there are now options available that the police can use data.

Correspondence has been received regarding dangerous driving on scooters along the road at Herriotts Green. Agreed to continue to monitor and advise residents to call the police on 999 if dangerous behaviour is witnessed.

Street furniture – please can you let us know where there are areas in the village that need repairs/painting etc, via email clerk@chewstoke.org.uk

To note that **new bus services** started at the beginning of September, an improved X91 covering more villages (3 times/day commuter route) and a Chew Valley circular route CV Cat 99). Please do try these great services.

<u>Ward Councillors report</u>: B&NES to consider increased housing figure targets. New mandatory housing targets set by the government are to be discussed by B&NES on Sept 12th. A detailed report says the new government target would see a significant uplift in the housing numbers that B&NES needs to plan for, going from the current 717 houses per annum to 1466 per annum.

Ward Councillors Harding and Box met with the new Police and Crime Commissioner, they discussed the Chew Valley and rural issues, they were promised more PCSO's and police presence.


